Before I Forget

Merry Christmas

What can I say about Christmas that you haven't already heard? Nothing really. So let me tell you a story and end with a poem.

The story is about Mother Teresa when she was visiting Melbourne, Australia. She visited an old man whom nobody seemed to know existed. He lived in one small room which was very dirty and totally disorganized. The window was closed and the curtains were drawn. The man lived in perpetual

darkness. There were cobwebs everywhere and the floor was dirty and dust covered the little pieces of furniture that he had around. After talking to him for a while she started to clean up the place a little bit and to put some order in the place. At first the man protested and asked Mother Teresa to leave everything as it is because it was quite okay for him.

Yet she persisted and the man ceased protesting. While she continued cleaning, Mother Teresa found an oil lamp full of dust and wrapped in dirty rags. She realized that with a bit of clean up this old lamp could be restored and provide quite a bit of light. As she was cleaning it, she asked the man, "How come you never light the lamp?" "Why should I light it?" he replied. "I don't need it for myself. I have become used to living in the darkness and, besides all that, nobody ever comes to see me." After a few moments, Mother Teresa asked the man if he would be prepared to light the lamp if one of the Sisters came to see him on a regular basis. He consented to do this. One of Mother Teresa's nuns started to visit the old man, and his life started to take on new meaning. He became more positive in his attitude. He became more talkative. He smiled often. His room became cleaner and things were put in the right place and most of all, the lamp was lit. All this occurred because someone took the time to visit him and patiently walk with him.

One day, he said to the sister, "I think I am okay now. You do not need to come and visit me with such regularity. From now on I think that I will be able to manage on my own. However, I ask you to do me a favor. Can you please tell the sister, who first came to visit me, that the light she lit in my life is still burning. Tell her that the oil lamp is still being lit."

And finally the poem. It's called "The Work of Christmas."

When the song of the angels is stilled,
When the star in the sky is gone,
When the kings and princes are home,
When the shepherds are back with their flock,
The work of Christmas begins:
To find the lost,
To heal the broken,
To feed the hungry,
To release the prisoner,
To rebuild the nations,

WE HAVE A NEW AUXILIARY BISHOP!

Pope Francis named Father Joseph Williams, a priest of this Archdiocese as Auxiliary Bishop for Saint Paul and Minneapolis. Bishop-elect Williams is currently the pastor of the church of Saint Stephen and the Church of the Holy Ro-



sary, both in Minneapolis. He also serves as Vicar for Latino Ministry for the Archdiocese.

He is a native of Stillwater, studied at the University of Minnesota Morris, The Franciscan University of Steubenville and then the St. Paul Seminary. He was ordained in 1998.

Archbishop Hebda said in his announcement of Bishop-elect Williams, "...Having been inspired by his leadership at St. Stephen and Holy Rosary, his heart for the poor and those on the periphery, his evangelical zeal, and his leadership as Vicar of Latino Ministry, I am delighted by the appointment and am confident that the Archdiocese will benefit greatly from his example, discernment and leadership. 


Social Justice
