

"Prayer is powerful beyond limits when we turn to the Immaculata who is queen even of God's heart." - Saint Maximillian Kolbe

As I see the images of such horrible human suffering occurring in Ukraine, I have been reflecting on the prayerful life of St. Maximillian Kolbe, a Franciscan priest from Poland who experienced first-hand the horrors of war and who died a martyr's death at the Auschwitz concentration camp in World War II. As a boy, Raymond Kolbe grew in devotion to Jesus through Mary from the influence of his virtuous mother, who taught him to pray the Rosary, Angelus and other Marian prayers. These daily prayers couldn't subdue Raymond's mischievous nature. One day he drew the ire of his mother, who said "I don't know what's going to become of you." Raymond tearfully presented himself to the Lord at his usual place of prayer, where he had a vision of the Virgin Mary. He described the incident:

"That night I asked the Mother of God what was to become of me. She presented me two crowns- one white, the other red. She asked me if I was willing to accept either of these crowns. The white one meant that I should persevere in purity and the red that I should become a martyr. I said that I would accept them both."

At the outbreak of World War II, for continuing to speak the truth about the war in Poland, Fr. Kolbe and four other friars were arrested by the Nazis and transferred to Auschwitz. Upon his arrest, Fr. Kolbe said "Courage, my sons. Don't you see that we are leaving on a mission? They pay our fare in the bargain. What a piece of good luck! The thing to do now is to pray well in order to win as many souls as possible."

Despite being subjected to violent harassment by the prison guards, Fr. Kolbe used smuggled bread and wine to secretly celebrate Mass for the prisoners. He received numerous beatings but continued to minister to all those around him. At one point he was beaten so badly, the prisoners had to smuggle him into the camp hospital, where he heard confessions as he recovered.

Towards the end of July 1941, a prisoner escaped from the camp and the Nazi commander decided to choose ten prisoners to be executed as retribution. A married man with young children was chosen as one of the ten, and when selected he cried ""My wife! My children!" When Fr. Kolbe heard his anguished cries, he stepped forward and asked to take the man's place. Astonished, the commander granted the request, and Fr. Kolbe was led off to the starvation chamber.

Inside the chamber, Fr. Kolbe led the prisoners in prayer each day. Whenever the guards would check on the condemned men, Fr. Kolbe was calmly standing or kneeling in the middle of the cell. Two terrible weeks of starvation followed, with Fr. Kolbe hearing the whispered prayers of his fellow prisoners as they passed away, leaving only him alive in the cell. The guards finally gave Fr. Kolbe a lethal injection and he died on August 14, 1941. His remains were cremated on August 15th, the feast day of the Assumption of Mary.

The incredible power of prayer centered the life of Maximillian Kolbe, and was brought home to Terese and I when we travelled to Poland on pilgrimage and prayed in the places walked by Fr. Kolbe, including the cell where he died in Auschwitz. The witness of prayer and the rise of humanity in the midst of such suffering, then in Poland, today in Ukraine, is a reminder to us of what we are ultimately called to be, sons and daughters of our Risen Lord.

This past Friday, March 25, Pope Francis consecrated Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Saint John Paul II called Fr. Kolbe "the "patron for our difficult century." In the midst of another difficult century, let us look to Saint Maximillian's devotion to Mary, his zeal in spreading God's love, and his heroic sacrifice in the face of evil to inspire us in our prayers as we continue our Lenten journey.

Saint Maximillian Kolbe, pray for us! Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us!

LAUDATO SI LENT WITH THE IGNATIAN SOLIDARITY NETWORK

The Laudato Si Action Platform (LSAP) is Pope Francis' guidelines for implementing "Care for Our Common Home." Our Lenten reflections lead us to action on behalf of our common home and all life. LSAP Goal 3 Ecological Economics acknowledges that the economy is a sub-system of human society, which itself is embedded within the biosphere - our common home. This goal invites us to consider how our community participates in our economic system and if we prioritize the dignity of workers and consider the environmental impacts of the products we buy and use. How can we invest, spend money, support circular economies and try our best to practice ethical consumption? God of all, may we be moved to tap into the countless ways that human ingenuity, animated by your Spirit, has allowed us to collectively live more sustainably on the Earth, protecting the dignity of people and planet, and that we consider how our financial investments impact the health of the planet. Goal 4 of the LSAP, Adoption of Sustainable Lifestyles, is grounded in the idea of sufficiency, and promoting sobriety in the use of resources and energy. We are invited to consider ways in which we can live simply individually and as a parish. Are there opportunities to become more sustainable in our dietary habits by opting for more plant-based and/or locally-sourced meals? Are there areas of our lives where we could limit or eliminate the use of single-use items (e.g. plastic water bottles, styrofoam cups, etc.)? "An integral ecology is also made up of simple daily gestures which break with the logic of violence, exploitation and selfishness. In the end, a world of exacerbated consumption is at the same time a world which mistreats life in all its forms." God of our day-to-day, we ask, in the midst of all of the joy, sorrow, chaos, and fatigue of our lives, that you gift us with the courage to choose to live lightly on the Earth as we go about our daily lives.
