

A WORD FROM FR. SWAMY



Today is the Good Shepherd Sunday and Vocation Sunday and the word of God presents us with two images, the Children of God and the Good Shepherd. In today's gospel passage, Jesus emphasizes the sacrifice of his own self and his life itself indicating that he is the good shepherd who lays down his life for his sheep. The scriptures tell us of the extraordinary love of God for us has taken in Jesus in the form of a good shepherd. The image of the Good Shepherd was perhaps the favorite early Christian image of our Savior and has a long tradition in the history of God's people. It is one that would be immediately understood by the people of the time. We have the popular pictures of Jesus the Good Shepherd carrying

a sheep over his shoulders, or we have a smiling Jesus sitting under a tree with a little lamb on his lap. This image of the shepherd appeals to us because it shows the tenderness of Jesus and his compassion. A shepherd, in general, did not walk behind the flock beating them with a stick to keep them moving. He walked in front of them, seeking out a safe path to food and water and shelter, and the sheep gently followed him because they recognized his voice, and they trusted him. Jesus tells us that is the kind of Good Shepherd he is. He leads, and we follow.

As we observe Mothers' Day today, I wish all the mothers a Happy Mothers' Day. Thank you so much for all the sacrifices you make and for your love, care, and concern you show to your families. May the Lord bless you all with a good and happy life.

SAINT OF THE WEEK-EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH

St. Damien de Veuster of Moloka'I | May 10

People may be familiar with leprosy from Biblical times, but not so much in the 1800s. However, St. Damien de Veuster of Moloka'l' (January 3, 1840-April 15, 1889) would eventually shed a light on the effects of this devastating disease and allow people to see those afflicted with it with more compassion and love.

Born Joseph de Veuster in Tremelo, Belgium, he quit school at 13 so he could work on the family farm. Feeling called for more, however, he entered the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary six years later, where he took the name of a fourth-century physician and martyr. His brother, a priest from the same congregation, fell ill and was unable to go to his assigned location. Damien quickly volunteered in his place and found himself on the Hawaiian Islands in 1864. Two months after arriving, he was ordained a priest of Honolulu and assigned to the Island of Hawaii.

In 1873, he visited the Hawaiian government's leper colony on the island of Moloka'I, where he petitioned to stay permanently to care for their physical, medical, and spiritual needs. After years of working to improve their location and those who lived there, he contracted Hansen's disease and died of its complications. St. Damien was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on October 11, 2009. ©LPi

Reluctant Sheep

Sheep get an awfully bad rap, linguistically. Some are quick to label people as "sheep" if we think they haven't sufficiently questioned authority or if they're too willing to go along with someone else's plan. We say someone has "the wool over their eyes" if they aren't willing to see what we think is very obvious. "A wolf in sheep's clothing" is what we call someone looking to take advantage of those too gullible to identify a real threat.

Taking all this into account and considering how often we are referred to as sheep in Scripture, you've really got to wonder if God trying to tell us something about ourselves.

If you look at the phraseology associated with sheep, it's no wonder that nobody wants to be one. Sheep are innocent. Sheep can't protect themselves. They're vulnerable and easily misled.

We want to see ourselves as the opposite of all that. We like to think we're shrewd, with plenty of common sense. We want to believe that we don't have to rely on anybody for anything. We would sooner identify with the wolf than with the sheep—at least the wolf can take care of himself.

We do this because we often resist the need to rest in the greatness of God. Like a child walking to school alone for the first time (forgetting his mom is following watchfully in the car), we want to think we can handle it all by ourselves.

The truth is that God is trying to tell us something by comparing us to sheep: You don't have to do this on your own.

Our youngest students hear the language and try to communicate at the most basic level. Activities include counting, singing, praying, playing games—all in Spanish. Señora Deml, the Spanish teacher, enjoys sharing her love for language, culture and travel with all ages.



Baccalaureate Mass

All graduating seniors are invited to our Baccalaureate Mass on June 12 at 10 am. You can wear your graduation gown but please do not wear your graduation cap. Please plan to sit in the front of the church with your families.

Library Media Specialist: The position includes maintaining and updating library materials that support student interest and the school curriculum, developing programs that encourage recreational reading, and providing whole group and small group instruction in grades PreK-8. Teaching license preferred but not required.

Music teacher: The position includes providing general music and choir instruction for grades PreK-8, developing student interest in the performing arts, preparing for five concerts per year, practicing music with students that will be sung at Mass, and accompanying the music at Mass. Teaching license preferred but not required.

Science teacher (6th-8th grade): The position includes providing science instruction for students in grade 6-8 as well as teaching 7th grade Health 2nd semester. Teaching license (or the ability to obtain one) is required.

Any applicant should possess a love of learning, be enthusiastic, have a focus on learning, possess good classroom management skills, be collaborative, have the ability to integrate technology into instruction, and believe that all children can learn. The applicant must support the school's mission and philosophy, and have the desire to support and help the children grow in mind, body, and spirit through Catholic values. 


