PROTOCOLS FOR LIMITED OPENING

Nativity of Mary is currently open on weekdays from 6:30am-4:30pm for private prayer, at 50% seating capacity, as well as for posted Confession, Adoration, and Mass Times. The main sanctuary may be closed for brief intervals after Mass or other gatherings for cleaning and disinfecting. The details of our "Phase II Reopening" are available on our website and posted prominently at the Church entrance. In accordance with MN Executive Order 20-81, face masks are required at all times while inside any building of the Nativity of Mary campus. Please see a staff member or usher if you need a mask when you arrive.

We have returned to our regular schedule of prayer and worship, except that the Word and Communion Service on Saturdays continues to be suspended, and Confessions on Saturday are at 2pm to allow adequate time for seating for the 4pm Mass. The weekly schedule is on the bottom of page 3. Please do not arrive for the 10:30am Mass on Sundays before 10am for sanitizing purposes. Confessions remain in the Cry Room to allow for adequate social distancing. The Cry Room is otherwise closed during Masses. For outdoor or carside Confession, appointments can be made by calling the parish office.

In addition, the 4pm Mass on Saturday is livestreamed on our YouTube page and saved for viewing anytime. The FM transmitter (FM 106.7) is also on for all Masses for those who wish to listen to the Mass from their car in the parking lot. Parking lot attendees may enter for Holy Communion at the conclusion of the Mass to receive Holy Communion. Additionally, Holy Communion is distributed in the South Parking Lot on Sundays from 9:30am until 10am at Door 9.

*An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists anywhere people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. A Note from our Pastor

Consecration of Our New Altar and New Sanctuary

On Sunday, January 31st at the 10:30 am Mass, Nativity of Mary will get to welcome back Bishop Andrew Cozzens to consecrate our New Altar and to bless our renovated Sanctuary. We will livestream this event, as there will be limited capacity due to pandemic restrictions. In preparations for this I thought that it would be good to maybe mention why it is so important for this event to take place.

The act of consecration goes back into the Old Testament where the patriarchs of old would consecrate particular places as sacred to the Lord. The theological understanding of consecration is to separate something from ordinary use and to elevate it to the sacred use of worship of God. In the book of Exodus Moses takes twelve stones (symbolizing the twelve tribes of Israel) and puts them together and creates an altar where the Israelites offer worship to God by burning offerings upon it. In order to prepare the altar for sacrifice, Moses first sprinkles the altar with the blood of a bull to show that it is sanctified by life to be a place set apart for offerings to God. There is a sort of instinct that goes with the consecration of things, an instinct that demands some kind of ceremony must be performed in order for something to be special.

In our Christian tradition, we recognize the importance of having a place that is set apart from everything else where we offer to God the sacrifice of the people (bread and wine) and where we in turn receive the gift of the Eucharist. Our new altar is indeed to be the place that is being consecrated by the Bishop by anointing it with sacred chrism (oil), burning incense upon it, installing a relic of a saint into it (which will be a first-class relic of St. Anne), and saying prayers of consecration over it. Henceforth this altar will be the place where couples are married before, where our little ones receive their First Communion, where, God willing, our future priestly vocations will offer their Masses upon it. This altar will be the place where we bring our dead and ask God to hear our prayers that they would be sped into his kingdom. This altar will be the place where we pour out our hearts, week after week to our God, and where we in turn receive the grace that he has for us. The altar, for us Catholics, is the bridge that brings together heaven and earth.

In the book of Genesis there is a story that speaks about Jacob going on a journey and at some point, he goes to sleep and, in the night, he has a dream/ vision of angels ascending and descending between heaven and earth. Upon waking he consecrates the stone where he rested his head that night to God and declares it as a holy sight, naming it Bethel (literally translated means "House of God"). This biblical story offers us a spiritual sight into what will be happening on our altar here at Nativity of Mary. The angels of God will be ascending and descending upon this place of consecration. Bringing our prayers to God, and bestowing upon us the graces that our Father desires to give us.







"Are you just aware of the Lord in your life or have you had any experience of the Lord in your life?"

Today like John the Baptist we don't want to just be aware of the Lord in our life we want to have a real experience of the Lord in the moments of our life. Jesus wants to be real, that is tangible, in the moment, not future fear or past regrets. With my experiences of late, since I preached the hand of the Lord's purpose in my life, my experiences of the reality of the Lord have become so transcendent. It is all about the relationship with Him that raises you not just the functionality of doing things in His Name.

The Lord made sure in the Scriptures that it was noted the two of them, He and John the Baptist, had a physical not just spiritual experience. To know the difference between awareness and experience is to look back to see some good that happened to you that you had nothing to do with but came to you out of the blue, an opportunity, something you embraced. Like the day last year that the Chancery called to see if I could have coffee with a priest. "Sure," I said. It was Father Nathan at Nativity. We met at a coffee shop in Bloomington for 30 minutes. He asked if I was in and the boost of the Holy Spirit pushed me to say, "Yes!" It was an experience of the Lord not just an awareness of the Lord. And the result was you...a loving faith-filled family seeking to experience the hand of the Lord tangibly in your daily life. Just as John the Baptist was in prison he sent his disciples to Jesus to ask if he was the one. "Are you the one who is to come?" Jesus said, "Tell John what you see rather than what you feel." It is important for us to note awareness rather than experience. It has come to me in the midst of His presence that he is real.

The question for all of us is how do we experience the Lord, not just being aware of His existence. First, become aware of what is coming to you without your intent, to which you get energy from the Holy Spirit that brings you energy that is not yours. Second, ask the Lord for clarity of His presence. Third, surrender to whatever is happening as the Lord's tangible presence in your daily experience. Consider reading JesusSpeaking.org daily for guidance.


