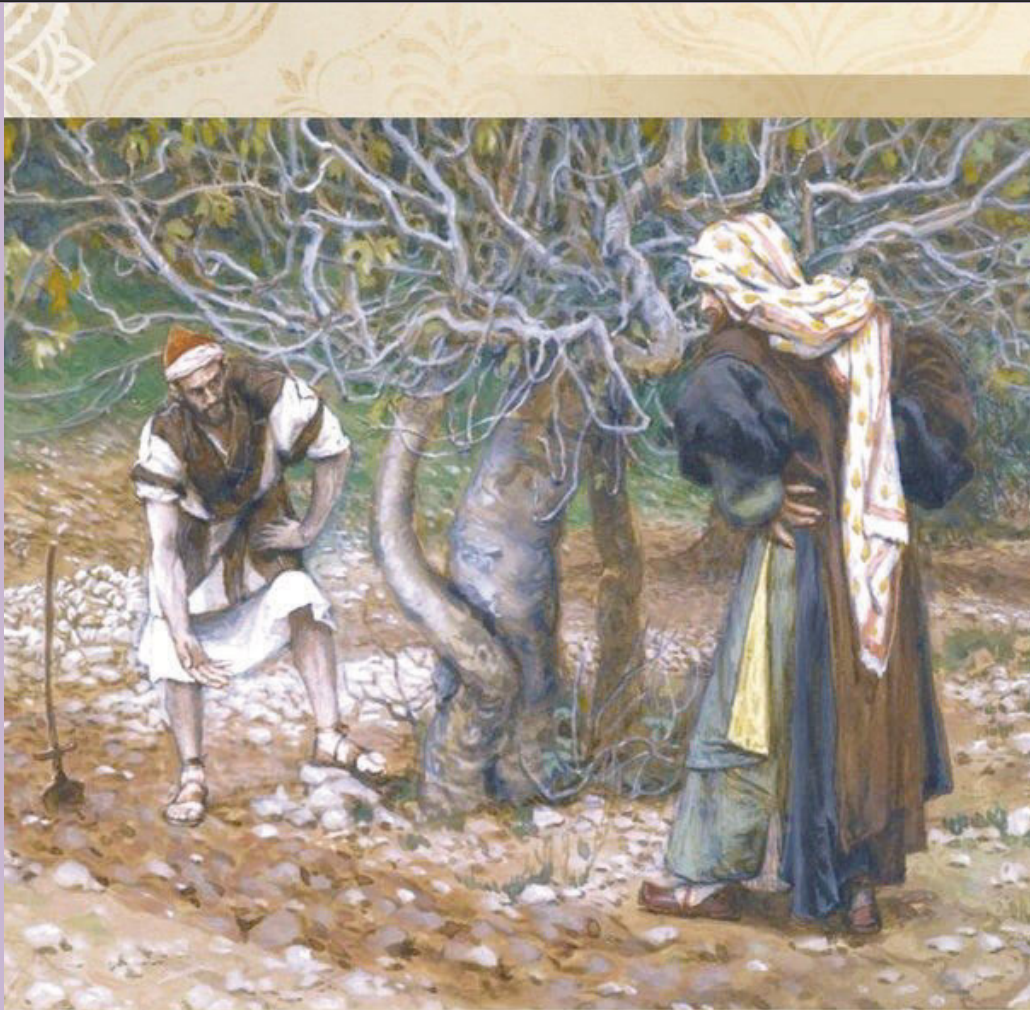

Reflecting on the Service of Love

The “service” of Love – Jesus’ whole life was in service of Love – preaching and teaching the “Good News” of God’s Kingdom come, miracles of abundance and healing from the “well” of faith, present to those deemed disposable or on the margins. During Lent, we turn to prayer to stay connected to the Source, God, who is Love. Fasting to “hunger” and open space for the service of Love. Almsgiving to give, to others, of the Love that has been gifted to us. To offer this extravagant Love takes the special grace of the Holy Spirit. Service in the spirit of love, expresses our desire for God’s Kingdom to be experienced by everyone, especially those who find themselves on the messy margins of total dependence on God. If you are thinking “poor, homeless, struggling”, yes, but think closer to home. We are all on the messy margins of total dependence on God. The service of love we offer will be served back to us. We hear in our lives “...a call to repentance, a call to reconciliation, and a call to affirm the Reign of God here on earth.” (Pax Christi USA/Joseph Fahey) and in this call, our response affirms Jesus present, in and among us. I’m sorry for what I have failed to do, for the ways I have judged others, and I seek to concretely change this in my service of love. And the power of suffering love, in the messiness of our lives, will meet me with open arms and overflow in abundance.

What does “the service of love” look like in my life? Extravagant or meager and measured? What does this say about the importance I place on being served when I need it? I was sitting comfortably considering a volunteer sign-up. I had no excuse to not do it, except my own reluctance. It took much internal dialogue to say “yes”. The gift was in the presence at the volunteer opportunity: welcoming, listening, accompanying, the witness of other volunteers, “serving” food, blankets, presence. I will only respond in the service of love if I first come to the “well” of God’s grace.

Other opportunities will appear different but be just as important and life-changing – “...the measure with which I measure...”. How will I be open, to the call of need, as my opportunity to provide “the service of love”?

One of our parish families reflects on helping at Sunday Lunch:

Our family first started with the Sunday Lunch Ministry about four years ago when our daughter was volunteering for Confirmation. My husband and I think it’s great that we can all help as a whole family together. We can give back and be involved and work as a team for the church and those in need. Growing up in a family where we all helped and cared for our grandparents, we wanted our children to have an opportunity to help others. [To go] to Sunday mass to read the word and then put it into action.

Our oldest son (18) enjoys visiting with the people from our church while preparing the meals.

Our son (16) was hesitant at first but now he feels good coming along to help people in need and do good for others.

Our daughter (13) was able to do the dishes and pack up lunches. Because of covid she feels more grateful for what she has and has an understanding what other people go through and have. [She] sees the people in need.

*CO-CATHEDRAL OF ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST***LAUDATO SI LENT WITH THE IGNATIAN SOLIDARITY NETWORK**

The Laudato Si Action Platform (LSAP) is Pope Francis' guidelines for implementing "Care for Our Common Home." Our Lenten reflections lead us to action on behalf of our common home and all life. LSAP Goal 1 is Response to the Cry of the Earth. We are called to protect our common home for the wellbeing of all, as we equitably address the climate crisis, biodiversity loss, and ecological sustainability. How can our community promote the adoption of renewable energy or better promote energy conservation? Have we considered how we can promote clean waterways by preventing litter and plastics from entering our water systems? Throughout this Lenten season, may we as a community commit ourselves to the journey of hearing the cry of the Earth and to taking action to protect our common home.

LSAP Goal 2 is Respond to the Cry of the Poor. This goal is a call to promote ecological justice, aware that we are called to defend human life from conception to death, and all forms of life on Earth. When we consider this goal, we must ponder who are the people most vulnerable to the impacts of pollution and climate change? We also consider the plants, animals, and ecosystems that are threatened by these issues. How can we create a world where life can flourish abundantly? As we reflect on where we live, what communities and people are most directly affected by pollution and climate change? How do we feel called to defend human life from conception to death and all forms of life on Earth? During this Lenten season, may we as a community grow in solidarity, committing ourselves to truly hearing and understanding the stories of the most vulnerable in our world, especially those most impacted by environmental injustice.

The presentation will give an overview of how trafficking victims are recruited and groomed, some common trafficking indicators, how coercion maintains the bonds of trafficking, and how a survivor-centered, trauma-informed approach can break these bonds.
