A MESSAGE FROM POPE FRANCIS & BISHOP QUINN

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY 2021-2023. Pope Francis and Bishop Quinn invite you to participate in a 2-year preparation process for the 26th Ordinary Synod of Bishops, which will take place in Rome in the fall of 2023. The topic of the Synod will be "synodality," a term which Pope Francis uses to describe our Church's "journeying together"... prayerfully listening to the needs and experiences of God's people in order to faithfully discern the best way forward.

Pope Francis has asked the entire Church to take an active part in the synod, inviting people

from all walks of life and from all around the world to gather together for prayer, sharing experiences, listening, and seeking the guidance and wisdom of the Holy Spirit. During this diocesan phase of the Synod, these gatherings will include parishioners, consecrated men and women, people of other Christian communities, and those "on the margins" of society and church life. There will be listening sessions held in each parish/cluster in the new year which will include prayer, reflection, and discussion on the life of our Church today, and how the Holy Spirit is calling us to continue our mission of proclaiming Jesus Christ to the world.

The "vital pillars" of the synod process are:

- **COMMUNION:** "God gathers us together as diverse peoples of one faith. We all have a role to play in discerning and living out God's call for his people."
- **PARTICIPATION:** "A call for the involvement of all who belong to the People of God laity, consecrated and

ordained – to engage in the exercise of deep and respectful listening to one another."

• **MISSION:** "The Church exists to evangelize.... Our mission is to witness to the love of God in the midst of the whole human family."

The goal of the Synod is for the Church "to listen to the living voice of the entire People of God." Please join us by participating in your local synod listening session! Our parish listening session will be on Saturday, February 12. See page 5 of the bulletin for more parish synodal information.

EL BAUTISMO DE JESUS

El bautismo de Juan fue el bautismo de arrepentimiento (Mateo 3:11), pero Jesús fue sin pecado y no tenía necesidad de arrepentimiento. Incluso Juan se sorprendió cuando vio a Jesús que venía hacia Él. Juan reconoció su propio pecado: "Yo necesito ser bautizado por ti, ¿y tú vienes a mí?" (Mateo 3:14).

Hay varias razones para el bautizo de Jesús. Era conveniente que Jesús fuera reconocido públicamente por su antecesor. Juan era "la voz que clama en el desierto" (Isaías 40:3). Al bautizar a Jesús, Juan estaba declarando a todos que aquí estaba aquel a quien ellos habían estado esperando, el Hijo de Dios, aquel que Él había profetizado bautizaría "con el Espíritu Santo y fuego" (Mateo 3:11).

También demostró que Él se identificó con los pecadores. Su bautismo simbolizó el bautismo de los pecadores en la justicia de Cristo, muriendo con Él y levantándose libres del pecado y capaces de caminar en vida nueva.

Quizás lo más importante, la ocasión del bautismo público dejó testimonio a todas las generaciones futuras, la perfecta encarnación del Dios trino revelado en la gloria del cielo. El testimonio directo desde el cielo por parte del Padre complaciéndose con el Hijo y el Espíritu Santo que descendía sobre Jesús, (Mateo 3:16-17) es una imagen hermosa de la naturaleza trina de Dios. También describe la obra del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu, en la salvación de aquellos que Jesús vino a salvar. El Padre ama a los escogidos desde antes de la fundación del mundo (Efesios 1:4); Él envía a su Hijo para buscar y salvar lo que se había perdido (Lucas 19:10); y el Espíritu convence de pecado (Juan 16:8) y atrae al creyente al Padre a través del Hijo. Toda la verdad gloriosa de la misericordia de Dios a través de Jesucristo está expuesta en el bautismo de Jesús.



FAMILY CONNECTION

Every family has a unique identity that is defined by the behaviors, attitudes, and expectations that govern a family's daily life. This identity is influenced by the family history of the parents, but each family's expression of this history is unique. In today's Gospel, we learn that Jesus' behavior, atti-

tudes, and expectations were governed by his identity as God's beloved Son.

In our Baptism, we were made children of this same heavenly Father. This identity as members of the family of God, and as brothers and sisters of Jesus, also shapes our family's daily life.


As you gather as a family, identify some of the expectations and behaviors that govern your family life by answering the question, "What are some of the things that make our family life unique?" Celebrate these things about your family life. Read today's Gospel, Luke 3:15-16,21-22. Observe that Jesus' identity as the Beloved Son of the Father governed his behaviors, attitudes, and expectations. Recall that at our Baptism we were made children of this same heavenly Father. How does this identity as a member of the family of God govern and shape our family life?

Conclude in prayer together that we will remain faithful to our baptismal identity as children of God and as brothers or sisters of Jesus. Conclude by praying together the Lord's Prayer.

Today we celebrate the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. In today's Gospel, as in the other Gospel accounts of Jesus' baptism, we hear John the Baptist address the confusion of the people who thought that John might be the Messiah. In response, John contrasts the baptism that he performs with the Baptism that Jesus will inaugurate. John the Baptist says that he has baptized with

water, but that someone will come and baptize with the Holy Spirit. The type of baptism that John performed was not yet a Christian Baptism; it was a preparation for Christian Baptism through which sins are forgiven and the gift of the Holy Spirit is received.

The baptism of Jesus is reported in each of the three Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Clearly, it was an event of great significance for Jesus and for the early Christian community. The Evangelists Mark and Luke report the story from Jesus' perspective; the voice from heaven is addressed to Jesus. Compare this to Matthew's Gospel in which the voice from heaven speaks to everyone. In Luke, however, the Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus during his time of prayer after his baptism. Through his Gospel, Luke will show Jesus to be a person of prayer who withdraws regularly from the crowds and his disciples to pray to his Father.

The baptism of Jesus is considered a manifestation of God in Jesus, another "epiphany." On this, the last day of the Christmas season, our Gospel reveals to us Jesus' relation to God: the son of Mary and Joseph is also God's own Son. In Luke's Gospel, all three members of the Trinity are manifested here: God the Father in the voice, the Holy Spirit descending, and Jesus the Son. At the beginning of his Gospel, Luke is communicating to us important information about the identity of Jesus. In the verses that follow, Luke lists the genealogy of Jesus, tracing Jesus' ancestry back to the first person, Adam, who is also identified as the son of God. We, the children of Adam and Eve, are again made children of God through Baptism.
