

FR. DALY BREAD Haiti Emergency Earthquake Fund

As the State Fair comes to a close, we are reminded of the excitement of a new school year and Autumn Daze celebration in two weeks! Moreover, let us remember that our deepest joys come from union with God, and Saint Helena has great opportunities for prayer and penance:

Adoration (Fridays 9:00am-5:00pm)
Confession (Mon-Sat 8:30-9:00am)

However, when we remember our Haitian brothers and sisters suffering from the recent earthquake, there is a sharp sorrow amidst the joy. During college I traveled to Haiti each year to work in the slums with **Fr. Rick Frechette**, a Passionist priest and doctor from Connecticut who has been serving in Haiti for over 35 years. The Passionists have a special charism (gift) from God, to remind believers of the suffering and death that God endured, in the person of Jesus, to offer fullness of life to all people. The hopelessness of the poverty, malnutrition, unemployment, and corruption is counteracted by Fr. Rick's deep prayer life and fearless service to Jesus in the poor, which inspired me to become a priest!

Initially, Fr. Rick helped to establish one of the *Nuestros Pequeños Hermanos* orphanages (NPH, "Our Little Brothers and Sisters") in Haiti, which cares for orphaned and abandoned children in poverty across Latin America and the Caribbean. Driven by the surrounding community's healthcare needs, Fr. Rick soon founded the only pediatric hospital in Haiti: Saint Damien. As their outreach grew, so did the country's gang violence and unemployment...In response, Fr. Rick founded the Saint Luke Foundation (www.stlukehaiti.org), which supports local communities through healthcare, education, job creation and entrepreneurship, and fighting for the dignity of every Haitian family.

The devastating 2010 Haiti earthquake shook our world and sadly, still today, a majority of Port Au Prince is not rebuilt. My parents (an orthopedic surgeon and registered nurse) immediately gathered medical supplies and flew into ground zero to work alongside Fr. Rick's outreach efforts. On August 14, 2021, another magnitude 7.2



earthquake struck Haiti, and Fr. Rick seems to find himself in a similar situation. Earthquake aid is arriving slowly in Haiti's desperate communities.

My heart aches from the suffering in Haiti, and some ask, "Where is God in all of this?" I've found God moving through generous disciples like Fr. Rick and his team! And God is moving throughout all of creation, including you and me, to share His Love and build His Kingdom. "You have a limited number of heartbeats in your life; it is a finite number," says Fr. Rick. "And you have a limited number of steps you're going to take in your life; it's a finite number and it can be calculated. The question is, what is your heart beating for and where are your steps taking you?" Let us walk in solidarity with Haiti and support **Fr. Rick and the Saint Luke Foundation** by our prayers and resources.

Saint Helena will be gathering a second collection to help the Saint Luke Foundation's emergency earthquake fund. I am certain the donations will go directly to Fr. Rick's work and will be used wisely and immediately. **I would humbly ask you to prayerfully consider making a donation today.**
