## PROTOCOLS FOR LIMITED OPENING

Nativity of Mary is currently open on weekdays from 6:30am-4:30pm for private prayer as well as for posted Confession, Adoration, and Mass Times. The main sanctuary may be closed for brief intervals after Mass or other gatherings for cleaning and disinfecting. The details of our reopening are available on our website and posted prominently at the Church entrance.

We have returned to our regular schedule of prayer and worship, except that Confessions on Saturday are at 2pm to allow adequate time for seating for the 4pm Mass. The weekly schedule is on the bottom of page 3. Please do not arrive for the 10:30am Mass on Sundays before 10am for sanitizing purposes. Confessions have returned to the confessional. We have removed the ribbons blocking pews in the church to allow people to social distance more freely, but we are still requiring 6 feet between households and that all people wear masks while they are in church buildings. Outdoor Carside Confession are by appointment only and can be made by calling the parish office.

In addition, the 4pm Mass on Saturday is livestreamed on our YouTube page and saved for viewing anytime. The FM transmitter (FM 106.7) is also on for all Masses for those who wish to listen to the Mass from their car in the parking lot. Parking lot attendees may enter \*at the South Entrance\* at the end of Mass to receive Holy Communion. Additionally, Holy Communion is distributed in the South Parking Lot on Sundays from 9:30am until 10am at Door 9.

\*An inherent risk of exposure to COVID-19 exists anywhere people are present. COVID-19 is an extremely contagious disease that can lead to severe illness and death. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, senior citizens and people with underlying medical conditions are especially vulnerable. Nativity of Mary Catholic Church has undertaken precautionary guidelines to help reduce the risk of exposure. However, we cannot guarantee that visitors are 100% safe from exposure to COVID-19. Attendance at liturgies and other events is at your own risk.

## A Note from our Pastor

---

### DEVOTION TO THE IMMACULATE HEART OF MARY



As we approach the month of May, which is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, I would like to devote several bulletin articles to her Immaculate Heart. This is for the sake of our parish then taking the entire Month of May to storm heaven with prayers to the Immaculate heart, begging Mary to choose our Parish of Nativity of Mary to be a place where her heart Triumphs. So first, and foremost we just need to establish where the concept of the Triumph of the the Immaculate Heart comes from.

In the third apparition of Fatima, on July 13, 1917, after vividly depicting the horrifying events of the 20th century to the children, Our Lady promised: "In the end, my Immaculate Heart will triumph." When we speak of a triumph we are referring to imagery used for a battle. Triumph signifies the winning of a battle.

The Blessed Virgin in Fatima speaks about the battle we are facing in these times, which includes the general loss of faith, the loss of many souls, wars, and destruction. But the worst war is the loss of faith, as Our Lord says: "Do not fear those who can kill the body, but rather those who can kill the soul" (cf. Matt 10:28). The worst death is that of a soul who loses faith – a soul far from God, far from His love and commandments, drowning in a life of sin, running the risk of eternal loss, or rather, eternal death.

This great battle we are waging today, which the Holy Father John Paul II calls the "culture of death," not only includes the destruction of human life, but also the destruction of the soul. The Virgin Mary offers us Her Heart as a sure refuge, while showing us how in these particular times God has desired for the triumph to come through Her: "Tell all the world that great graces come through the Immaculate Heart of Mary" and "that God has entrusted to the Immaculate Heart the peace and conversion of the world!" (Words of the Virgin Mary in Fatima to Jacinta). When Lucia asked Jesus why the conversion of Russia would be the fruit of its Consecration to the Immaculate Heart, Our Lord responded, "Because I want it to be seen clearly that the triumph is of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and in this way I will spread knowledge and devotion to the Immaculate Heart along with devotion to My Sacred Heart."

