A MESSAGE FROM FR JIM BERNING



THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST. This weekend is the Feast of Corpus Christi, which in Latin means the "Body of Christ."

- We believe that the person of Christ is fully present in the consecrated bread and wine ... His Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity.
- When we receive Holy Communion, we receive Christ. We are in co-union with Him. This spiritual food enriches us, becomes part of our spirit and life. In essence, we gradually become what we eat.
- № Belief in the Real Presence takes faith! Jesus says over and over again that unless we eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, we will not have eternal life." The apostles said, "This is a hard saying." Jesus did not soften his statement, but instead he repeated it several times. We keep saying Amen again and again! I do believe! Jesus Christ, you are Truly Present to us in the Holy Eucharist.
- ♣ Holy Communion is meant to unite us, not only to Christ present in the Eucharistic species of bread and wine, but also to each other. We are the Body of Christ!

This weekend, a special blessing will be given to our Extra-ordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Blessings to all of them who distribute Holy Communion at Mass and to our Homebound. We thank them for their Ministry!

DIOCESAN MINISTRY DAYS 2022. This past week, we were reminded and challenged with the fact that few Catholics, approximately 30 percent, fully believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. There is a tremendous need for a revival of Faith! The Bishops of the United States are calling for a three-year grassroots revival of devotion and belief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. They believe that God wants to see a movement of Catholics across the United States, healed, converted, formed, and unified by an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist—and sent out in mission "for the life of the world." These three years will culminate in the first National Eucharistic Congress in the United States in almost fifty years. Almost a hundred thousand Catholics will join together in Indianapolis for a once-in-a-lifetime pilarimage toward the "source and summit" of our Catholic faith. CELEBRAMOS LA SOLEMNIDAD DEL CORPUS CHRISTI, (El Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo.)

Esta fiesta se comenzó a celebrar en Lieja en 1246, siendo extendida a toda la Iglesia occidental por el Papa Urbano IV en 1264, teniendo como finalidad proclamar la fe en la presencia real de Jesucristo en la

Eucaristía. Presencia permanente y substancial más allá de la celebración de la Misa y que es digna de ser adorada en la exposición solemne y en las procesiones con el Santísimo Sacramento que entonces comenzaron a celebrarse y que han llegado a ser verdaderos monumentos de la piedad católica.

Si Jesucristo en la cruz nos salvó, al instituir la Eucaristía la víspera de su muerte, quiso en ella dejarnos un vivo recuerdo de la Pasión. El altar viene siendo como la prolongación del Calvario, y la misa anuncia la muerte del Señor. Porque en efecto, allí está Jesús como una víctima, pues las palabras de la doble consagración nos dicen que primero se convierte el pan en Cuerpo de Cristo, y luego el vino en Su Sangre, de manera que, ofrece a su Padre, en unión con sus sacerdotes, la sangre vertida y el cuerpo clavado en la Cruz.

Como Cristo al ser hecho Hijo que recibió la vida eterna del Padre, los cristianos participan de Su eterna vida uniéndose a Jesús en el Sacramento, que es el símbolo más sublime, real y concreto de la unidad con la Víctima del Calvario.

Veamos en la Santa Misa el centro de todo culto de la Iglesia a la Eucaristía, y en la Comunión el medio establecido por Jesús mismo, para que con mayor plenitud participemos de ese divino Sacrificio; y así, nuestra devoción al Cuerpo y Sangre del Salvador nos alcanzará los frutos perennes de su Redención.





FAMILY CONNECTION.

In our age of fast food and eating on the go, families often find that they are not eating meals together at a dinner table. As a family, look back over the past week and recall how many meals were eaten together and how many meals were eaten alone or on the run.

In the Bible, meals are seen as much more than a means to satisfy a physical need. The Hebrew people viewed eating a meal as a way of expressing and strengthening their relationship to one another under God's covenant. It is no coincidence that meals are often the setting of Jesus' teaching and miracles in the Gospels. In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear the story of Jesus feeding the crowd of 5,000 people.

Read this Sunday's Gospel, Luke 9:11b-17. Talk about the kinds of hungers that people have in addition to physical hunger. Describe the hungers that a family nourishes (love, compassion, forgiveness, laughter, and so on). Together give thanks for the food that Jesus gives us that we celebrate on this Sunday's feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus. Make a commitment to share in this Eucharistic meal together as a family.



Today, the second Sunday after Pentecost, we celebrate a second solemnity, which marks our return to Ordinary Time. Today is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. At one time, this day was called Corpus Christi, Latin for "the Body of Christ." In the most recent revision of the liturgy, the name for this day is expanded to be a more

complete reflection of our Eucharistic theology.

The feeding of the 5,000 is the only one of Jesus' miracles to appear in all four Gospels. Luke places it between Herod's question, "Who is this about whom I hear such things?" and Peter's response to Jesus' question about who he thought Jesus was: "You are the Messiah of God." In Luke the feeding is not the result of Jesus' compassion for the crowd but is instigated by the disciples. They wanted Jesus to send the crowd away to town. Instead Jesus tells the disciples to give them some food on their own.

The passage is meant to remind us of two feedings in the Old Testament: the feeding of the Israelites in the desert and Elisha's feeding of 100 people with 20 loaves in 2 Kings 4:42-44. It is also connected to the institution of the Eucharist. As in the Last Supper accounts in Matthew, Mark, and Luke and in Paul's account in 1 Corinthians 11:23-24, Jesus takes bread, looks up to heaven, blesses the bread, breaks it, and then gives it to the disciples. In using this exact language, Luke is reminding his readers that in this miracle Jesus is doing more than feeding hungry people as God did for the Israelites and the prophet Elisha did as well. The bread he gives is his body, which he will continue to give as often as the community breaks bread in remembrance of him in the Eucharist.


