PROTOCOLS FOR LIMITED OPENING

Nativity of Mary is currently open on weekdays from 6:30am-4:30pm for private prayer, at 50% seating capacity, as well as for posted Confession, Adoration, and Mass Times. The main sanctuary may be closed for brief intervals after Mass or other gatherings for cleaning and disinfecting. The details of our "Phase II Reopening" are available on our website and posted prominently at the Church entrance. In accordance with MN Executive Order 20-81, face masks are required at all times while inside any building of the Nativity of Mary campus. Please see a staff member or usher if you need a mask when you arrive.

We have returned to our regular schedule of prayer and worship, except that the Word and Communion Service on Saturdays continues to be suspended, and Confessions on Saturday are at 2pm to allow adequate time for seating for the 4pm Mass. The weekly schedule is on the bottom of page 3. Please do not arrive for the 10:30am Mass on Sundays before 10am for sanitizing purposes. Confessions remain in the Cry Room to allow for adequate social distancing. The Cry Room is otherwise closed during Masses. For outdoor or carside Confession, appointments can be made by calling the parish office.

In addition, the 4pm Mass on Saturday is livestreamed on our YouTube page and saved for viewing anytime. The FM transmitter (FM 106.7) is also on for all Masses for those who wish to listen to the Mass from their car in the parking lot. Parking lot attendees may enter for Holy Communion at the conclusion of the Mass to receive Holy Communion. Additionally, Holy Communion is distributed in the South Parking Lot on Sundays from 9:30am until 10am at Door 9.

*An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists anywhere people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, senior citizens and people with underlying medical conditions are especially vulnerable. Nativity of Mary Catholic Church has undertaken precautionary guidelines to help reduce the risk of exposure. However, we cannot guarantee that visitors are 100% safe from exposure to COVID-19. A Note from our Pastor

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the Book of Genesis, we read: God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work he had done in creation (Gn 2:3). The Sabbath rest on the seventh day of the week (Saturday) is based on God's own rest. With the birth of Christianity, the Sabbath rest was moved to the first day of the week in honor of the Lord's resurrection. The new "Lord's Day" for Christians then became Sunday. Besides a Sabbath rest every seven days, there was also one every seven years. In the Book of Leviticus, we read: For six years you may sow your field, and for six years prune your vineyard, gathering in their produce. But during the seventh year the land shall have a sabbath of complete rest, a Sabbath for the Lord, when you may neither sow your field nor prune your vineyard (Lev 25:3-4). Based on the biblical injunction of the Sabbath rest, the concept of sabbatical has evolved in modern times as a period of rest, rejuvenation, and study.

Our Archdiocese has a policy that priests are eligible for a sabbatical after each seven years of service in the Archdiocese: "A sabbatical is a period of time away from a priest's regular assignment for the purpose of enriching his ministry. The sabbatical gives a priest the opportunity to acquire additional theological understanding, pastoral skills, and to focus on personal growth. Additionally, it offers a priest the chance to be renewed through rest and a change of pace."

After 10 years of priesthood Archbishop Hebda has given me permission to take a sabbatical from June 2021- the end of September 2021. During this time I will be able to fulfill a dream I have had of continuing my studies for my Masters in Counseling. I will be taking classes remotely through Divine Mercy University while residing in a Trappist Monastery in Roscrea, Ireland. The cost of this program will partially come from Sabbatical funds that the Archdiocese has available, and the rest will have to be personally funded by me. Thus, none of the cost for the sabbatical I am taking will come from Nativity of Mary.


Fr. Ben Little, pastor of St. John the Baptist in Savage, will be the canonical administrator while I am away. Fr. Jack Long, Fr. Doug Ebert, and Fr. Steve Lacanne have generously offered to cover the sacramental ministry while I am away.

Please pray that God will bless this time and that it will bear fruit in my ministry for the many years ahead, as well as giving new insights to my preaching and ministry here at Nativity of Mary.

Reflection: The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

Tragedy and disappointment are inevitable. What sees you through this? There will be challenges, changes, unexpected circumstances, interrupted plans, hurts, and injustices experienced by every human being at some point in their lives. We will be asked to adjust our plans, change course, and even encounter suffering and death. Where do we learn all of the lessons we need to live life well? Some of them we learn along the way but much of what we bring to life, positive and negative, comes from our early beginnings, our families. This is our early world and provides the blueprint for how we see the bigger, more inclusive world, which unfolds before us.

Our families of origin can be sources of grace, heartache or a combination of both. Families are intended to be pivotal in providing us with proper social structure and understanding, a support system, lessons about relationships and communication, and the unconditional acceptance and love we so desperately crave. They can also determine whether we have an accessible and healthy relationship with God. Many of life's challenges can literally bring us to our knees and require that we possess a strength of character that resides well beyond the superficialities of our world. At some point we will all need three coping gifts that can be given to us only by God: faith, hope, and love. Our families help us learn that we are not the ones responsible for their creation, but God!

Our experience of early family life colors all of our relationships and what we expect to achieve from life in general. Resolving conflicts, dealing with difficulty and suffering, celebrating accomplishments, prioritizing our needs, listening to God's call, understanding relationships, understanding disappointment, learning about the virtues and living a centered focused life are all lessons our families either succeed in teaching or do not. To succeed, as God has designed and ordered our world, is to discover his presence and then trust that Presence. The Holy Family can teach even the most dysfunctional family how to best use God's gifts of faith, hope, and love to find him and do his will. Their simple humble example is always before us, showing us the way. Jesus, Mary and Joseph, pray for us!

- A pack of birthday candles


Because VEAP serves individuals of all backgrounds, please be sure the gift bag and candles do not have religious themes. Thank you for helping families celebrate their children's birthdays!

Sacraments for Seniors

Minnesota Department of Health (MDH) recognizes that residents of long-term care have spiritual and emotional needs, not just physical. Even if there is a case of COVID-19 in the facility, clergy and pastoral caregivers may be admitted under the title of "healthcare worker" or "compassionate care," provided that they have not been recently exposed to COVID-19 and abide by stringent safety requirements. **The patient or the patient's advocate, however, must request the visit.** If a facility will not allow such access, you may wish to contact the Minnesota ombudsman's office, (651) 431-2553. It has doubled its staff and is available to help advocate.


