

A MESSAGE FROM FR. JOHN

One of my favorite Advent songs has always been “Prepare Ye” from the Off-Broadway musical “Godspell.” The words are very simple, “prepare ye the way of the Lord.” In the movie version as these words are repeated, the cast jumps into a water fountain singing these words as the character representing John the Baptist douses them with water. While most of the characters jump in freely, one woman stands on the edge of the fountain hesitant to jump in. Only when John the Baptist goes over to her and takes her into his arms does she allow herself to be lowered into the water. The hesitation on the part of this one character catches my attention when I watch the scene.

I wonder how many of us she represents with her hesitation? We are willing to come to the waters for baptism, but are we willing to be immersed fully in the water of our faith? Most of us were baptized as infants. When infants are baptized, usually a small amount of water is poured over the top of the child’s head. When we baptize older kids or adults at the Easter Vigil, they are fully immersed in the baptismal water. I can’t help but wonder at times whether this represents how we live our faith: a little baptismal water and a little faith.

In both of these firsts we hear the words “prepare the way of the Lord.” In the Gospel, John the Baptist is preparing for many people to receive the Lord through a baptism for

the repentance of sin. The idea of repentance and forgiveness is as important today as it was in the day of John the Baptist. Advent is traditionally a time when many celebrate repentance and forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. As we get closer to Christmas, we will add extra times for individual celebrations of Reconciliation.

In addition, with the ongoing pandemic our Bishop and bishops throughout the United States have received permission to grant their priests permission to use what is typically called Rite III or General Absolution for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is so that more people can receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, knowing how important the forgiveness of sin is in our spiritual life. We will offer the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation using Rite III on Thursday, December 17, at 7:00 PM. However, this cannot be livestreamed, because absolution must be given in person. We will livestream a celebration of forgiveness, which though not sacramental, will give those at home the opportunity to reflect up the themes of repentance and forgiveness more thoroughly

With celebrating Rite III or General Absolution, it is important to remember the permission to utilize this Rite is temporary, only during the course of the pandemic. Individual confession of sins and individual absolution is still the normal form of the Sacrament. Any mortal sins forgiven while participating in Rite III of the Sacrament must be confessed and absolved at the next possible opportunity to celebrate Rite I or the ordinary form of the Sacrament.

One area of our lives where many of us may need repentance and forgiveness is within our families. The Knights of Columbus are sponsoring a program entitled “Consecration to the Holy Family”. The program begins by praying for your family (and this may be for many of us our extended family), acknowledging the gift and sacredness of the family unit, and accepting the truth salvation history was forever changed by a family. The Knights will make information available at church and online about consecrating your family to the Holy Family and a prayer of consecration.

There are many ways for us to prepare for the coming of the Lord. As we begin the season of Advent – reflecting, celebrating, and repenting – experiencing forgiveness sacramentally and within our families is a huge step to becoming fully immersed into our faith.

CARES ACT

In March 2020, Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, a \$2 trillion economic stimulus package legislated to battle the harmful effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. **One aspect of the legislation provides immediate relief for nonprofits.**

The legislation allows for a new deduction in your taxes. **For the current year, you can claim cash donations up to \$300 per taxpayer in annual charitable contributions.** This deduction is available only to people who take the standard deduction (for taxpayers who do not itemize their deductions). It is an “above the line” adjustment to income that will reduce a donor’s 2020 adjusted gross income (AGI), thereby reducing taxable income. You calculate it by subtracting the amount of the donation from your gross income. Note: a contribution to a donor-advised fund (DAF) does not qualify for this new deduction.

Also, as part of the bill, individuals and corporations that do itemize can deduct much higher amounts of their contributions. Individuals can elect to deduct cash donations up to 100% of their 2020 AGI (up from 60% previously). Corporations may deduct up to 25% of taxable income, up from the previous limit of 10%. The old deduction rules still apply to contributions to private foundations. The higher deduction does not apply to donations directed to a DAF.

2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

People knew over a year in advance that the Pope was coming for a visit to America and the preparations began. Security, space limitations and requirements, protocols, crowd management, itineraries, invitations, regulations, and so much more was necessary to pull this event off effectively. It's not every day that we get a visit from such a prominent dignitary. Thought, effort, meticulous attention to detail and vision all are necessary to make this thing work. After all, he can't just show up in the ordinary and normal daily routines of life and catch people unprepared! Tickets have to be purchased, buses rented, hotel rooms reserved, and travel arrangements made early because it will be impossible to see him if we wait too long!

We do this kind of preparing not only for prominent religious figures but for political dignitaries, notable sports figures, people of fame, and even actors. If an individual intrigues us, we are going to want to do all we have to do to get a "good seat" in the house. Does Jesus Christ captivate this much of our attention? We are asked to prepare the way of the Lord and to do so not with frantic frenzy but patient enthusiasm. We do not have to stand on a street corner making profound announcements about God's coming or become overly zealous in our embrace of the Good News. Our task is quieter, more interior, captivating, and consuming. We are asked to change. We have to conduct our lives with holy devotion.

Is the cost of that ticket too much for you? Don't you want the "best seat" in the house? You don't want to miss Our Lord's arrival when he comes, do you? After all, if he comes while you are going about your daily routines without you even knowing, he may catch you off guard. Or, he may come in disguise looking like a beggar, a prisoner, migrant, refugee, or someone who is lost. Would you be ready to recognize him then? Preparing for the coming of Christ requires a change of mind, heart, and behavior. It is not adequate to simply do the things we always do. We want our lives to speak of the exciting news of Christ's coming and the joy that the Gospel brings. It has to do with our demeanor, values, priorities, choices, and how we structure daily routines. Of course, it involves sacrifice. All anticipations do! Are you excited, captivated, enthusiastic, and sitting on the edge of your seat eager to celebrate his coming among us at Christmas, and waiting for him to come again? If not, why not?
