## FALL UPDATES AT NATIVITY

Nativity of Mary is currently open on weekdays from 6:30am-4:30pm for private prayer as well as posted Confession, Adoration, and Mass Times. All Masses are celebrated at their usual times.

As of July 1, the bishops of Minnesota have reinstated the Obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, and we are overjoyed to welcome everyone back to Mass! The return of our faith family to Mass is a joyous occasion! Although the general dispensation will no longer be available, the Church has always recognized that certain circumstances can excuse a person from the requirement to observe the obligation. Learn more at [backtomassmn.org](http://backtomassmn.org). Due to the important connection between the celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and reception of the Eucharist, drive-through Communion is no longer offered at Nativity. If you are not able to return to church but would still like to receive the Eucharist, please contact the Parish Office to find out more about our homebound eucharistic ministry.

**Facemasks:** Those fully vaccinated are not at significant risk for contracting or spreading the coronavirus don't need to wear facemasks. Individuals who are more comfortable wearing a facemask may continue doing so but we will no longer require masks in the church buildings. Additionally, masks are strongly recommended in Nativity of Mary School.

**Social Distancing:** There are no longer any distancing or capacity restrictions in place in the church buildings. For those who prefer more social distancing, the Gathering Space and Chapel areas continue to be available.

**Ongoing General Safety Protocols:** If you are sick, stay at home. Please take care of yourself and protect others from becoming infected. Vulnerable persons and those caring for them should stay safe. Attend nonobligatory gatherings only to the extent that you judge the risk of infection to be low. Do what you are comfortable doing. An individual may always practice more restrictive facemask and social distance standards than are required. Sanitization is effective. Washing hands and using hand sanitizer helps avoid both contracting and spreading infection. Vaccines are still recommended.

## A Note from our Pastor

### MUSIC RECAP

Over the first three weeks that I had returned from Sabbatical, Nicole Millner, our Music and Liturgy director, did a little experiment where she only used one stop in the organ for several weeks.. After a period of doing this, we asked for some feedback to help us understand the experience of worship that people in the pews were having.

After we asked for feedback, we had about thirty people offer their thoughts to us. Unfortunately, the information was inconclusive. Over half of the comments requested that the organ return back to its original full sound and louder volume. Then there was about a third that wanted to find a middle ground between what the organ was like before and how it had been with only one stop. The remaining minority said that they did not like the organ at all and if it had to be used, we should keep it at the lowest volume possible.

There were also some comments offered surrounding the music selection. Largely this information was also inconclusive. Even in statements such as, “use more contemporary music” when the person bringing the comment was questioned, it resulted in “contemporary music” meaning, for some, songs from the 1970s, and to others praise and worship that was played on the radio. Everyone had their own unique set of preferences in what they wanted to hear, and interestingly their preferences rarely overlapped. The other illumination from this informal survey was that a lot of people really liked how the music was currently being led. Many stated that they enjoy the substantial presence of the organ and some, who are newer parishioners to our community, said they joined because of the use of the organ (apparently is a rarity at Mass in other Catholic parishes).

With all this being said, Nicole and I wanted to do a bit more research on the objective experience at Nativity. Nicole had the idea of bringing in a decibel reader to check different areas of the church while the organ was being played at its maximum volume. Sound exposure is measured in the intensity of the decibels and the duration of the sound (a very loud sound can cause more damage in a few minutes, but a moderate sound over a long time can also damage hearing). We discovered that at the loudest places in the pews, the full organ would need to be played constantly for at least 142 minutes to reach the daily level of sound that could damage hearing. This is a drastic difference to the normal volume level of the organ as it is commonly used at Nativity, and the organ would never be played for that amount of time at Mass either. Measuring the “daily dose” of sound from the Gloria we sing, we learned that the organ sound is loudest in the choir area (1.4%), then drops down (0.7%) where the servers sit, the front row, and the front of the pews sections, and then drops down (0.6%) in the middle of the north wall and in the corner by the beginning of the Stations of the Cross. The volume drops again (0.5%) in the middle of the church and in front of the cry room, and sounds softest (0.4%) in the two far corners of the church and in the back of the church by the Mary statue. Admittedly, something can still sound unpleasant without damaging hearing (like if something sounds out of tune or is just a sound we don't like). If this is how you are experiencing the organ, please connect with Nicole after one of the Masses to help us understand specifics.

One of the last comments about Music that I want to make is that it is important for us to realize that there are few things, outside of food and drink, that create a more diverse world of preferences. There are thousands of radio stations and hundreds of music streaming services which result in a catering to our musical preferences. This reality does seep into Church Worship and makes it difficult to universally please. With that being said, it is important for us to provide music that assists in worship, and does not hinder a full and active participation of the congregation. The use of the organ, in particular, is used to give us an “other-worldly” sound (i.e. transcendence). This is why, if you watch a TV program or movie when there is something profound occurring, or visually enticing, the music in the background is typically an organ or chanted choral music. This may not seem intuitive, but next time you watch something, pay attention to the background music when a church is depicted, or something religious or profound occurs. This is because even the secular entertainment media recognizes the powerful symbolic link between the organ/chant and the divine due to the 2,000 years of Christian worship.

As we continue to explore how to unify our community around its worship experience, I will keep on offering some reflections about music. This whole dialogue has been a great education for me as well. Before this experience, if someone would have asked me how knowledgeable I felt about music I would have said, “very!” But what I have discovered is that I know a lot about different types of music and artists, but I am very ignorant around music theory, instruments, and how the actual creation of music occurs. Thus, I invite you along with me on this journey to learn more about Music and Worship from a Catholic perspective.


**Greetings,**



### SABBATICAL REFLECTIONS

Birr Castel is a historic landmark in central Ireland. The castle grounds itself span over a thousands acres with 12 foot high walls surrounding it. There has been a castle present since the 10th century and the integrity of the grounds have survived two sieges against it. The reason why this location is significant is that it housed one of the largest telescopes of its time (cleverly called "the great telescope" aka "The Leviathan"). It was, for a 70 year gap of time, one of the largest and most significant Telescopes in the world. One of the scientists at Birr Castle was able to guess the temperature of the moon by using its technology with such accuracy that when Neil Armstrong landed on the moon the difference between his measurement and the scientists at Birr Castle was just a couple of degrees.
