



A WORD FROM FR. SWAMY



The first reading today dramatizes a transition that is not fearful but even gracious. With complete trust, Elijah anoints Elisha as his successor, just as the Lord had asked. Elisha does not push aside the older prophet, but shows him reverence, "Then he set out and followed Elijah, and became his servant." The prophets' mutual respect is echoed in Galatians: "Through love become slaves to one another." Paul teaches today that the Christian's ability to serve is based on freedom. Discipleship requires a wholehearted commitment to the Lord and a generous spirit of service toward his people. The demands are severe. Jesus in today's gospel says, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for the kingdom of God."

The people of Jesus' time understood this agrarian imagery. The farmer has to keep his eyes fixed straight ahead; otherwise the neatly organized field required for planting would be turned into a chaotic nightmare at harvesting time. If we keep our eye on the present, then the fields of our lives will have the grace and order of newly plowed spring fields. Our lives will hold great promise for a rich harvest.

SAINT OF THE WEEK-EXAMPLES OF OUR FAITH

St. Oliver Plunkett | July 1

Saint Oliver Plunkett was the last Roman Catholic Martyr to die in England. He was canonized in 1975, the first new Irish saint in almost 700 years.

Oliver was born in Loughcrew, Oldcastle, County Meath in November 1625, the son of the Baron of Loughcrew. As a young man, he wanted to become a priest, but it was illegal to travel to the continent to enter seminary. Even so, he undertook the dangerous journey with four other young men and a Papal Envoy. They were pursued by English privateers, storms at sea, and robbers on land. However, Oliver entered Rome in 1647, and was admitted to the Irish College. He was an excellent student and was ordained on January 1, 1654. Oliver remained in Rome, studied law and served as chaplain at Spienza University, ministered at Santo Spirito hospital, and cared for the poor and ill. By 1657 he was a professor of Theology and later of Apologetics or Controversies at Propaganda College.

The 1650s were a difficult time in for Catholics in Ireland, the majority of population, as Cromwell passed many penal laws against them, and the practice of Catholicism was banned. During this time Oliver was appointed by Irish bishops to be their agent in Rome. Following the Restoration of Monarchy, Pope Clement IX appointed Oliver Archbishop of Armagh and Primate of all Ireland 1669. Oliver returned to a country where the Catholic Church was in disarray and divided. He had to travel largely incognito and perform his duties in makeshift locations. He is credited with unifying the Church and in traveling across the eleven dioceses under his purview, confirming thousands, and ordaining several priests.


In 1673 persecution of Catholics was again on the rise and bishops were banned. Oliver went into hiding, but in 1679 he was arrested and charged with treason. He was hanged, drawn, and quartered at Tyburn in July 1681. Before his death he publicly forgave those responsible. ©LPi

2022 Rules at Sacred Heart Cemetery

- -No Pets Allowed
- -All flowers, (real or artificial) must be kept in pots and placed in stands at least 15" above ground and placed to side of monument.
- -All items placed on ground will be removed after June 8 for ease of maintenance.
- -No solar lights, vigil lights, solar or battery powered, are permitted. They will be removed. No shepherd hooks, hoop, or lawn flag holders.
- -No in-ground plantings
- -No glass or wire allowed on grave sites.
- -The cemetery reserves the right to and will remove items that are faded, out of season, or deemed to be a hazard to visitors or maintenance workers. This includes rocks in pots.
- -Cemetery is open year-round for your convenience.






