Thanks to all who participated in our annual Assumption Mass and picnic on August 15. It was a great evening of prayer, community and fun. The presence of the St. Cloud Fire Department added so much to the evening. All ages were represented, and it was uplifting to see the interaction and growing friendships in our cluster and in our new ACC. Thanks for all the behind-the-scenes work by so many to make it possible, and go so well.

ACC Update

Speaking of the ACC, this weekend's bulletin has brief profiles of your 18 ACC PC members. The group met this past week to spend time on a visioning exercise – what would we like to become and see happen in the next one, three and five years? Opportunities for your input on those questions are also in preparation, but you can feel free to talk to any of the PC representatives any time with questions, ideas and concerns.

I share here the text that was presented by representatives from the ACC Planning Council last weekend:

As you know, as of July 1, Christ Church Newman Center, Holy Spirit, St. Anthony, St. Augustine, St. John Cantius and St. Mary's Cathedral churches formally exist as an Area Catholic Community. Our community is the result of three years of a diocesan pastoral planning process to strengthen parish life, to strive for ever-better ways to proclaim the Good News of Christ and to be wise stewards of our parish resources.

To plan for our six-parish future, Fr. Tom, Fr. Scott and Fr. Joe chose three members to represent each parish on the ACC planning team. A brief profile and contact information of these individuals is in this week's bulletin. The planning team's main task is to create goals for the ACC to accomplish in one year, three years and five years and to assess areas where the parishes can work and collaborate together. We pray these goals will increase lay involvement in ministries and build disciples of Christ.

We know some people have concerns about the ACC. The ACC process is not a merging or combining of parishes. Each parish will maintain its own identity and name in this process. Each parish will continue to celebrate the Sunday Eucharist as well as funerals, weddings and other sacraments. Each parish will continue to have a Pastoral Council and Finance Council that will work with the members of the ACC planning team when necessary. Financial contributions will continue to support the parish of the registered parishioner. No decisions have been made regarding the day-to-day operations of the parish communities such as the number of priests, the weekend and daily Mass schedules, staffing and other functions. Some of these conversations will be addressed in the future, but right now, no decisions have been made.

So what's happening now? The ACC planning team is gathering information and listening to ideas and concerns. We ask for your prayers for our ACC and the planning team as we try to set goals that will benefit all parishioners in our Area Catholic Community. Also, over the next couple of months, you will be receiving multiple opportunities –through surveys, town hall meetings and conversations –to offer input on how our ACC can best serve

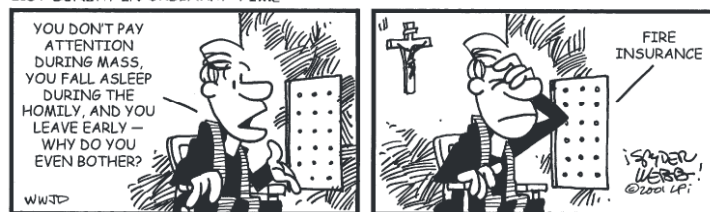

RECLAIM SUNDAY

As you pray a family Rosary, be attentive to your prayer experience. Take turns reading the appropriate Gospel passage described in each decade. At the end, have a time of silence and reflection. Did you hear something, feel something or learn something that you never noticed before?
