

Enrollment has now begun for the 2019-20 School Year!

Did you know...

- St. Pascal Baylon Catholic School K-8th grade students scored 70% above the National Average in Reading on the 2019 Winter NWEA testing. Students scored 63% above the National Average in Math.
- Students are creating Virtue books to be passed down to the grade below them on what that looks like in their grade. Each grade was assigned a Virtue for the year. This was one of the many activities for students during Catholic School Week.

Encountering the Compassionate God of the Bible with Art Zannoni

Thursday, March 14 from 7:00-9:00 PM in Brioschi Hall

The Bible reveals both a compassionate God and Jesus as the compassion of God. This program will explore the biblical roots of compassion in both the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament) and the Gospels. The presentation will be divided into two parts. The first part will explore the importance and meaning of the Hebrew and Greek terms for compassion followed examples of how God compassionately throughout the Hebrew Scriptures especially in the book of Exodus, the Psalms, and the book of Isaiah. In the second part, emphasis will be placed on Jesus who is presented in the Gospels as the compassion of God. Examples will be given of Jesus acting compassionately toward crowds, toward men and women, at meals, and in the parables that he tells. The presentation will conclude with a challenge to all faithful followers of Jesus to act compassionately toward everyone they encounter.

Lent 2019 Bible Study—Colossians and Philemon: New Life in Christ

In Colossians and Philemon, two short but important letters of Paul, the gospel message is applied to Christians' everyday problems.
