A MESSAGE FROM FR. JOHN

Magi from the east traveled first to Jerusalem and then on to Bethlehem. How long did the trip take? By caravan this trek would have probably taken 50 to 60 days. Once in Jerusalem, depending on how long they stayed there, the trip to Bethlehem would then have taken about 2 hours – all in all, a considerable investment of time. Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta prayed three hours each day. That equates to 90 hours per month and 1095 hours per year. Each year she spent 45.625 days in prayer, or about a month and a half.

It is easy to say “but it was nice they had the time, the opportunity, and could do it – but I am too busy”. At some point “being busy” has become a virtue. It is not about the

time. It is that they were able to detach themselves from what they were attached to. The magi detached themselves from family and friends, work and obligations, comforts and security when they traveled to Jerusalem and Bethlehem. Mother Teresa detached herself from pressing needs, requests for a visit, and the Sisters of her community to be with Jesus when praying for three hours each day.

Earlier in life she had, at the age of 18, detached herself from her family when she left home in Albania to join the Loretta Sisters, an Irish community. She detached herself from worldly pursuits when she made vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. She would once more experience detachment when she left the Loretta Sisters and ministry of teaching to found the new community of Missionaries of Charity and live among the poorest of the poor in Calcutta, India. But with each detachment she entered a new life, and a new dream became a reality. On page seven of the book Do Something Beautiful for God: The Essential Teachings of Mother Teresa (that we handed out this Christmas), we are told Mother Teresa sat down with God in the classroom of silence and said, “How can I help?” The question is then asked of us, “When was the last time you stepped into the classroom of silence, sat down with your God, and asked, “How can I help?”

Only by detaching ourselves from things we are attached to can we find this classroom of silence and ask this question. It is only by detaching that we will hear the answer to our question. The answer may or may not be to live simply as Mother Teresa and her Sisters live(d). No doubt, though, the answer will be similar to what she heard: to love. As we read in the book, *“Her love for people was tangible. You could see it. You could feel it. You could reach out and touch it.”* We are then given a quote by her, *“I believe in person-to-person contact. Every person is Christ for me, and since there is only one Jesus, the person I am meeting is the one person in the world at that moment.”*

Detachment allows for such intimacy. If you spend a few moments with Mother Teresa today you will hear her tell you, *“Spread love everywhere you go. Let no one ever come to you without leaving happier.”* This message carries over to Monday, January 3, when if you have breakfast with a Saint you will hear her say, *“There are no great things, only small things with great love. But those small things done with great love become the source of great joy. I don't do great things. I do small things with great love.”*

To hear about detaching ourselves from what we are attached to can be intimidating. But what is detachment? It is holding space open to do acts of love. That is really all the magi did. They held a space open so they could love the new born king. Mother Teresa held space open so she could love Jesus and the poorest of the poor. Hold space open in your own life to love. Protect it fearlessly and know you are bringing gifts. Small gifts, but with great love.

As a group, we prayed over the baskets and prayed for each individual recipient by name. Then our volunteers cheerfully delivered them with Christmas greetings from our parish family. 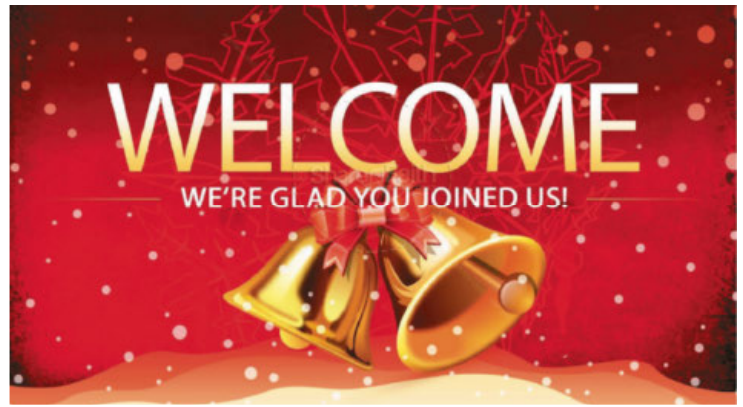

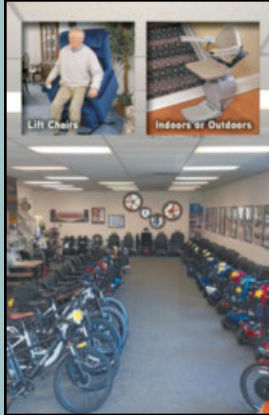

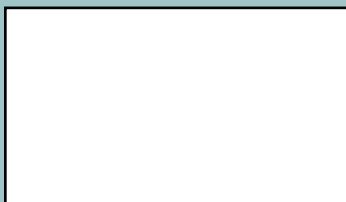
