VETERAN'S DAY. Wednesday, November 11 is the Memorial of St. Martin of Tours, the patron of soldiers and those in our Armed Forces. November 11 is also Veteran's Day and we are very grateful to all of our Veterans!

CURRENT FINANCIAL UPDATE. This weekend, we are providing our 2019-2020 Fiscal Year End reports (see page 5) as well as our current 2020-2021 Budget reports. This annual report gives me the opportunity to thank you for your faith, your prayers, and your generosity. Thank you for making the extra effort to mail in or drop off your envelope and to all who moved to on-line giving. In particular, I want to thank all who made extra gifts.

Next weekend, members of the Finance Committee will make an appeal at all the Masses to help offset the loss of our parish Fall Festival income in 2020 as a result of the coronavirus. Please know we are deeply grateful to all of you and we give thanks for everyone's generosity in helping with this shortfall.

PLANNING AHEAD. Adhering to social distancing guidelines, the Christmas Season will present some unique challenges! This year, there will be a Christmas Mass Time Sign-Up to ensure we stay within our capacity limits and prevent overcrowding (max capacity is 180 people). Mass times are as follows: CHRISTMAS EVE: 4:30PM (Childrens), 7PM (Spanish), 10PM (English) w/9:30PM Christmas Carols; CHRISTMAS DAY: 8AM and 10AM (English) and 12PM (Spanish). We will ask that you sign up for one Mass time and include the number of people in your household and any out of town guests that may be attending Mass with you. We urge parishioners to reserve the 4:30PM Mass for families with children. Each Mass time will have its own sign-up link and will be first come first serve. If one Mass becomes full, we hope you will sign up for a different Mass time. For those who do not have internet access to sign-up, please call the parish center office to sign up for a Mass time. We will stream Christmas Mass on our Facebook page for those who cannot attend.

Also, there will be NO communal reconciliation this Advent season. Fr Luis and I will be offering additional opportunities for confessions. More information to come!

NUESTRA PARROQUIA.

El concejo de finanzas de nuestra parroquia de San Francisco de Asís, nos comparte como están las finanzas actualmente.

Este año, a fines de julio, enviamos un pedido de ayuda para cubrir el déficit financiero que ocurrió desde el momento en que nuestra iglesia fue cerrada a fines de marzo hasta que reabrimos el 20 de junio. Queremos agradecer a todos por ayudar a abordar este déficit; sus respuestas fueron muy amables y muy apreciadas, se recibieron \$19,650 directamente de este llamado y petición. Otros feligreses han optado por aumentar sus donaciones mensuales. ¡Nuestros feligreses son muy amables! Agradecemos las generosas contribuciones que se han hecho.

Vivimos en una época inusual y sin precedentes dada la pandemia de COVID en curso. Nuestra parroquia tomó la decisión de no realizar nuestro Festival Anual de Otoño este año. Esta decisión se tomó para cumplir con el distanciamiento social y mantener la seguridad de todos. Nuestro Festival de Otoño es el principal evento de recaudación de fondos para nuestra parroquia y en un año normal contribuye de \$30,000 a 40,000 a nuestro presupuesto anual. Para compensar este déficit, solicitamos sus contribuciones, por pequeñas que sean, ya que cada donación ayudará a cerrar la brecha en nuestro presupuesto.

La familia Powers, en memoria de Bunny Powers, ya ha donado \$10,000 a este llamamiento. El Fondo de Dotación también ha contribuido a este llamamiento.

We take stewardship of the parish finances entrusted to us extremely seriously, and we are dedicated to transparency and accountability. To that end, our finances are reviewed at least quarterly by the Finance Committee. The coronavirus has altered our lives considerably. We have been adapting and adjusting as quickly as possible to those challenges. These reports illustrate our parish's financial condition for the Fiscal Year End June 30, 2020, our 2020-2021 Fiscal Year Budget, the month of October as well as Year-to-Date Actuals.

Last July, a letter was sent out to the parish - asking those that are able - to consider making an additional gift to the church. People responded very generously, and we were able to make up some of our losses from March and April. We continue to encourage parishioners to sign up for our ACH or online giving programs to support our monthly budget. In August, we made the difficult decision to cancel our Fall Festival fundraiser which brings in \$30-\$40,000 in annual income. Next weekend, members of the Finance Committee will make an appeal at all the Masses to help offset the loss of our parish Fall Festival income this year.