"Mary, until the end of time, will always uncover the evil of the infernal serpent and of his infernal plots; she will make his diabolical counsels vanish and will free his loyal servants from his cruel clutches. The power of Mary over all the demons will shine particularly in the end times, when Satan will strike at her hell, that is to say, on the humble servants and poor children of Mary, who are called to battle against the gates of Hell" -St. Louis de Montfort, True Devotion to Mary. 54

Because of this, the triumph of the Immaculate Heart is necessary, for when the Church wages a battle like the one of our times, we are in need of a Mother to come to our aid, to take us to the desert (Rev. 12), hiding us in Her heart, feeding us with Her firm faith, Her disposition to the Word, Her obedience to the revelation of God; forming us with Her maternal mediation, with Her teachings, Her direction and counsels; and protecting us from evil, defending us in the battle for our souls, keeping us closely guarded in Her heart, where the devil cannot enter or rob us. "Be not afraid, my Immaculate Heart will be your refuge and your safe path to God" (the Virgin Mary to Lucia at Fatima).

It is urgently necessary in these times for the Blessed Virgin to have a powerful victory over evil: the triumph of the Immaculate Heart, the triumph of grace over sin, of light over darkness, of truth over error, of holiness over corruption, of peace over war and violence. "The triumph of the Immaculate Heart of Mary is necessary for the salvation of humanity, to show us Jesus, the blessed fruit of her womb" (John Paul II: Angelus, July 8, 1984).



### Question:

*Why is the Easter season so long? And should we be doing something special for it?*

### Answer:

You've probably noticed the priest continuing to where white vestments at the Sunday liturgy. While we celebrated Christ's resurrection several weeks ago, the Easter season extends fifty days — just over seven weeks — from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. For most of that time — about six weeks — Jesus is still with the disciples, teaching and encouraging them. The Easter season isn't just a celebration of when Jesus is with us. At the Last Supper, Jesus promised to send an "advocate" or "counselor" when he left. At the Ascension, he directs the disciples to await "power from on high" — the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Ascension completes the Paschal Mystery, beginning with Jesus' suffering and death and continuing in the resurrection. But the Holy Spirit ushers in a new era for the Church.

After spending weeks in prayer, fasting, and service during Lent, it may seem odd that we don't widely have similar practices for Easter. That doesn't mean you can't embrace the season! Commit to taking moments of little joy throughout the weeks, like random acts of kindness towards others. Consider reading the Acts of the Apostles to learn more about the early Church or picking up an Easter devotional to pray with. He is still risen indeed!

## Greetings,

Do small things with great love! This is our theme for the year, and I've seen it in action in our school and our community. We've been able to accomplish some big things at Nativity this year, even if our focus is on the small things. As we journey down the last leg of the school year, I wanted to share some of the small and BIG things that have happened since this fall. Even in the midst of a pandemic, we find ways to make our school even better! Over the next few weeks, I'll be sharing some of the successes we've had at Nativity.

### Academic Updates

63% of our students met or exceeded their winter math projections and 55% met or exceeded their reading projections in MAP testing! It's expected that 50% of a student population meet or exceed growth projections. These numbers are based on an individual's grade level and previous performance, making it all the more impressive that we have students growing more than expected. There were several grades at Nativity where the overall growth for the grade was in the 99th percentile! It's a testament to the dedication of our teachers, the use of data to inform our instruction, and the power of our Blended Learning program.

Teachers received training on three separate days throughout the year from professionals at Tierney Brothers on the use of math MAP data to inform and enhance instruction and growth in our students.

Blended Learning continues to be a focus in classroom math and reading instruction. Like everything this year, we've had to make adjustments in our implementation, but we continue to see success and growth from our students. Students have been working through station rotation models in math and reading classes in which they are working independently, practicing and developing skills on adaptive technology programs, and meeting with their teacher in small groups.

Our middle school teachers spent time this winter connecting with the department heads at the Academy of Holy Angels to discuss the scope and sequence of our curriculum and to identify areas of strength and growth in our work to prepare our students for high school. We look forward to a continued partnership with AHA to ensure a high-quality academic program.

We were just informed that there are 29(!) Nativity alums that were on the Academy of Holy Angels Trimester II Honor Roll list. We are thrilled to see our students continue their academic success in high school!




