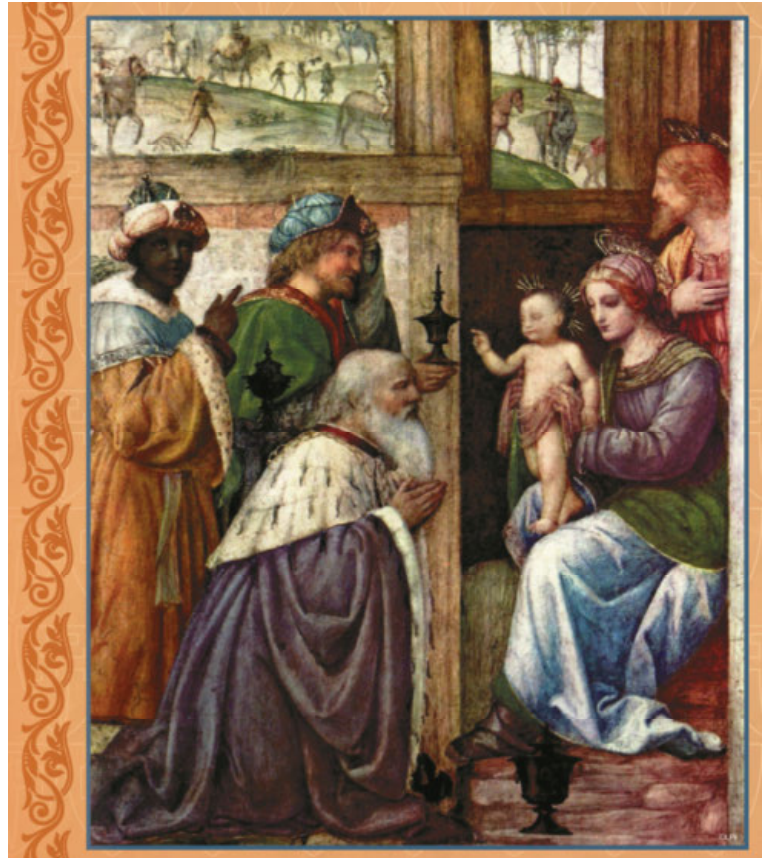

Fr. Eli Gieske's Message



Dear Parishioners,

Merry Christmas! We are still in the Christmas Season, and I just want to make sure you are still celebrating, Ha Ha 😊 or should I say Ho Ho... oh that's real bad isn't it... very puny. I want to take this opportunity to thank all of our volunteers at the parishes who helped make the Christmas Masses so beautiful. I am very grateful for all who decorated, all who sang and played music, for those who ushered, all of our lectors, eucharistic ministers, altar servers, and greeters. It is really great to have so many people involved in the ministries of the parishes. Thank you for being willing to serve, and helping make our liturgies beautiful. This is dear to my heart.

I also want to share with you some good news. We made our UCA goals this year! Again, I thank all the people who gave so generously to help us meet our goal. This really helps our parishes and our diocese continue to be able to do the work of making Christ known. The financial support of the parishioners, is one avenue by which we can support the mission. I am grateful to have so many parishioners who continue to give to this mission in so many different ways. Thank You!

I want to remind you of a few upcoming events that are a ways off, but bear some forethought. We will be having a parish mission the Thursday-Saturday following Ash Wednesday (Mar. 3-5). This mission will be given by Fr. Michael Kearney. He is a priest from the Diocese of Joliet but currently works at St. John Vianney in St. Paul. I hope many parishioners will be able to attend these days and evenings for a chance to hear how we can grow in friendship with God, and become a stronger community of disciples.

There will be a chance to join a discipleship group in March. These will be talked about more in the weeks leading up to Lent. However, I'd invite you to begin thinking about it now. Many people are being called to go deeper in our faith. Attending Sunday Mass is a good foundation, but having another opportunity to talk about what God is doing in our lives, and unpacking that with others would really help many people blossom in their faith.

