## FATHER JOHN A. KLOCKEMAN APPOINTED NEW PASTOR



Archbishop Bernard A. Hebda has appointed Fr. John A. Klockeman as Pastor of St. Bartholomew Parish effective July 1, 2021. Fr. Klockeman currently is Pastor of St. Gerard Majella in Brooklyn Park, Minnesota. He was ordained to the priesthood on May 27, 2000.

Fr. Klockeman was born and raised in West St. Paul, Minnesota, where his family were members at St. Joseph Catholic Church. Both of his parents have passed away. He is the fifth of six children. He graduated from Henry Sibling High School. Fr. Klockeman has attended a number of universities and has multiple degrees and certificates. He received a Bachelor of Science degree in marketing in 1986 from Arizona State University in Tempe, Arizona; a Master of Arts degree in theology and Christian ministry in 1996 from Franciscan University in Steubenville, Ohio; and a Master of Divinity degree in 2000 from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota, while studying at the St. Paul Seminary.

Fr. Klockeman has also studied at the Institute of Comparative Political and Economic Systems at Georgetown University in Washington, D.C., in 1985; earned an International Business Certification at Arizona State University in 1986; a certificate for seminary formators at the Pontifical Athenaeum Regina Apostolorum in Rome in 2004; and a certificate in the spirituality of the diocesan priesthood and spiritual direction from the Institute for Priestly Formation at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska in 2013. He also took a sabbatical in 2016 and studied at Casa Santa Maria, in Rome, Italy.

Since his ordination to the priesthood in May 2000, Fr. Klockeman has served in a rich variety of ministries. His first assignment was as parochial vicar at St. Olaf Catholic Church in downtown Minneapolis from 2000 to 2003 where, in addition to his duties as Associate Pastor, he focused on outreach to young adults, catechesis, and wider public outreach on the cable television program, Generation Cross.

For the next six years he served as a spiritual director and formation director for the seminarians at St. John Vianney College Seminary at the University of St. Thomas. He also assisted at Mary, Queen of Peace Parish in Rogers, Minnesota. From 2009 to 2019 Fr. Klockeman shifted to the St. Paul Seminary School of Divinity, the graduate-level seminary, where he served as Assistant Director of Spiritual Formation and taught a number of academic courses. He also served as an instructor at the Archbishop Harry J. Flynn Catechetical Institute and became its Director in 2017. On the weekends he assisted at parishes throughout the Archdiocese, and from 2014 to 2016 he was the regular assistant at St. Thomas in Corcoran, St. Anne in Hamel, and Sts. Peter and Paul in Loretto. In 2019 Fr. Klockeman was appointed Pastor of St. Gerard in Brooklyn Park where he has served for the past two years.

Fr. Klockeman is widely acclaimed as an expert in Catholic spirituality. He has appeared locally and nationally on television and radio programs, conducted pilgrimages, led retreats and parish missions in many dioceses, and has been a speaker at conferences across the United States.



## PENTECOST

**The Feast of Pentecost.** Pentecost is a solemnity, the highest ranking liturgical feast, and it celebrates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles. It serves as the grand and glorious conclusion to the fifty-day Easter Season, seven continuous weeks that celebrate the greatest mystery of the Christian faith, the Resurrection. It brings the Paschal Mystery to completion.


**Special Liturgical Features.** The vestments are red which symbolize the Holy Spirit. There are two special Masses for Pentecost, a vigil Mass for Saturday evening and the Mass during the day for Sunday. A sprinkling rite is optional. There is a Sequence between the second reading and the gospel which may be sung or proclaimed. Infant baptisms are highly appropriate within the celebration of the Mass. There is a special solemn blessing for the dismissal that ends with a double Alleluia. The Easter Season is finished at the conclusion of Evening Prayer or Vespers at which time the Easter Candle is removed from the sanctuary and taken to its regular place, usually near the Baptismal font. If Evening Prayer is not celebrated, the Easter Candle usually is moved after the last Mass.

