**A MESSAGE FROM FR. JOHN**

With the ongoing pandemic our Bishop and bishops throughout the United States have received permission to grant their priests permission to use what is typically called Rite III or General Absolution for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. This is so that more people can receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, knowing how important the forgiveness of sin is in our spiritual life. We will offer the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation using Rite III on Thursday, December 17, at 7:00 PM. However, this cannot be livestreamed, because absolution must be given in person. We will livestream a celebration of forgiveness, which though not sacramental, will give those at home the opportunity to reflect upon the themes of repentance and forgiveness more thoroughly.

When celebrating Rite III or General Absolution, it is important to remember the permission to utilize this Rite is temporary, only during the course of the pandemic. Individual confession of sins and individual absolution is still the normal form of the Sacrament. Any mortal sins forgiven while participating in Rite III of the Sacrament must be confessed and absolved at the next possible opportunity to celebrate Rite I or the ordinary form of the Sacrament.

December 12 is the feast in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe. We have been using a prayer calling upon Mary under this title since the beginning of the pandemic. It is a prayer I have come to appreciate greatly. Within the prayer we lift up to Mary the intentions of so many different groups of people.

This feast goes back to the 16th century when a poor Indian named Cuauhtlatoahuac was baptized and given the name Juan Diego. He was a 57-year-old widower, and lived in a small village near Mexico City. On Saturday morning December 9, 1531, he was on his way to a nearby barrio to attend Mass in honor of Our Lady. Juan was walking by a hill called Tepeyac when he heard beautiful music like the warbling of birds. A radiant cloud appeared, and within it stood an Indian maiden dressed like an Aztec princess. The lady spoke to him in his own language and sent him to the bishop of Mexico, a Franciscan named Juan de Zumarraga. The bishop was to build a chapel in the place where the lady appeared.

Eventually the bishop told Juan to have the lady give him a sign. About this same time Juan's uncle became seriously ill. This led poor Juan to try to avoid the lady. Nevertheless the lady found Juan, assured him that his uncle would recover, and provided roses for Juan to carry to the bishop in his cape or tilma. On December 12, when Juan Diego opened his tilma in the bishop's presence, the roses fell to the ground, and the bishop sank to his knees. On the tilma where the roses had been appeared an image of Mary exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac.

Mary's appearance to Juan Diego as one of his people is a powerful reminder that Mary – and the God who sent her – lives among all peoples. Mary under this title is particularly important for the people of our Sister Parish of San Jose in Guatemala. The people there have a deep devotion to Mary under the title "Our Lady of Guadalupe". Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us.





CARES ACT

In March 2020, Congress passed the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, a \$2 trillion economic stimulus package legislated to battle the harmful effects of the COVID-19 pandemic. **One aspect of the legislation provides immediate relief for nonprofits.**

The legislation allows for a new deduction in your taxes. **For the current year, you can claim cash donations up to \$300 per taxpayer in annual charitable contributions.** This deduction is available only to people who take the standard deduction (for taxpayers who do not itemize their deductions). It is an “above the line” adjustment to income that will reduce a donor’s 2020 adjusted gross income (AGI), thereby reducing taxable income. You calculate it by subtracting the amount of the donation from your gross income. Note: a contribution to a donor-advised fund (DAF) does not qualify for this new deduction.

Also, as part of the bill, individuals and corporations that do itemize can deduct much higher amounts of their contributions. Individuals can elect to deduct cash donations up to 100% of their 2020 AGI (up from 60% previously). Corporations may deduct up to 25% of taxable income, up from the previous limit of 10%. The old deduction rules still apply to contributions to private foundations. The higher deduction does not apply to donations directed to a DAF.





3RD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Did you ever stop and realize that there is no earthly gain that can ever really satisfy us? Think of winning the Lotto. On this side of the winning ticket, it's all about the money, the new car, house, vacations, bank accounts, and infinite pleasures. The possibility of acquiring all of these earthly securities brings us back again and again to the purchase of a ticket. Then, one day we win! Our dreams are fulfilled, and happiness is on the horizon. Then one day, we wake up and realize that nothing has really changed, and I am not as satisfied as I thought I was or would be. I find myself living in my incompleteness and with my profound sorrow and grief. I did not find joy.

Glimpses of joy are possible but not by material means. They are brought to us through incredible experiences of connection that bring us face to face with real and authentic faith, hope, and love. And, they are glimpses and do not last. The moment we find ourselves looking back at them, they are gone, and we find ourselves remembering the moment in memory. To carry joy within us is to realize that it is not something I create, manufacture or even acquire. It is not able to be purchased. It is a gift. My need for joy mirrors my need for eternity, for a Creator who has a claim on the very essence of who I am and desires a home within me. As C. S. Lewis discovered, joy is a surprise that speaks to my very soul and is given as gift by the God who loves me.

The beauty of Advent is found in discovering the beauty of the gift of joy. God has visited his people for no other reason than to show them where and how to find joy! All of our human and earthly joy experiences are always only glimpses. They never satisfy us, sustain us or fulfill us. It is only God who is the joy of my soul. Real, Divine experiences of joy catch us off guard, make us stop and become aware, bring a feeling of awe and rightness and have an eternal Otherness about them. Nothing created by humans can ever come close to this. We probably will not fully realize the truth of all of this until we actually meet God face to face in heaven one day. Then, in that sacred moment when our hearts leap for joy we will understand what we have been tirelessly searching for all along. Intense gratitude will most surely follow.




