Respect Life Sunday – *Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life*

October is Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of the month focuses in particular on reverence for God's gift of life to each person made in the divine image. This year's theme is *Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life*.

We continue to pray and advocate for an end to the destruction of innocent life in the womb through abortion. We are increasingly vigilant about the advance of assisted suicide and euthanasia, with legislation recently again under consideration in Minnesota – perhaps the most egregious version of such proposed laws yet seen, lacking even the pretense of safeguards that are included (though ineffective) in other states. The Internet sale of intentionally abortifacient drugs and the ongoing scourge of pornography, human trafficking and treating persons as commodities or mere political pawns in debates and policies are also violations of the respect due to human lives.

Such actions and attitudes are incompatible with Catholic faith and morals, and we are called to conversion to the Gospel of Life wherever we find our beliefs in contradiction to the commandments of God and the teachings of the Church. Of course true and consistent respect for every human life is hard at times – we are asked to be love like God, and only His grace will make that possible. As Jesus teaches us: *"Do unto others as you would have them to do to you: this is the Law and the Prophets. ... Whatever you do to the least, you do to Me."*

Thanking Our Catechists

We will offer a blessing to all our catechists this weekend. These are our volunteers, professional educators, and above all, parents and grandparents and guardians, who hand on the gift of Faith to the next generation. The words of the prophet Isaiah were quoted by St. Paul some eight centuries later, and they remain valid in every age: *"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved. But how can they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how can they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone to preach? And how can people preach unless they are sent? As it is written, 'How beautiful are the feet of those who bring the good news!'"*
