This has been an exciting year with many blessings! One specific blessing is the number of people who are participating in our various liturgical ministries! If you are not familiar with the term, a liturgical minister is anyone who has a role at Mass — including greeters, lectors (who proclaim the Word of God from the ambo), cantors and instrumentalists (who lead the music), sacristans

(who set up everything for Father before Mass begins), etc. If you're interested in learning about or serving in any of these ministries, contact Zach.

Last Spring, we began the process of restructuring all our liturgical ministry teams. Now we have fully reengaged lectors, musicians, and sacristans, and we are gradually building a tech team. As of the end of November, we have a total of **60 people** active on these liturgical ministry teams. Thanks be to God!


