The Oblates work in the areas of pastoral care, education, social services, housing, medical assistance, the education of seminarians and serving those affected by the AIDS virus. Free Summer Meal Program for Children & Youth

Tuesday, June 11 - Friday, August 23

Saint Paul Public Schools (SPPS) will provide free meals to children 18 years old and younger through its Summer Food Service Program. The program is also available to those who are 19 years old and older and have a mental or physical disability or who participate in a public or private nonprofit school program for the mentally or physically disabled.

Meals will be available at locations throughout the city including SPPS schools, community centers and organizations. Meals include breakfast, lunch, supper or a snack, depending on the site's hours of operation. Hospital Ministry/Visitation

Hospitals are essential, hopeful, and helpful. They may also be a scary, painful, lonely, or sad environment. Whenever you or someone you love is in the hospital, your church community can offer meaningful support. St. Pascal Baylon has trained ministers who bring the hope and prayer of the community and a confidential listening ear to our parishioners. Eucharistic Ministers may visit and bring communion; our priests visit and offer the sacraments of healing and reconciliation. When you or a member of your family is admitted to a hospital, please, let the hospital staff know that you are a member of St. Pascal Baylon in East St. Paul. All area hospitals have chaplains who are available. If you would like to be visited, please let the hospital staff know and someone from chaplaincy will bring you Eucharist. They will also call the parish office if, during the admitting process, you answer the question, "Do you have a religious preference?" with a "Yes, Catholic, St. Pascal Baylon." Then someone from our parish will also visit you. In an emergency, please ask the hospital staff to call the hospital chaplain or a Catholic Priest.
