

Fr. Eli Gieske's Message



Dear Parishioners,

As we enter into the season of advent, we enter into a time of preparation and waiting. We are getting ready for Jesus' birth at Christmas. In the Church we have these two penitential seasons (Advent and Lent) that correspond to Christmas and Easter. In our Catholic tradition, a great celebration is preceded by a season of penance and preparation. The Church invites us to make these seasons special so that we can really enter into the mystery of the Solemnity of Christmas and Easter.

This season of Advent has a little lighter feeling then Lent. This year we have the full 4 weeks to prepare. Very often people move from thanksgiving into Christmas. We see all the decorations, the candy, the music for the Christmas season. By the time the Christmas Season actually arrives, many people are ready to move on. Part of this is driven by the marketing that goes on in our culture. We are being sold a concept of Christmas that centers around many things, most especially the hunt for getting all the right gifts, and having a great time. Christmas traditions are fun, and they can be a really great time of the year for many of us. However, we have to be careful to remember that the real focus of the Christmas Season is the birth of Jesus.

We tend not to be a very patient culture, we want to get to the next thing we don't like waiting. So it's not surprising that we often jump the gun when it comes to Christmas celebrations. Maybe though, we can try to hold off a bit with the "Christmas season" even if we can just delay it for a little bit longer than we normally would. Try to have a real period of waiting... anticipation, and preparation. Advent is a beautiful season, but it often gets skipped over. I'd invite you to try and practice an Advent season this year. Get out an advent calendar or an advent wreath... play advent music (there aren't as many choices for Advent). Put up your tree, but maybe don't decorate it right away... focus on preparing your heart to accept the baby Jesus into your life.

This is a great lesson to teach our children, and can help them understand what we are really celebrating at Christmas. It can be difficult to introduce new traditions in the home, but maybe this is the year to talk about it, or even put it into action. What do you want your Advent season to look like?

Jesus said to his disciples:

People will die of fright in anticipation of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. And then they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory.

But when these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand.

"Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness

and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap. For that day will assault everyone who lives on the face of the earth. Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man."

NICENE CREED:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.




