

MIDSUMMER UPDATES AT NATIVITY

Nativity of Mary is currently open on weekdays from 6:30am-4:30pm for private prayer as well as posted Confession, Adoration, and Mass Times. All Masses are celebrated at their usual times.

As of July 1, the bishops of Minnesota have reinstated the Obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, and we are overjoyed to welcome everyone back to Mass! The return of our faith family to Mass is a joyous occasion! Although the general dispensation will no longer be available, the Church has always recognized that certain circumstances can excuse a person from the requirement to observe the obligation. Due to the important connection between the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and reception of the Eucharist, drive-through Communion is no longer offered at Nativity. If you are not able to return to church but would still like to receive the Eucharist, please contact Kerry Cronkhite about our homebound eucharistic ministry at 952-881-8671 x8070 kcronkhite@nativitybloomington.org

Facemasks: Those fully vaccinated are not at significant risk for contracting or spreading the coronavirus don't need to wear facemasks. Individuals who are more comfortable wearing a facemask may continue doing so but we will no longer require masks in the church buildings. Additionally, masks are still required in Nativity of Mary School.

Social Distancing: Six feet of separation is still required between households, especially if people are singing. Up to 10 persons may be seated at one table/in one pew. Additionally, the Gathering Space and Chapel areas continue to be available for those who prefer more social distancing.

Ongoing General Safety Protocols: If you are sick, stay at home. Please take care of yourself and protect others from becoming infected. Vulnerable persons and those caring for them should stay safe. Attend nonobligatory gatherings only to the extent that you judge the risk of infection to be low. Do what you are comfortable doing. An individual may always practice more restrictive facemask and social distance standards than are required. Sanitization is effective. Washing hands and using hand sanitizer helps avoid both contracting and spreading infection. Vaccines are still recommended.

A Note from our Deacon

If Christianity was illegal, would there be enough evidence to convict you?

This is a question that was posed to me during a talk I attended a few years back. It was (and still is) a very good question to reflect upon. The recent articles coming out of Afghanistan makes this question far from hypothetical. In fact, the Christians in that country are being savagely persecuted and martyred. The reports I have heard is that the Taliban rebels are going door-to-door seeking out Christians (among others). If there are signs that the home practices Christianity or there is evidence of the person being a follower of Christ (for instance on their cell phone), the person is executed on the spot!

Thinking about the situation in Afghanistan may help us to consider our commitment to our faith. We could consider, if the Taliban came knocking at my door, would they find evidence of my life in Christ? If they took my cell phone, would they find information that confirms my love for Jesus? If “charged” with being a Christian, would I have the courage to plead guilty? Would we have the strength to stay true to our convictions and admit to our Catholic faith? Of course, none of us can know for certain how we would respond in such an emotional and terrifying situation, but how we live now (while Christianity is still legal), will help us prepare for such an encounter.

We can prepare for living through the persecution of our faith. First, we need to know what we believe, practice our faith every day and then be unashamed of what we believe and how we live. For instance, do we have the courage to stand up for all life from conception to natural death? Are we unafraid to believe and defend our Catholic view on marriage? Are we able to explain and defend the Church’s understanding of the Eucharist, Mary’s role in our faith and confession? Recently, I was given such an opportunity.

While walking around Lake Nokomis in Mpls. last week, I was praying a rosary. As I walked by a gentleman seated on a park bench, I noticed that he had many characteristics of homeless person. He had a long and unkempt beard, he was shirtless and very thin, he held a bottle of whiskey in one hand a pack of cigarettes in the other. When our eyes met, much to my surprised he said something like: “The world sure needs the rosary these days!”. After responding with an “Amen!” I paused and engaged in a conversation with him. He told me his name was Rod. In addition to confirming that he was homeless, he also displayed a remarkable knowledge of scripture. Rod was open about how difficult it was to be homeless and the stigma and pain that it causes him. Rod said that he periodically considers suicide when he is particularly troubled. However, despite him knowing what my rosary beads were, he had very limited knowledge of the Catholic faith. Once he learned that I am Catholic, he began to pepper me with questions about the Eucharist, confession, priests, and Mary. He was not at all combative about these things, but genuinely curious.

This experience was an excellent opportunity for me to explain my faith and hopefully encourage this man to continue to explore the truth that is found in our Catholic faith. Rod was very humble and open to hearing what I had to say. After about 25-30 minutes of conversation, I offered to pray with Rod and again, he was very open to this. I asked the Lord to enlighten Rod and give him a greater understanding of Christian Truth, I prayed for grace for him to overcome his homeless situation and help him grow in a desire to keep on living despite his difficult life. I asked God to surround Rod with his angels. Rod said he was grateful for our conversation as we parted. I was certainly grateful to have met him. The remainder of my rosary was said on Rod’s behalf. I hope I get to see him again.

This experience was wonderful on so many levels. It helped me better understand more personally the plight of a homeless person. In addition, his questions on faith challenged me to be able to clearly articulate some of our more complex Catholic beliefs. Finally, his openness to conversation about faith and willingness to pray blessed us both. Rod had no hostility behind his questions to me unlike what is occurring in Afghanistan. My hope is that I would be just as willing to answer such questions without fear if someday the questioner IS hostile.

Let us join together in our parish to pray for the homeless, for those persecuted in Afghanistan and for ourselves that we would continue to grow in our faith AND in our courage to proclaim it to others, no matter what the circumstance. If in the future, Christianity ever becomes illegal in the US, may there be plenty of evidence to convict us for having faith in Christ!






