PROTOCOLS FOR LIMITED OPENING

Nativity of Mary is currently open on weekdays from 6:30am-4:30pm for private prayer, at 50% seating capacity, as well as for posted Confession, Adoration, and Mass Times. The main sanctuary may be closed for brief intervals after Mass or other gatherings for cleaning and disinfecting. The details of our "Phase II Reopening" are available on our website and posted prominently at the Church entrance. In accordance with MN Executive Order 20-81, face masks are required at all times while inside any building of the Nativity of Mary campus. Please see a staff member or usher if you need a mask when you arrive.

We have returned to our regular schedule of prayer and worship, except that the Word and Communion Service on Saturdays continues to be suspended, and Confessions on Saturday are at 2pm to allow adequate time for seating for the 4pm Mass. The weekly schedule is on the bottom of page 3. Please do not arrive for the 10:30am Mass on Sundays before 10am for sanitizing purposes. Confessions remain in the Cry Room to allow for adequate social distancing. The Cry Room is otherwise closed during Masses. For outdoor or carside Confession, appointments can be made by calling the parish office.

In addition, the 4pm Mass on Saturday is livestreamed on our YouTube page and saved for viewing anytime. The FM transmitter (FM 106.7) is also on for all Masses for those who wish to listen to the Mass from their car in the parking lot. Parking lot attendees may enter for Holy Communion at the conclusion of the Mass to receive Holy Communion. Additionally, Holy Communion is distributed in the South Parking Lot on Sundays from 9:30am until 10am at Door 9.

*An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists anywhere people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, senior citizens and people with underlying medical conditions are especially vulnerable. A Note from our Pastor

Dwelling in Nazareth

During this feast of the Holy Family, I wanted to put before your eyes some words from my favorite saint (well in this case Blessed), Bl. Charles De Foucauld. Bl. Charles spent the entirety of his converted life trying to find a place to live, where he could replicate Christ's hidden life in Nazareth. What Bl. Charles discovered, in moving from monastery to monastery, was that the more that he meditated on those 30 hidden years of Jesus, the more that he discovered the beating heart of Christ.

Throughout his life as a monk, Bl. Charles would take long hours of prayer, meditating on the mysteries of Christ. In his later years he would actually start writing down these meditations in great detail. I would like to share one of these excerpts from his reflection on the hidden life of Christ this weekend, as we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family. Just a note that Bl. Charles' writing style for his meditations was to write what he felt the Lord was telling him directly in first person. Thus, here is a meditation from his time prayer in 1897. It begins with the Lord telling Bl. Charles about his hidden years.

"After my presentation and my flight into Egypt, I withdrew to Nazareth. There I spent the years of my childhood and youth, till I was thirty years of age. Once again, it was for your sake I went there, for love of you. What was the meaning of that part of my life? I left it for your instruction. I instructed you continually for thirty years, not in words, but by my silence and example. What was it I was teaching you? I was teaching you primarily that it is possible to do good to men – great good, infinite good, divine good—without using words, without preaching, without fuss, but by silence and by giving them a good example. What kind of example? The example of devotion, of duty towards God lovingly fulfilled, and goodness towards all men, loving kindness to those around me and doing domestic duties in holiness. The example of poverty, lowliness, recollection, withdrawal: the obscurity of a life hidden in God, a life of prayer, penance and withdrawal, completely lost in God, buried deep in him. I was teaching you to live by the labor of your own hands, so as to be a burden on no one and to have something to give to the poor. And I was giving this way of life to you -- an incomparable beauty – the beauty of being a copy of mine.



"How clearly I preached humility at Nazareth, by spending thirty years in obscure labors and obscurity by remaining so completely unknown for thirty years – I who am the light of the world – and obedience, in that I, who am God, made myself subject for thirty years, to my parents who, although unquestionably holy, were human beings nonetheless."

This powerful meditation of Bl. Charles is a good reminder that the hidden years of Christ, that were spent with Mary and Joseph in Nazareth, are meant to be a place where we, disciples of Christ, receive an invitation into deep communion with Jesus. For as Bl. Charles recounts, even though the lessons during Christ's thirty years of silence are silent, they are, nonetheless profound. As we come off of the busyness of the Holidays, let us rest with our new born King, in his silent and yet profound home of Nazareth.



Sacraments for Seniors

Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) recognizes that residents of long-term care have spiritual and emotional needs, not just physical. Even if there is a case of COVID-19 in the facility, clergy and pastoral caregivers may be admitted under the title of "healthcare worker" or "compassionate care," provided that they have not been recently exposed to COVID-19 and abide by stringent safety requirements. **The patient or the patient's advocate, however, must request the visit.** If a facility will not allow such access, you may wish to contact the Minnesota ombudsman's office, (651) 431-2553. It has doubled its staff and is available to help advocate.


Prayer Service for Life




