Message from Father Cory Rohlfing

“No disciple is above his teacher,” our Lord says in Mathew’s Gospel 10: 24-33. However, He does make a qualification: “It is enough for the disciple that he become like his teacher.” For the Apostles and for us, this is the essence of our Christian lives—transformation into other Christs. We are transformed when we go about doing good, suffering, loving, and blessing as he did despite obstacles. Our Lord had many enemies, so we might also, right? Christ simply tells us, “Therefore do not be afraid of them.” Instead, we pray, “Jesus I trust in you.”

Christ tells us two sparrows are practically worthless from an earthly perspective, yet “not one of them falls to the ground without your Father’s knowledge.” Everything that happens to us, everything we do, happens under the loving gaze of God the Father. What an enduring source of comfort! Nothing in our life is meaningless because the Lord knows and loves us—he knows the number of hairs on our heads and promises we are “worth more than many sparrows.”

The relationship Jesus offers transforms us to the degree that we open ourselves to his love. As we are filled with his love, our hearts can’t help but love reciprocally! And what person who truly finds himself in love keeps that love hidden? It seems unthinkable. Jesus tells us when we acknowledge our love for him before others, he acknowledges us before the Father. May we be evangelists—souls so in love with Christ that we share his truth without fear or hesitation.

Message from Parish Executive Administrator

Greetings,

We here at Divine Mercy Catholic Church and School have much to be grateful for. With heartfelt joy we can sing God's praises. God's grace and mercy is boundless.

We will publish a detailed report regarding fiscal year 2023, along with the annual tithing letter in November, but now we reflect on the accomplishments of our parish and school over the past 12 months, despite some serious challenges. We planned the fiscal 2023 budget as a balanced budget, but the year did not go as planned. Early in fiscal 2023, revenue was less than projected, while monthly expenses increased—primarily utilities, supplies, and additional staffing costs. Midway into fiscal 2023 we were projecting a \$180,000 shortfall. Through some adjustments in controlled expenses, we were able to reduce a portion of the potential shortfall. With diligence and determination, we qualified for a COVID fund called the Employee Retention Credit (ERC). Because of this credit, we ended fiscal 2023 with a net gain and ultimately did not have to touch any long-term investment funds to make up for a potential loss. Please keep in mind, we reached many of our capital campaign goals during this same timeframe.

In preparing the 2024 budget, we analyzed evidence of some successes and failures in our planning over the past fiscal year and set a goal for a budget that is grounded in the needs of our Catholic community, pragmatic in goals and sensible in numbers, while focused on growth. Without unusual revenues, like the ERC funds, we are currently projecting a potential \$124,000 shortfall, primarily because of increases in utilities and supplies. To maintain the programs and needs of our Catholic community we ask for your continued generous support as we look to meet our funding needs without touching long-term investment funds, while still achieving the continued goals of our capital campaign. This type of long-term planning is critical to our continued success and growth.

As a community, we have two capital expenditure needs to address. The first is replacing our hymnals, which would give parishioners access to Mass parts, readings, and current music. At the same time, we would reduce our weekly printing costs and licensing fees. In addition, our current sound system is failing, and the best financial option is to replace it.

Please prayerfully consider making a small increase in your weekly offering to help us reach our financial goals. Another impactful gift is to volunteer within the parish and school; helping with building upkeep and liturgical support has a direct impact on our financial success.

We are all called to bring others to Christ, please consider inviting someone to participate in our Catholic community and Mass. Remember all are welcome, no matter where they are in their faith journey.

By God's grace and mercy, and through prayer and perseverance, we will continue to grow together and be good stewards of God's gifts.

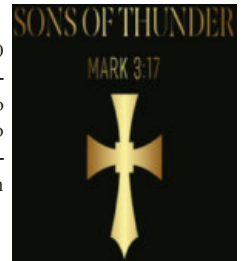

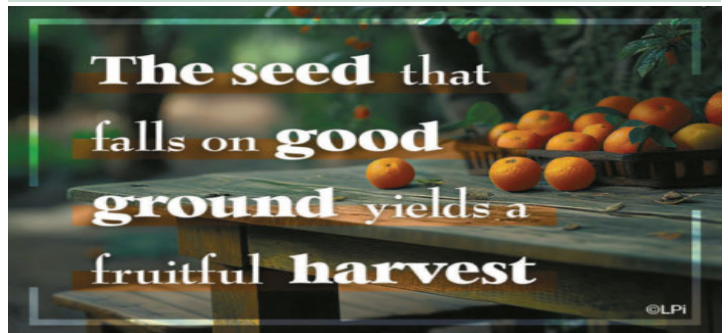

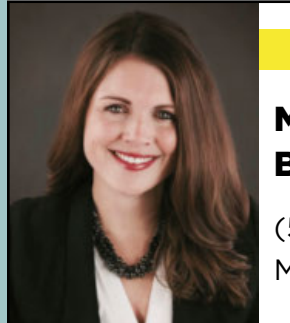
