A NOTE FROM FR LUIS



TIEMPO PASCUAL. El tiempo pascual es el más fuerte de todo el año, que se inaugura en la Vigilia Pascual y se celebra durante siete semanas hasta Pentecostés. El origen de esta cincuentena se remonta a los orígenes del Año litúrgico. Dentro de la Cincuentena se celebra la Ascensión del Señor que pertenece al misterio de la Pascua del Señor. Y concluye todo

con la donación del Espíritu en Pentecostés. La unidad de la Cincuentena que da también subrayada por la presencia del Cirio Pascual encendido en todas las celebraciones, hasta el domingo de Pentecostés.

MAYO MES DE LA VIRGEN MARIA. María es la única mujer de toda la historia de la humanidad a la que Dios permitió nacer sin pecado original, la madre de Cristo y siempre Virgen, que fue asunta al cielo en cuerpo y alma. Tenemos todo este mes de mayo para dedicarlos especialmente a Nuestra Madre. Pero, ¿por qué el mes de mayo es el mes de la Virgen María? Si la Iglesia está celebrando la Resurrección de Jesús, ¿por qué se rinde homenaje también a María en este mes?

Esta tradición lleva dos siglos en vigor y coincide con el comienzo de la primavera y el destierro del invierno. El "triunfo de la vida" que simboliza la primavera es uno de los motivos por los que se sitúa en mayo el mes de la Virgen, Madre de la Vida, de Jesús. Además, la presencia de este homenaje particular a María se corresponde con otorgar un sentido cristiano a este mes y en esta estación. La Grecia y la Roma clásicas también celebraban la llegada de la primavera. Lo hacían con festividades, oraciones y flores para Artemisa y Flora, ambas consideradas diosas de la fertilidad.

Esta tradición dio un vuelco en el siglo XII y cambió de página en el calendario. Nació la fiesta de "La devoción de los treinta días a María", que tenía lugar entre la segunda quincena de agosto y la primera de septiembre. Dedicarle un mes exclusivo a la Virgen es una idea del siglo XVII. En esta época volvió a incluirse un culto especial a María en el mes de mayo, que es el que ha llegado hasta la actualidad. La primavera y el mes de mayo presentan una naturaleza verde, en flor, con buen tiempo. Ese reflejo de la belleza de la naturaleza también hablan de María, de su belleza y de su virtud.

La celebración de este mes de mayo es más que una tradición entre los cristianos, es un homenaje y una acción de gracias hacia quien es Nuestra Madre. Como "regalos" para Ella, se suelen hacer muchas cosas. Entre ellas, el rezo del Rosario, las ofrendas florales o la meditación de sus dogmas son algunas ideas con las que honrar a María en este mes de mayo.



THE TWO FEET OF LOVE IN ACTION.

The document "The Two Feet of Love in Action" was developed by the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops. This tool describes two distinct, but complementary, ways that we can put the Gospel into action. The first is through charitable works which is described as short-term emergency assistance for individ-

uals. Saint Francis of Assisi parish is very generous in providing charitable works for our neighbors in need. The second is through social justice which is described as addressing systemic, root causes of problems that affect many people. Some ways that you can be more active in social justice is to sign up for emails from the Minnesota Catholic Conference. These emails tell you about Minnesota Legislative bills that affect the disadvantaged in our state. It explains the bills and informs you on how you can let your legislators know how you wish them to vote. 



FAMILY CONNECTION.


Is love the first word your family members use to describe their interactions? Love is difficult. Jesus' sacrifice for us is an example of this. Yet because of love, the glory of God is fully revealed in Jesus. God's glory is revealed in us when we act as the Body of

Christ, as individuals and as a community. In the love we have for one another—difficult, challenging, sacrificial love—we find Jesus.

Choose one or two occasions when your family was together during the week. Describe the family's interactions from an outsider's perspective. When is it less difficult to show love to family members? When is it more difficult? When love is difficult, what do we do?

Jesus didn't just tell us to love one another. He showed us how to love one another. In what ways did Jesus show us how to love? (in his acts of healing and forgiving; at the Last Supper as he washed his disciples' feet; in the gift of the Eucharist; through his death on the Cross)

Today's Gospel again comes from the Gospel of John. Like last week, today we hear words spoken by Jesus before his death and Resurrection. Jesus is teaching at the Last Supper.

John's Gospel does not include an institution of the Eucharist narrative; instead, Jesus washes his disciples' feet. Immediately after,

Jesus predicts his betrayal by Judas. Today's Gospel follows that prediction. It can be read as a continuing explanation of Jesus' act of washing his disciples' feet. It begins with the announcement that this is the moment when the Son of Man will be glorified. This theme continues throughout John's Passion. Jesus will be glorified in his death on the cross and in his Resurrection, and the disciples will glorify Jesus in the love they show.

John's Gospel does not present a sentimental view of love. This is a type of love that is shown in service and sacrifice. It is difficult to choose to love when faced with hatred and anger. Jesus tells the disciples that all will know that they are his disciples because of the love they show for one another. This description of the early Christian community will be repeated in the Acts of the Apostles: "See how they love one another." Christian love is the hallmark of Christianity. We see it lived in the witness of the martyrs. We see it in the example of the lives of the saints. We see it in the holy women and men who live and love daily, making small and large sacrifices for others.
