The Assumption of Mary

Since 1950, Catholics have celebrated the beautiful and hopeful dogma of the Assumption of Mary. This is not to say that it was not known or believed by many prior to Pope Pius XII solemn declaration of its truth. Actually, it was the very fact that so many of the faithful did believe this that helped convince Pope Pius that the time had come to formalize this doctrine.

In Pope Pius' words, the Assumption of Mary is the teaching that:

“The Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory” [Pius XII, *Munificentissimus Deus* 44].

Mary is the first and greatest disciple of her Son. Among many other “firsts,” she was the first to see Him in the flesh in Bethlehem and the first to be united in her heart with His Passion as she stood beneath the Cross. Thus it was fitting that Mary also be the first to share in the fullness of risen glory by entering the presence of God in body and soul.

In speaking of this in a Wednesday audience in 2006, Pope Benedict applied this doctrine to our lives:

By contemplating Mary in heavenly glory, we understand that the earth is not the definitive homeland for us either, and that if we live with our gaze fixed on eternal goods we will one day share in this same glory, and the earth will become more beautiful.

Consequently, we must not lose our serenity and peace even amid the thousands of daily difficulties. The luminous sign of Our Lady taken up into Heaven shines out even more brightly when sad shadows of suffering and violence seem to loom on the horizon.

We may be sure of it: from on high, Mary follows our footsteps with gentle concern, dispels the gloom in moments of darkness and distress and reassures us with her motherly hand.

Supported by awareness of this, let us continue confidently on our path of Christian commitment wherever Providence may lead us. Let us forge ahead in our lives under Mary's care.

MASS AND ANOINTING IN HONOR OF ST. PEREGRINE, PATRON OF THOSE AFFECTED BY CANCER

Peregrine Laziosi was born into wealth at Forli, Italy, in 1260. Though in youth a member of the party in Italy opposed to the Pope, the patience and kindness of St. Philip Benizi moved Peregrine to conversion and a life of penitence and service. Joining the Servite Order, Peregrine was an effective administrator, confessor and preacher. Later, cancer in his leg led to the decision to amputate. In prayer the night before the operation, Peregrine was healed by Jesus and able to serve God's people as before. He is the patron saint especially of cancer patients.

We are privileged to have a statue and small shrine to St. Peregrine at St. Anthony's. Each year, we celebrate a Mass with the Anointing of the Sick in his honor, asking his intercession for those who are sick and those who care for them. This year, the Mass and Anointing will be held on Wednesday, August 28, at 5:30 p.m. at St. Anthony Church. All are welcome, especially those affected by cancer or other illnesses and chronic conditions. This is an opportunity to bring families, friends and neighbors together in prayer, hope and gratitude for the gift of Life. Refreshments will be served in the Parish Center following Mass.
