

#### 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent

Again we have a beautiful gospel story of God's immense love for us – Jesus saves the woman brought before him who was caught in the act of adultery by a self-righteous mob who desire her death. In today's climate, this scene is acted out too often as the church and all around her is being politicized. Very dangerous! Where do we see this being acted out today? Well, if someone does not think or believe, or hold the same opinions, etc., the finger pointing ensues and the love of God, which we hear of in today's gospel, becomes non-existent. The result is a cult-like atmos-



phere devoid of the mercy of Jesus. These beautiful gospel stories during the Lenten season ought to spur us to be more Christ-like with ourselves and others.

As Catholic Christians, it is so easy to habitually go through the motions and do the bare minimum. If we do not keep our gaze upon the love of Jesus and practice that love ourselves, we have nothing! The finger pointing and bashing of sinners among other Catholic sinners is way too much these days. True, we need to confront sin but FIRST within ourselves. Though sin and the darkness that results will always be in and about us, we must always combat this with God's love for us through His Son. I will not hesitate to say that those who are doing the bashing these days – even some priests and bishops – are off the mark. They tend to condemn with so much vitriol. Jesus called this self-righteousness and, according to our savior and Lord, has no room in the Kingdom of God. With what remains of the Lenten season, may we all pay heed to the words we heard on the 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of this Lenten Season – "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him!!!"







#### LIVE THE LITURGY

#### Inspiration for the week

Mercy makes us attentive to the voice of truth. We do not know what ever happened to the woman caught in adultery, after her encounter with Jesus. It is hoped that she found what she needed to feel true sorrow. What we do know is that through his gentle and wise persuasiveness, Jesus puts the Pharisees in their place and opens the door to grace for this child of God. Being exploited and used to test and discredit Jesus, she who is publicly known to be a sinner is now the victim. Jesus never tolerates people being used and immediately rushes to her defense. As the author of mercy, Jesus became her advocate and opened the door for her to God's love. Jesus also stands between us and the harsh, judgmental, and often hurtful stance of our world. He invites us to grace, to leave the sin that binds us, and for which we are often criticized, and pursue a life of virtue and freedom.



#### SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Benedict the African (1524-1589), was born in San Fratello, Sicily to Cristoforo and Diana Manasseri, Africans who had been taken as slaves. Some accounts claim that because of his parents' loyal service that Benedict was given his freedom at birth, other sources say that his freedom was granted when he turned 18. At 21 Benedict joined a society of hermits living under the rule of St. Francis of Assisi. Eventually he succeeded his friend, Jerome Lanze, as their leader. When the Pope disbanded the independent hermit society, Benedict joined the Order of Friars Minor and he was sent to Palermo, to the Franciscan Friary of St. Mary of Jesus. There Benedict worked in the kitchens and despite being illiterate and a lay brother (not a priest), he also served as Master of Novices, and as Guardian of the Community. St. Benedict was known throughout his life as a brilliant cook under whose hands food seemed to multiply miraculously, a healer, and a spiritual leader with profound understanding. He is recognized as the patron saint of African Americans.




### Lenten Project 2022 MEAL ON US