**A Magnificent Moment.** Pentecost recalls how the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles in the form of a strong driving wind and tongues as of fire which parted and came to rest on each of them. Immediately they were filled with the Holy Spirit (see Acts 2:1-4). It was an outpouring of the Spirit on each apostle individually and the Church collectively. The Spirit imbued the apostles with great love, led them to the truth, set their faith ablaze, and filled them with great zeal. This immeasurable grace was the birth of the Church. Through the Spirit the Church is sanctified or made holy, and by the power of the Spirit each person is united to Christ and the peoples of every nation, race, and language are unified in the profession of one faith. The annual celebration of this feast makes the graces first bestowed upon the apostles available to every believer in every subsequent generation.

**C+ Apostles in Need of Improvement.** The apostles were average performers at best and they needed to make major upgrades. Jesus spent countless hours with them. He gave them his warm friendship and personalized instruction, invited them to be his companions and performed amazing miracles before them. In spite of this, the apostles were terrified during the storm at sea, failed to understand the parables, were unable to expel some demons, fought among themselves over who was most important, and abandoned and betrayed their Master. They were unable to comprehend who Jesus was or what he expected of them. Even after the Resurrection they remained bewildered, isolated, afraid, and silent.

**The Transformative Moment.** On Pentecost the Holy Spirit galvanized the apostles' faith. It was a metamorphosis of epic proportions. The apostles emerged from the cocoon of the Upper Room completely remade. They were on fire with love for Jesus! Once fearful, they became bold and courageous. Once silent, they became assertive and outspoken. Once cautious, they took tremendous risks. Once followers, they became leaders. Once weak, they performed great and mighty deeds in Jesus' name. Once concerned with safeguarding their own lives, they became willing to sacrifice everything for the sake of Jesus and the gospel.

**Catch the Spirit!** The Holy Spirit that transformed the apostles on the first Pentecost has the power to transform each of us. The Spirit outpoured on the first apostles is also outpoured on us in the celebration of Pentecost, the sacraments, prayer, and multiple other ways. Pentecost is an invitation to be bold! Catch fire! Shed inhibitions! Love! Forgive! Share! Serve! Speak the truth! Do great and mighty deeds! Make the name of Jesus known and loved!

## TOGETHER AGAIN: REOPENING OUR CHURCH

We recognize the sacrifices and patience of our parishioners during the last year as we have faced the COVID-19 pandemic together. The pandemic has created many challenges such as limited social interactions, required social distancing, loss of programs, and wearing of masks to protect yourself and fellow parishioners. But with the recent easing of mandates and with vaccinations on the rise, the transition from restrictions to near normal is on the horizon. Here is an outline of the impact on our Masses, events, and parishioners:

### Now - May 28:

- Current protocols remain in place. There are no changes to the execution of Mass, events, programs, or access to the church building or parish office.

### Effective May 28:

- Masks will no longer be required but are recommended for the safety of all. As a consideration to those who are still vulnerable to COVID-19, we encourage masks at this time.
- No capacity limits or social distancing requirements for indoor events and gatherings, including daily Mass.
- Execution of the Mass resumes to pre-COVID:
  - Seat yourself.
  - No 6-foot social distancing required.
  - Communion resumes to pre-COVID format.
  - No controlled release at the end of Mass.
- Seating that allows for 6-foot distancing will be available in the south narthex and fellowship hall.

### Effective June 1:

- The church building and parish office will reopen. The church doors will be unlocked during regular hours, and the parish office will be open to guests once again.
- Current programs will continue with no limitations or special requirements.

*Please note that the changes above apply to the church only; St. Bartholomew Catholic School will continue to follow the current safety protocols in place until further notice.*

### We Look Forward to Being Together Again

Your safety and comfort level for returning to Mass remains important to us. We will continue cleaning and sanitizing. We recognize that COVID-19 is still circulating. Please follow the COVID safety protocols that are right for you, especially if you have not yet been vaccinated. Until further notice from Archbishop Hebda, the temporary dispensation of the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday remains. Online weekend Mass will continue to be available on Saturdays at 5:00 p.m.

We look forward to welcoming you back more fully to in-person Mass, events, and programs. Parish leaders, staff and volunteers have been busy the last few months planning for this momentous time. Stay tuned for more details on upcoming events and programs.


