



A Message From Fr. John

As I sit down to write this week I feel unsure what to write about. There are certainly many things I could address, but I seem to have a bit of a block. Maybe it is just a little burnout coming off our homily series titled "Breakfast with a Saint" and having had to compose a few additional homilies for funerals the last two weeks. I know there are many serious issues I could address, but admittedly am just not feeling this week like putting in the energy to do the research necessary or put in the effort needed to compose an article that requires careful thought and reflection. So I am going to offer a few updates and mostly likely let it go at that.

If you have been in church recently hopefully you noticed the flooring work that was done in the choir area, where we recently removed the carpeting. The concrete was then polished and stained similar to the sanctuary, but the color is slightly different to designate these two different areas. The hard surface will hopefully improve the acoustics for the musicians. This work is a part of our capital campaign project of re-carpeting the church. As long as they are able to get the new carpet in, they should begin work by the end of February or beginning of March.

This week were able to pick up a few new pieces (at least new for us) of office furniture. One of our parishioner's place of employment was moving to a new location and were giving away a great deal of office furniture that is in like-new condition. With companies shifting to employees working from home, some are downsizing their offices. If you find your company doing this and they are giving away furniture, we would like to know. Sometimes we can make use of what others are giving away.

If you spend any time in our chapel for Eucharistic Adoration, you likely noticed before Christmas that we got a new monstrance. A monstrance is an open or transparent receptacle in which the consecrated Host is exposed for veneration. It comes from the Latin word "to show." Actually, it is not new, we are borrowing it from the Carmelite Sisters here in Hudson. We have sent our monstrance away to be refinished. I am excited to see what it will look like when we get it back in about five or six weeks. When the tabernacle came back from being refinished, I couldn't believe it was ours – it looks amazing. The Carmelite Sisters also gave us a reliquary to use for displaying our First Class Relic of Blessed Father Solanus Casey, which is also being refinished. We didn't realize it was sterling until the company who does the refinishing picked it up. They are excited to work with it and believe it too will look incredible. (Perhaps the Carmelites may want it back then.:)

As I bring this week's column to a close, maybe the real problem is I need to make a new year's resolution not to wait until 7:45 PM the night before the bulletin article is due to write my column. The problem might not be "writer's block" but procrastination. I will get right on next week's column – right after I finish the other things I have put off.
