#### A NOTE FROM FR LUIS



**TIEMPO PASCUAL.** El tiempo pascual comprende cincuenta días (en griego = "pentecostés", vividos y celebrados como un solo día: "los cincuenta días que median entre el domingo de la Resurrección hasta el domingo de Pentecostés se han de celebrar con alegría y júbilo, como si se tratara de un solo y único día festivo, como un gran domingo".

El tiempo pascual es el más fuerte de todo el año, que se inaugura en la Vigilia Pascual y se celebra durante siete semanas hasta Pentecostés. El origen de esta cincuentena se remonta a los orígenes del Año litúrgico. Dentro de la Cincuentena se celebra la Ascensión del Señor que pertenece al misterio de la Pascua del Señor. Y concluye todo con la donación del Espíritu en Pentecostés.

La unidad de la Cincuentena que da también subrayada por la presencia del Cirio Pascual encendido en todas las celebraciones, hasta el domingo de Pentecostés.

FIESTA DE LA DIVINA MISERICORDIA. 24 de Abril. Deseo que el primer domingo después de Pascua de Resurrección sea la Fiesta de la Misericordia (Diario, 299) – dijo el Señor Jesús a Sor Faustina. Él expresó este deseo hasta 14 veces indicando no sólo un lugar de la fiesta en el calendario litúrgico, sino también el objetivo de su creación, el modo de su preparación y celebración. La fiesta debe ser un día de adoración especial de Dios en el misterio de su Misericordia, que es la fuente y el motivo de todas las obras de Dios para el hombre, especialmente la obra de la redención. Es también - por voluntad de Dios - un día de gracia especial para todas las almas, y especialmente para los pecadores que están más necesitados de la Misericordia de Dios. La Fiesta – dijo Jesús – ha brotado de las entrañas de Mi Misericordia para el consuelo del mundo entero (Diario 1517).

Desde esa fecha, para ser exactos con la Eucaristía, recibida en esa fecha, está ligada la mayor promesa: el perdón total de las culpas y el castigo (Diario 300). Esta gracia es mucho mayor que la indulgencia plenaria, la cual consiste en la remisión de la pena temporal por los pecados cometidos, pero no es la remisión de los mismos pecados.

En nuestra Parroquia de San Francisco, Hoy tendremos la gran celebración de la Fiesta de la Divina Misericordia, empezaremos a las 2:30 pm. Tendremos exposición de Santísimo, confesiones y cantaremos la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia. Para que no tenga dificultad en ir y regresar a sus casas, los caballeros de Colon de nuestra comunidad hispana nos ofrecerán venta de tacos para recoger fondos para el arreglo y remodelación del confesionario, todos estamos invitados.




#### WHY REGISTER IN A PARISH?

A Catholic parish is where we publicly express our faith, joining together with others to give witness of our communion with God and with one another. There are many reasons to register:

with the parish?

- A sense of belonging and identity in a parish community.
- In times of joy and in times of struggle, it is comforting to have the support of a faith family.
- It is a commitment to practice your faith.
- Gives a chance for you and your family to be counted and heard in the parish.
- Being included in the demographics of the parish helps in the planning for the needs of the parish.
- Gives the parish a way to connect with you.
- In order to receive the Sacraments of Baptism, First Reconciliation, First Holy Communion, Confirmation, or Holy Matrimony, you will need to be a registered member.
- For religious education instruction and Sacramental preparation, the families of those attending must also be registered parishioners.
- Active, participating parishioners are provided a parish grant if you have children who plan to attend our Catholic schools.



#### FAMILY CONNECTION.

Our family life would no doubt be enhanced if we were able to transform Jesus? greeting into a central feature in our family's interactions. After his Resurrection, "Peace be with you" is the first thing that Jesus says to his disciples. This could be our daily family prayer for one another. In today's

Gospel, we also hear that Jesus next breathed on his disciples and gave them the gift of the Holy Spirit. In Baptism, each of us has received the gift of the Holy Spirit as well as the forgiveness of sins. Peace is a fruit of the Holy Spirit. Our Baptism, then, invites us to share in the peace that Christ gave to his disciples and commissions us to share that peace of Christ by generously forgiving others as Jesus taught.