Given the suspension of Masses at St. Francis for a number of months of the fiscal year, parish giving ended the year 10% below budget. We sought to reduce expenses by not immediately filling our vacant music director and faith formation positions ❶ - a savings of 31% and 24% respectively. Many of the parishes in the diocese, including ours, were able to receive grants under the Payroll Protection Program to have access to funds to continue payroll to the parish staff when giving was down while in-person Mass attendance was suspended.

Our budget for 2020-21 has an approximate decrease in budgeted income of 10% from last year. There is an approximate increase in budgeted expenses of 10% from last year - in large part due to fixed increases in expenses like health insurance (30% increase) and our diocesan assessment (20% increase). In 2020, we received a large Memorial gift ❷ - and the balance of that gift may be used to cover any budget shortfall ❸. We plan to evaluate the budget periodically and make adjustments with economic conditions.

We are truly a wonderful parish! We look forward to the future - spreading the love, care and gospel of Jesus Christ - to our greater surrounding community. Thanks be to God!

IS PEACE POSSIBLE IN OUR TIMES?

It seems that peace is not possible in our days. If we listen to the news, it doesn't take long to see that peace eludes people in many places in the world. People are attacked in churches, diseases affect millions, many suffer for lack of proper housing, food and clothing. These are just a few of the realities that can take away our peace. Yet closer to home, our peace can be dashed by bad news about our health, the sickness or death of a loved one, a child who has gone astray, a broken relationship, or a bad financial situation.

Yet Jesus promised that he would give us HIS peace, "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (Jn 14:27). At every Mass, before the sign of peace the priest says; "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give to you." These are Jesus' words to each one of us. If Jesus promised us peace, then it must be possible for us to have peace.

Let's look at what kind of peace Jesus was talking about. Jesus is not talking about worldly peace which is often achieved through violence and is always unstable, but a spiritual serenity that comforts us regardless of our outward circumstances.

The word "peace" or "harmony" is used 92 times in the New Testament. Peace is one of the great blessings Jesus gave to the world in the reference above from John 14. Peace is rooted in our reconciliation with God as seen in Romans 5:1; "Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." The peace Jesus gives is an inward peace as in Romans 15:13; "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." The peace of Christ can also heal divisions as seen in Ephesians 2: 14; "For He is our peace, who has made us both one, and has broken down the dividing wall of hostility."

In the end, Christ Jesus is the source of our peace. Cultivating a friendship with him is the path to peace. No matter what happens, God is in control and has permitted whatever will happen. So, as St Paul says, "And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts to which indeed you were called in the one body."



**MEMBERS OF THE WEDDING:
SCOTT HAHN REFLECTS ON THE
THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN
ORDINARY TIME**

According to marriage customs of Jesus' day, a bride was first "betrothed" to her husband but continued for a time to live with her family. Then, at the appointed hour, some months later, the groom would come to claim her, leading her family and bridal party to the wedding feast that would celebrate and inaugurate their new life together.

This is the background to the parable of the last judgment we hear in today's Gospel. In the parable's symbolism, Jesus is the Bridegroom (see Mark 2:19). In this, He fulfills God's ancient promise to join himself forever to His chosen people as a husband cleaves to his bride (see Hosea 2:16-20). The virgins of the bridal party represent us, the members of the Church.

We were "betrothed" to Jesus in Baptism (see 2 Corinthians 11:2; Ephesians 5:25-27) and are called to lives of holiness and devotion until He comes again to lead us to the heavenly wedding feast at the end of time (see Revelation 19:7-9; 21:1-4).

As St. Paul warns in today's Epistle, Jesus is coming again, though we know not the day nor the hour. We need to keep vigil throughout the dark night of this time in which our Bridegroom seems long delayed. We need to keep our souls' lamps filled with the oil of perseverance and desire for God—virtues that are extolled in today's First Reading and Psalm.

We are to seek Him in love, meditating upon His kindness, calling upon His name, striving to be ever more worthy of Him, to be found without spot or blemish when He comes. If we do this, we will be counted as wise and the oil for our lamps will not run dry (see 1 Kings 17:16). We will perceive the Bridegroom, the Wisdom of God (see Proverbs 8:22-31, 35; 9:1-5), hastening toward us, beckoning us to the table He has prepared, the rich banquet that will satisfy our souls.
