THE WORD

Most of us are pretty good at saying “thank you” to people who help us in one way or another. It’s a lesson well learned from our parents and teachers, and it certainly is something personal and on-going. There isn’t a day that we don’t thank someone for an act of kindness or for helping us in some way.

The story of the ten lepers, in today’s gospel, is a story of thanksgiving with a lesson that we all need to hear and implement in our lives, that while we give thanks to others, we need to give thanks to God, like the one who returns to Jesus and gives him thanks. The irony is that Jesus told all of them where to go and they obeyed him. They were healed on their way, but it was only one of them who realized that it was Jesus who healed him. Not unlike the ten, most of us realize our blessings, but we don’t always realize the one who has blessed us. Yes, we are thankful to the people around us, but are we thankful to God?

We have much to be thankful for... the people in our lives, the food, the clothing, the shelter, the holy Church, the holy word of God, the holy Mass, the holy priesthood of Jesus, the health and well-being of our loved ones, our friends, our neighbors, our teachers, our baptism, our confirmation, the forgiveness of our sins, the protection from evil and sin, our vocations and work, the gift of life and a good night’s sleep, the community of the Church, our education and training, the gift of sight and hearing, of hands and feet, of laughter and tears, and most of all, the gift of the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit in our lives.

It is one thing to be thankful for our blessings. It is another thing to thank Jesus, to thank God, like the leper in today’s gospel.