As you gather as a family, think about gifts that you might receive together such as a coloring book and crayons, a book and bookmark, or an electronic item and batteries. Observe that Jesus also paired two gifts together in today's Gospel. Read aloud this Sunday's Gospel, John 20:19-31. Discuss the two gifts Jesus gave to his disciples: peace and the Holy Spirit. Ask: What were the disciples to do with these gifts? (They were sent as Jesus was sent by the Father to forgive sins.) Recall that we have each received Jesus? gift of the Holy Spirit at our Baptism and that peace is a fruit of the Holy Spirit. Observe that since we also have received these gifts from Christ, we are also sent to be people who forgive others as Jesus taught. Determine an action that your family can do to share peace and forgiveness with one another. Pray together the Prayer to the Holy Spirit or the Peace Prayer of St. Francis.

**INVOCATION OF PEACE.** God of Love, you created us and you call us to live as brothers and sisters. Give us the strength daily to be instruments of peace; enable us to see everyone who crosses our path as our broth-

er or sister. Make us sensitive to the plea of our citizens who entreat us to turn our weapons of war into implements of peace, our trepidation into confident trust, and our quarreling into forgiveness... Lord, defuse the violence of our tongues and our hands. Renew our hearts and minds, so that... our way of life will always be that of: Shalom, Peace, Salaam! Amen.



Today's reading, from the Gospel of John, is proclaimed on the second Sunday of Easter in each of the three Sunday Lectionary cycles. This should alert us to the significance of the encounters with the resurrected Jesus described in this reading. This Gospel combines two scenes: Jesus' appearance to his disciples after his Resurrection and Jesus' dialogue with Thomas, the disciple who doubted.

Part of the mystery of Jesus? Resurrection is that he appeared to his disciples not as a spirit but in bodily form. We do not know exactly what this form was like. Earlier in John's Gospel, when Mary of Magdala first encountered the risen Jesus, she did not recognize the figure standing before her until Jesus spoke her. In Luke's Gospel, the disciples walking on the road to Emmaus did not recognize Jesus until he broke bread with them. We know from readings such as today's that in his resurrected body, Jesus was no longer bound by space; he appeared to the disciples in spite of the locked door. And yet, on this resurrected body, the disciples could still observe the marks of his Crucifixion.

In today's Gospel, Jesus greets his disciples with the gift of peace and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus also commissions his disciples to continue the work that he has begun. As Jesus was sent by God, so too does Jesus send his disciples. This continuity with Jesus' own mission is an essential element of the Church. Jesus grants the means to accomplish this mission when he gives his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit binds us together as a community of faith and strengthens us to bear witness to Jesus' Resurrection.

Jesus' words to his disciples also highlight the integral connection between the forgiveness of sins and the gift of the Holy Spirit. Forgiveness and reconciliation are gifts to us from Jesus. With the grace of the Holy Spirit, we can share these with others. This is another essential aspect of what it means to be Christ's Church. The Church continues Jesus? ministry of forgiveness and reconciliation.

Thomas, the disciple who doubts, represents the reality of the Church that comes after this first community of disciples. All but the first disciples of Jesus must believe without seeing. Like Thomas, we may doubt the news that Jesus, who was crucified and buried, appeared to his disciples. It is part of our human nature to seek hard evidence that the Jesus who appeared to the disciples after his death is, indeed, the same Jesus who was crucified. Thomas is given the opportunity to be our representative who obtains this evidence. He gives witness to us that the Jesus who was raised is the same Jesus who had died. Through the gift of the Holy Spirit, we are among those who are blessed for we have not seen and yet have believed.