These discipleship groups will be offered at various times, about once a month. The invitation to sign up with a group will be offered as we go into Lent. I would really recommend this to anybody who wants to experience a deeper connectedness to God and to other fellow Catholics. I imagine for many this may be a bit scary to think about.

I have personally found that meeting with my priestly fraternity each month a very enriching experience. I meet regularly with 5 other priests and we talk about what is going on in our lives. We are all different ages, and various locations around the diocese, but we find this an essential part of our ministry and lives as followers of Jesus. It allows us to be accountable about how things are going for us, and also continue to grow and challenge each other to pursue holiness.

Everyone will have a different experience of what this might look like, but I'd invite all of you to think about it. For some, it might not be the right time or you might have something that already fills this need. However, I really feel the Holy Spirit inviting us as people of faith to find ways to be more intentional about our lives as followers of Jesus, and these groups will provide that opportunity. I know many friendships and relationships will come from this, but it requires us to step out in faith and trust that there is something God wants to do for us. Stay tuned.

Mass Prayers & Readings

VOCATIONS PRAYER:

FIRST READING:

Is 60:1-6

Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you. See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory. Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance. Raise your eyes and look about; they all gather and come to you: your sons come from afar, and your daughters in the arms of their nurses.

Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow, for the riches of the sea shall be emptied out before you, the wealth of nations shall be brought to you. Caravans of camels shall fill you, dromedaries from Midian and Ephah; all from Sheba shall come bearing gold and frankincense, and proclaiming the praises of the LORD.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM:

Ps 72

Lord, every nation on earth will adore you.

SECOND READING:

Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6

Brothers and sisters:

You have heard of the stewardship of God's grace that was given to me for your benefit, namely, that the mystery was made known to me by revelation. It was not made known to people in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that the Gentiles are coheirs, members of the same body, and copartners in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

GOSPEL:

MAT 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage." When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, He inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him,

"In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet: And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler, who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

NICENE CREED:

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and our salvation he came down from heaven, (*all bow through "and became man"*) and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Light of the Moon

If you own a television that has been turned on at any point in the last month or so, chances are you've caught at least a scene or two of the 1946 classic film "It's a Wonderful Life."

If you're not familiar with the movie, it follows the life of George Bailey from childhood through adulthood. A dreamer by nature, George has big plans for himself that involve world exploration and adventure — but family and community obligations keep him tethered to the same spot on the map, leading an altogether ordinary life.

One of the most memorable scenes from that movie is of George dancing with his sweetheart Mary while they sing "Buffalo Gals — Won't you come out tonight/And dance by the light of the moon?"

That lyric always catches my ear. Of course, the moon doesn't have any light of its own. All the moon has is the ability to reflect the light that shines upon it.

The same holds for us, doesn't it? Our stewardship is purely a reflection of the grace granted to us by another. "Upon you the LORD shines," writes Isaiah, "and over you appears his glory." Every good action we will ever take begins in the mind of God. The fact that we have the honor of carrying it out on His behalf is a beautiful gift. It is God that makes our ordinary lives extraordinary.

In the end of the movie, George Bailey realizes that he had a far greater life because, instead of being the hero of his own story, he allowed himself to reflect goodness onto others.

Remember — the magi didn't chart their own course. They merely followed the star.

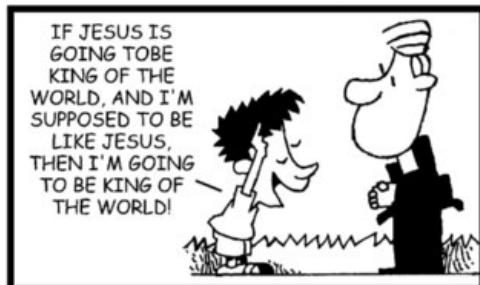

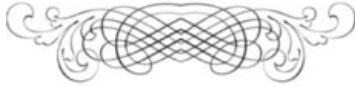
