EVEN THE LITURGY "FASTS" IN PREPARATION FOR THE

GLORIOUS SEASON OF EASTER. Lent is a time of simplification and sacrifice, aimed at drawing closer to Christ and preparing to celebrate His resurrection. This is true in our personal prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, and it's also true at Mass. In the liturgy, the Church fasts both visually and aurally during the Lenten season.

Visually, fresh flowers are not permitted in the sanctuary in Lent. Aurally, the Church allows the use of musical instruments only to support the singing of the people, except on Solemnities and Feasts. Neither the Gloria nor the Alleluia is permitted. There is no solo instrumental music. We also fast from singing a recessional hymn. Such sacrifices delineate the solemn season of Lent, until we are able to rejoice again on Easter.

During Lent, we will also sing the Latin chant Mass parts. Of all the musical settings of the Mass, the Latin chants lend themselves best to simple singing. Since the texts are the same as what we sing at Mass all through the year (e.g. "Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of hosts..."), it's very easy for us to understand what we're singing. Our singing together in Latin also signifies and promotes the universality of the Catholic Church, uniting us with Catholics around the world and through the course of history.

SOCIETY OF ST VINCENT DE PAUL: ST FRANCIS OF ASSISI CONFERENCE. Our St Francis of Assisi Society of St Vincent de Paul Conference would like to let our parish know the support provided to families in need.

During the most recent year, our conference assisted over 200 families and almost 600 family members with financial assistance of approximately \$71,000. This financial assistance was comprised primarily of housing assistance (\$31,000), a program to provide mattresses to families in need (\$26,000), utilities (\$6,300), transportation/car repairs (\$1,200) and food (\$1,100). In many cases, the assistance we provided prevented eviction or utility cutoffs.

The mattress program was made possible by a bequest made by a deceased parishioner in a prior year. We could not provide this ministry without the parish support including the financial support from parishioners, members and memorials of \$30,000. Our total revenue of \$41,000 included a \$6,100 grant from Catholic Charities, Olmsted County and the Knights of Columbus and the Walk for the Poor fundraiser of \$5,400.

Our conference works very closely with other parish ministries serving those in need including the Social Concerns Committee, Neighbors in Need envelope program, Resource Room, the Sunday Lunch program and the Angel Advent Tree. Our parish can be proud of the social ministry provided by the parish. Thank you for your support and prayers. Financial support may be provided by contributing to the Neighbors in Need envelope or by sending a contribution to the parish with a designation for the Society of St Vincent de Paul.

Interested in participating in SVDP? Our parish conference meets on the 2nd and 4th Monday at 6:30PM in the Parish Center Conference Room. It includes discussion of our spiritual development and how we can assist our community members in need. Many of our members have commented that their initial involvement was to answer a call to help the poor but that they have stayed involved because of the spiritual development and friendships formed with other Vincentians.

FAMILY CONNECTION.

In Luke's Gospel, the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert appears just after Jesus' baptism and before Jesus begins his public ministry. We can imagine this as a time of transition, a turning point in Jesus' life. Perhaps we can liken it to one of the important turning points in our own lives: the de-

cision to marry, the birth of a child, the acceptance of a new job, or the decision to move to a new home. After the moment of decision, having reached the point of no return, we sometimes begin to wonder if we are prepared and ready for the task before us.

Turning points can be times of doubt and insecurity. Jesus' response to the temptations of the devil offers an example for responding in faith when our doubts and insecurities tempt us to distrust God's sufficiency. Jesus rebukes the devil by quoting Scripture. Each citation is an affirmation of trust in God. We learn to trust in big things by practicing trust in little things. Our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving invite us to trust God in these small ways. They remind us that God will suffice for us. They prepare us to trust in God in all things, especially in moments of doubt and uncertainty.

As a family, talk about ways in which trust has been built among members of the family. Observe how being trustworthy in small matters enables us to trust one another in more important matters. Offer specific examples if possible (e.g., children who establish their responsibility in household tasks can be granted greater independence and freedom to choose how they perform these tasks). Today's Gospel shows us how Jesus trusted God in all things. Read aloud today's Gospel, Luke 4:1-13. Discuss how Jesus showed his trust in God when he resisted the devil's temptations. Invite family members to name times when they have trusted God in matters small or large. Write a family prayer together. You might write the prayer so that each line begins with a letter in the word "trust." Pray this prayer together.



In each of the three Synoptic Gospels, after his baptism, Jesus is reported to have spent forty days in the desert, fasting and praying. In Luke and in Matthew, the devil presents three temptations to Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power to appease his hunger, he offers Jesus all the kingdoms of the world if Jesus will worship him, and he tempts Jesus to

put God's promise of protection to the test. In each case, Jesus resists, citing words from Scripture to rebuke the devil's temptation.

Each temptation that Jesus faces offers insight into the spirituality we hope to develop as we keep the forty days of the Season of Lent. We can trust God to provide for our material needs. We worship God because God alone has dominion over us and our world. We can trust God to be faithful to his promises. Jesus' rejection of the devil's temptations shows that he will not put God to the test. Grounding himself on the Word and authority of Scripture, Jesus rebukes the devil by his confidence in God's protection and faithfulness.

This Gospel highlights for us one of the central themes of the Season of Lent. We are dependent upon God for all that we have and all that we are. Anything that leads us to reject this dependency or to distrust its sufficiency, is a temptation from the devil.

Luke ends his report of Jesus' temptation in the desert by noting that the devil departs for a time. The implication is that the devil will return. Jesus knows that he will be tempted again in the Garden of Gethsemane. The depth of Jesus' trust in God is shown most fully when Jesus rejects the temptation to turn away from the task God has given to him. Jesus' final rebuke of the devil is his sacrifice on the Cross.

Jesus' responses to the temptations of the devil teach us how we can respond to temptation. As we start our journey through Lent, this Sunday's Gospel calls us to adopt the same confidence that Jesus had in the face of temptation: God's word alone will suffice, God's promise of protection can be trusted, and God alone is God.

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
