### "Go and Make Disciples"

"Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

These are the last words of Jesus before His Ascension, according to Matthew 28:19-20. This is the Church's mission and purpose throughout history until the Lord returns: to make disciples, to hand on the faith in God's love and mercy revealed in Jesus Christ.

As we continue to explore our collaboration in our Area Catholic Community, it is good to keep this mission at the heart of our planning. We know this effort faces many challenges. Here, I share some of what I wrote in the recent Knights of Columbus newsletter related to our work in making disciples today.

Numerous studies point to the decline in participation in the life of the Church. I have shared some of the results of *Going, Going, Gone*, which looks at young people who leave the Church, in other writing. But they are not the only ones who no longer cross the threshold of our churches; the drop in numbers (and funds) crosses the spectrum of ages and backgrounds. One can read the studies, or just look around in the pews.

It is natural to find this discouraging, lament the loss and search for reasons. I have certainly done this. But this is not a business venture or a political organization or a social club whose members are aging; this is the Church, the living Body of Christ, filled with the hope of salvation and the promise of redemption and new life. Take a moment to read the following from one of the Popes:

*To propose to consciences the truth of the Gospel and salvation in Jesus Christ, with complete clarity and with a total respect for the free options which it presents, far from being an attack on religious liberty is fully to respect that liberty, offering a way that even non-believers consider noble and uplifting. And why should only falsehood and error, debasement and pornography have the right to be put before people and often unfortunately imposed on them by the destructive propaganda of the mass media, by the tolerance of legislation, the timidity of the good and the impudence of the wicked?*

*God wishes the seed to bear fruit through the voice of the ministers of the Gospel; and it will depend on us whether this grows into trees and produces its full fruit.*

*Let us therefore preserve our fervor of spirit. Let us preserve the delightful and comforting joy of evangelizing, even when it is in tears that we must sow. May it mean for us – as it did for John the Baptist, for Peter and Paul, for the other apostles and for a multitude of splendid evangelizers all through the Church's history – an interior enthusiasm that nobody and nothing can quench. May it be the great joy of our consecrated lives. And may the world of our time, which is searching, sometimes with anguish, sometimes with hope, be enabled to receive the Good News not from evangelizers who are dejected, discouraged, impatient or anxious, but from ministers of the Gospel whose lives glow with fervor, who have first received the joy of Christ, and who are willing to risk their lives so that the kingdom may be proclaimed and the Church established in the midst of the world.*

## Fr. Tom continued from page 1

Who wrote those words? While it sounds like a fitting description of today's challenges, this is from Pope St. Paul VI in his encyclical *Evangelium Nuntiandi* (Announcing the Gospel Today) in 1975. Much has changed in these 45 years, but the Gospel does not, and human hearts searching for truth do not. New obstacles have arisen - the abuse crisis, a growing secularization of our society, the power of social media, the violence and coarseness that has become so common, significant divisions in the Church. But the resources of prayer, sacrament, and grace are never exhausted.

As Catholics, each of us is called to proclaim our faith and invite others to know Christ. All this is rather abstract, even if true. Some ways to make it practical:

- participate regularly in the liturgical life of your parish. Just being there in prayer at Mass, devotions, funerals and even confession is a witness.

- be a leader of prayer and reflection in your home and with your family, with a quiet but steady commitment that bears rich fruit. A family Rosary, reading the Sunday readings together, using the "Reclaim Sunday" materials, even prayers before and after meals, all keep our focus on the things of God.

- give a central place in your home to the crucifix, the Last Supper picture, a Bible, perhaps the images of the Sacred Heart and the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Wear the Rose for Life, Precious Feet or some other symbol of your faith in Jesus Christ. They are silent but constant reminders of our hope.

- invite and accompany a friend, neighbor, co-worker to Mass, breakfast, an ACC social gathering, a volunteer opportunity or some other faith-related event.

More could be added, of course. To whom will you be a witness to Jesus this week, as part of His final command to go and make disciples?
