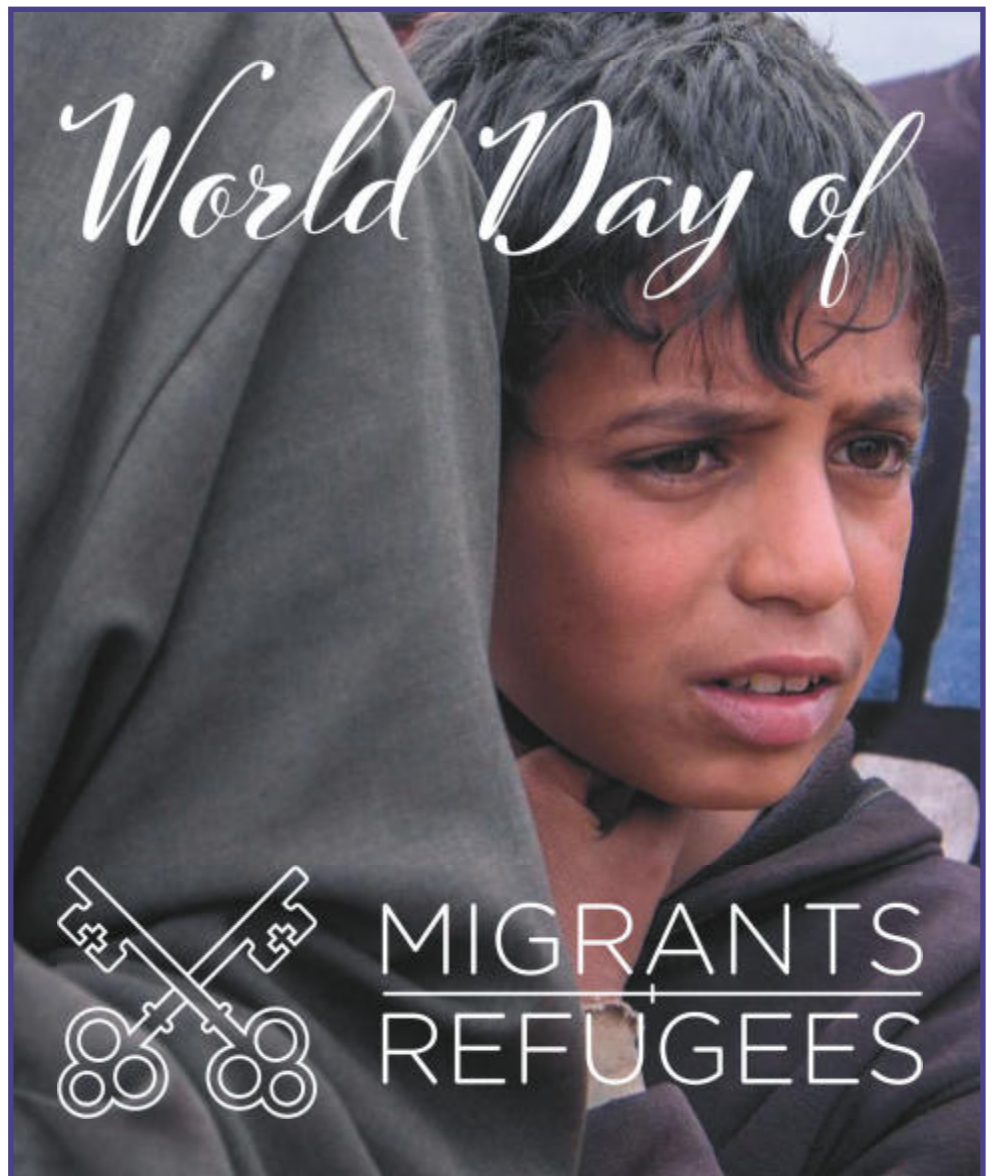

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

You are invited to a **Blessing of the Animals Sunday, October 4 at 12 noon in the parking lot near Church Door 3 (Flandrau Street entrance)**. Bring your dog, cat, bird or other pet animal for the blessing. This blessing is in honor of St. Francis of Assisi whose feast day is October 4. St. Francis is the patron saint of animals, ecology and merchants.

Immigration Sunday Minnesota—September 27, 2020—in conjunction with World Day of Migrants and Refugees. Since 2009, the Catholic Bishops of Minnesota have designated the Feast of Our Lord's Epiphany to mark Immigration Sunday Minnesota. This year, the Catholic Bishops of Minnesota have moved this day to Sunday, September 27 to join with Catholics around the globe to mark World Day of Migrants and Refugees. This year's theme is "Forced to flee like Christ". Immigration Sunday is an important moment for Minnesota Catholics to show their commitment to welcoming migrants and refugees in our communities through our prayers, education and actions. By accompanying them in person and in prayer, we help them integrate into our communities and show them we see and welcome Christ in them.

Pope Francis and the Vatican published a list of Twenty Points (source: justiceforimmigrants.org) that can help guide Catholics to engage with migrants who live in their communities or whom they might meet along the way. The Twenty Points are structured around a set of four verbs:

1. **WELCOME.** Governments should expand the legal avenues that would allow migrants to enter a country legally and start a new life. Governments should emphasize family reunification and expanding the number of visas available for this purpose. Countries should adopt refugee resettlement policies. While national security considerations should be taken seriously, such considerations should always emphasize the rights of migrants in this process. The Catholic Bishops in the United States have long supported refugee resettlement and temporary protected status for migrants that would otherwise face a dangerous return home.
2. **INTEGRATE.** Integration should not be confused with assimilation, where migrants lose their cultural heritage completely, but understood as a process in which an individual's cultural heritage can help to enrich the daily life of their host country which in time can also become their home country. The host community, while making the effort to teach migrants what it means to be part of a new country, should also make an effort to understand and appreciate the cultural richness that migrants bring with them.
3. **PROTECT.** It is important that countries of transit and arrival put into place policies that will help to prevent human trafficking and other forms of exploitation; unaccompanied migrant children who are separated from their families should not be placed in detention but in temporary custody or foster homes that provide for their needs. It is important that governments work together to ensure that nobody becomes stateless but that everyone has the opportunity to become citizens of a country.
4. **PROMOTE.** Host countries should enact internship and apprenticeship programs for qualified migrants. Governments should institute practices that will promote and preserve the integrity of the family. This should include policies that promote family reunification.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults




