

THE WORD

"The Miracle of Secondary Causality" is what we celebrate this Sunday. Yes, yes. I know. It's really the Miracle of the Wedding Feast at Cana when our Lord (the First Cause) changes water into wine at the request of His mother, Mary. However, Mary is a secondary cause. Our Lord only worked this miraculous event at His mother's asking.

But, that's the stumbling of many Protestants. They have problems with not only Mary, but also with the saints, the sacraments, and the Church – all of them secondary causes of God's grace. In other words, God (the First Cause) uses these agents and material things (secondary causes) to make Himself present and give us His grace.

Actually, it makes so much sense. In the natural order of things, who's the better math teacher? The one who imparts knowledge or the one who imparts knowledge and excites the students to want to share their knowledge of adding, subtracting, multiplying or dividing with their friends. It's the math teacher who produces future teachers.

Who's the better coach? The one who teaches his team players to swing a bat, catch a ball, and slide into home, or the coach who excites his players to teach their friends about how to play baseball. Clearly it's the coach creates players and junior coaches.

So also on the supernatural level the Lord not only redeems us, but He allows His creation to become a part of His plan of redemption. He in a sense dignifies these agents—they are not merely recipients of His grace, but they are also active agents. Plus this plan of salvation shows forth His wisdom.

So, it is reasonable for our Lord to have us ask His mother for favors. It certainly gives honor to His mother and reminds us of the way things are mapped out in the order of salvation which utilizes secondary agents.

The saints are secondary agents, the sacraments are secondary causes, and the Church is filled with people who are weak human agents, but nonetheless secondary causes. Yet, the Lord is the Primary or First Cause. Our Lord took on Human flesh to redeem that which is created material. It's the mystery of the Incarnation: the Lord becoming flesh, and that order of creation (or the flesh) continues to be respected and followed in the supernatural level. We can rejoice in this truth and thank God for this continual reminder, plus have confidence as we go to Mary and ask her for favors from her Son.

First Grade News

The first graders are back from Winter Break and ready to learn! In our Believe & Read phonics program, the students have been learning about how we can use -s and -es suffixes to modify nouns and verbs.
