

A FAREWELL NOTE FROM FATHER WRATKOWSKI

One of my favorite sayings of Saint John Henry Cardinal Newman (1801-1890), an Anglican convert to the Catholic faith, goes like this: "Time is short, eternity long." As is the case for every person, a priest's life is full of meetings and partings. At times like this, I find myself pondering the quotation from Newman, thinking about how fast the last three years have gone. My heart is full of gratitude for this assignment, as I have discovered this parish to be a place where the Lord is loved, the Sacraments are appreciated, and the priests are esteemed.

I can say that my experience at Saint Joseph reflects the experience of the seventy disciples sent out by Jesus in the tenth chapter of Luke's Gospel, which is also the passage proclaimed in the rite of blessing of a home by a priest:

After this the Lord appointed seventy others, and sent them on ahead of him, two by two, into every town and place where he himself was about to come. And he said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; pray therefore the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest. Go your way; behold, I send you out as lambs in the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and salute no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace be to this house!' And if a son of peace is there, your peace shall rest upon him; but if not, it shall return to you. And remain in the same house, eating and drinking what they provide, for the laborer deserves his wages; do not go from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and they receive you, eat what is set before you; heal the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you.'"

What we notice first is that the harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few. The work has indeed been abundant here! Let us persevere in our prayer that the Lord gives those he calls the ears to hear and the grace to respond to his invitation. I am grateful that Fr. Bruno, one of those who have responded "yes" to the Lord, is returning here where he was our teaching parish seminarian. When speaking with him the last couple weeks, you can see the excitement in his eyes, which reflects the love he already has for this parish and school community.


A second way I have experienced the passage from Luke is your welcome of me, the priest sent by the Lord through the Archbishop. It is no small thing to welcome another new priest, to spend time getting to know him, and to invite him over to your homes for a meal. I am grateful to have benefited from your kindness in this regard, and I greatly appreciate your friendship.

Third, we notice in Luke's passage that the Lord sends out the disciples two by two. At Saint Joseph, I am so grateful for the gift of being sent "two by two" with the pastor, Fr. Creagan. Never have I seen such generous service and selflessness on a daily basis! Our sharing of parish ministry and the fraternity of daily life will be missed, but I look forward to the ways our friendship will grow even while physically apart. Likewise, I would also like to extend a word of appreciation for the staff at St. Joseph Parish and School, for all the hard work, the camaraderie, and the memories of serving the Lord together.

Leaving, of course, brings sadness, yet it also provides the occasion for rooting ourselves deeper in the Lord and the graces he offers through the present circumstances. When a priest is given a new assignment, the Lord provides an opportunity of spiritual pruning so that we might bear greater and more abundant fruit. Such an occasion also reminds us that while the priest plays a special role in our faith, he is not the end goal. Rather, the priest is a bridge to the One High Priest, Jesus Christ. By keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, we have greater assurance of reaching our end goal, eternal union with him. In that timelessness, the time of our separation will seem only a blip compared to the length of eternity.

SUMMER CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS ON SEMINOLE

The west side of the church will incur some fairly significant restoration efforts early this summer. As some of you may have noticed, the City of West St. Paul did some modest asphalt repair on Seminole, to which we are grateful, as their resources are limited. On June 14, the St. Paul Regional Water Services will begin the process of replacing the water main along Seminole from Orme to Butler. There will be temporary water lines running along Seminole and some excavation over the course of three weeks; they are scheduled to finish by July 2. Immediately following this project, we are finally going to proceed with an effort to replace some of our unsafe walkways and boulevards – in addition to the west parking lot, a priority of our Generations of Faith Campaign. This work is significant and is scheduled to be completed by July 16. We will continue to update you as these projects unfold and any impact on accessibility throughout. In advance, we extend our thanks for your patience and understanding.

When Moses came to the people and related all the words and ordinances of the LORD, they all answered with one voice, "We will do everything that the LORD has told us." On the first day of the Feast of Unleavened Bread, when they sacrificed the Passover lamb, Jesus' disciples said to him, "Where do you want us to go and prepare for you to eat the Passover?" He sent two of his disciples and said to them, "Go into the city and a man will meet you, carrying a jar of water. Follow him. Wherever he enters, say to the master of the house, 'The Teacher says, "Where is my guest room where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?"' Then he will show you a large upper room furnished and ready. Make the preparations for us there." The disciples then went off, entered the city, and found it just as he had told them; and they prepared the Passover.
