Jesus Christ has Risen! Alleluia!

Pope Francis states: "Death, solitude, and fear are not the last word. There is a word that transcends them, a word that only God can speak: it is the word of Resurrection"! Christ has made good on all He promised. He is truly risen, and our celebration of new life opens the door of our minds and hearts to discover the depths of beauty and wonder.

"Beauty will save the world" Dostoyevsky said, because beauty is what attracts us to believe in the truth and to choose the good. Beauty is what we fall in love with, and therefore beauty is our soul's gravity, as St. Augustine says, "my love is my weight, my gravity." The beauty and wonder of Christ Risen is the force that attracts us beyond the pain and wounds of life. All the doors are opened to eternal life!

Our coming together is an experience of wonder and beauty in the liturgical life of the Church, and we need each other in faith, in conversation, and in discovering a Presence. All these factors open us up to the surprise of the Mystery.

Jesus Christ has Risen! It is such a joy for me and our staff to recognize faces that have returned to the community as we are called to companionship. In consideration of COVID we became separated in order to protect one another, and now our need to be worshipping together has become clearer. In a sense, we are inviting each other to return as we really need each other and as the community becomes a real place to come upon the face of Christ, beauty.

There are many reasons to be shaken as we continue to learn and experience the war in the Ukraine. It is beyond our comprehension in so many ways but this nation, a people belonging to each other, is filled with a longing and desire for beauty and wonder even though their hearts are broken. The suffering of Jesus led to a broken heart, which we experience as well, but our call to go beyond those limitations is the grace-filled sign that generates hope.

The passion, death and resurrection of Jesus is our path as well, and we all hold this promise in our hearts. This promise of suffering, dying, and rising is true for the people living through this tragic war, for those suffering all the pain and wounds of the world.

The great realist, Leo Tolstoy, was despised by the educated Russians as they did not accept his values which ran counter to received opinion. He said "no" to what others simply assumed, and that is our call as well, which we are not able to live and do in isolation but rather in staying together and helping each other discover the tiny moments of change. The ordinary events of our lives create a work of art with Jesus Risen and invite us to live. Too often these events are overlooked as we presume that they are not important or meaningful. Jesus was always forming a people by paying attention to every aspect of life and the tiniest moment led to a relational life of wonder and beauty.

EASTER

Art begins where the tiny bit begins. Tolstoy remarks: "That saying is strikingly true not only of art but of all life. One may say that true life begins where the tiny bit begins - where what seems to us minute and infinitely small alterations take place. True life is not lived where great external changes take place – where people move about, clash, fight, and slay one another - it is lived only where these tiny, tiny, infinitesimally small changes occur." The truths we seek are to be found not in the remote distance but right in front of us, hidden in plain view. Our Easter walk for fifty days is an invitation to invite the tiny experiences of joy, suffering, the presence of Christ, and to take these moments in without concluding the ordinariness cannot touch the thirst of my heart. Again, we need the presence of one another, and our coming together as a community supports our discernment of meeting the Mystery in the tiny and being embraced with a depth we never imagined. Are we available to these small steps? Christ has made good on all he promised. He is truly Risen!!!

During these weeks we will hear such profound stories with the beginning of the Church and the friends of Jesus recognizing the Risen Lord Jesus! This is the same for us, as Resurrection is happening now for each of us and we need to pay attention to all that is given. Tolstoy describes receiving such a gift when he could no longer struggle with the nervous agitation he felt at the sight of tears and, for once in his life, yields to his agitation. When he does: "he suddenly felt that what he had regarded as a nervous agitation was on the contrary a blissful spiritual condition that gave him all at once a new happiness he had never known. He did not think that the Christian law he had been all is life trying to follow enjoined him to forgive and love his enemies; but a happy feeling of love and forgiveness for his enemies filled his heart. He knelt down, and.....sobbed like a little child" (this and other quotes taken from a variety of places).

The tiny reveals a presence that moves us beyond our calculation and touches tender parts of our humanity; when the pieces fit together, and peace is abundant: He is Risen!


