FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Would you like to bury your loved one's cremated remains? On October 24, there is an opportunity for those who have cremated remains at home to have the remains interred in a communal crypt at the Resurrection Cemetery chapel mausoleum in Mendota Heights. The Catholic Cemeteries have begun a program called *Bringing Them Home*, and for \$200.00, families will:

- a) have a permanent resting place in which the cremated remains of their loved one will be secure;
- b) have a place that provides peace of mind for the family knowing that their loved one will be perpetually cared for;
- c) know that by interring the cremated remains, it affirms the worth of the individual by providing a final resting place;
- d) have a formal record of burial at the cemetery and the name of the deceased on display in a Book of Remembrance in the Chapel Mausoleum.

The following are required:

1. The cremated remains need to be at least five years old unless the person has died of COVID-19 in the last year.
2. The full name of the deceased person and the date of death need to be provided.
3. The legal name of the next of kin is required so they can authorize the burial of the deceased.
4. A copy of the cremation certificate needs to be provided.
5. Once the cremated remains are interred in the communal crypt, they will be unable to be disinterred.
6. You need to make an appointment with the Catholic Cemeteries to walk through the process, complete the necessary paperwork, and learn about memorialization options. Please call Sister Fran Donnelly at 651-255-9537 to arrange an appointment, for more information or if you have questions.
7. The deceased person does not need to be Catholic to be interred at the Catholic Cemeteries.
8. After completing the paperwork, the cremated remains must be dropped off at the Resurrection Cemetery Office no later than October 2.

Archbishop Hebda will lead a committal service on October 24 in the Chapel Mausoleum at Resurrection Cemetery. Because of Covid-19, the prayer service is not open to the public, but it will be available on the Catholic Cemeteries website at www.catholic-cemeteries.org. With this ministry, the Catholic Cemeteries are trying to accompany people through the grieving process and providing a place where family and friends can come and memorialize their loved one.

40 Days for Life, September 23 – November 1, is a nationwide pro-life movement dedicated to praying for the end of abortion. Here in St. Paul, people will come to keep a silent, peaceful prayerful vigil from 6:00 a.m.-6:00 p.m. in front of Planned Parenthood, 671 Vandalia Street, Saint Paul. Faith Formation Updates

Wednesday Faith Formation: For children in grades 1-8, we will be starting the faith formation year with at-home learning and doing that through at least the end of December. Families will be given access to digital materials, as well as hard copies if they would prefer an actual book. Fr. John and I also plan to do Zoom sessions or email videos on occasion to provide additional content and support, with the possibility of smaller family groups occasionally coming on site.

First Reconciliation Preparation: First Reconciliation preparation sessions will take place in person, with a Zoom option for families who are not comfortable coming in person. Those who have registered for First Reconciliation will receive more details in the coming week.

Confirmation Preparation: As our 10th grade families in Confirmation II know, sessions this fall and winter will be taking place in person. Confirmation I will begin in January 2021, with registration taking place this November.

Adult Faith Formation: At this time, it is anticipated that any offerings will take place online. For the fall, parishioners are invited to participate in the Archdiocesan Synod virtual series "Praying with Scripture" and "Healing and Hope." More information is available at archspm.org/synod.

Know that we will continue to carefully monitor guidance from the Archdiocese and the Minnesota Department of Health as we navigate the coming months. Please feel free to contact me in the parish office with any questions.

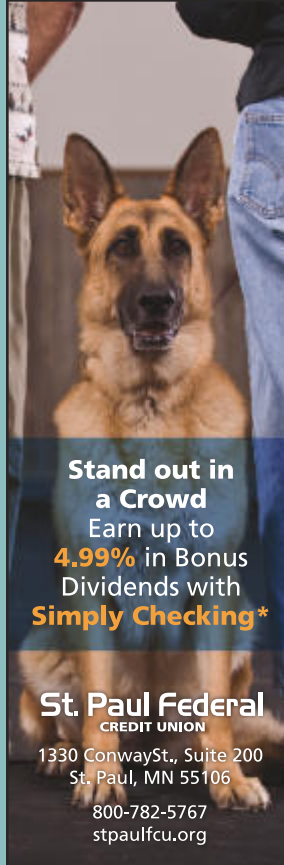
