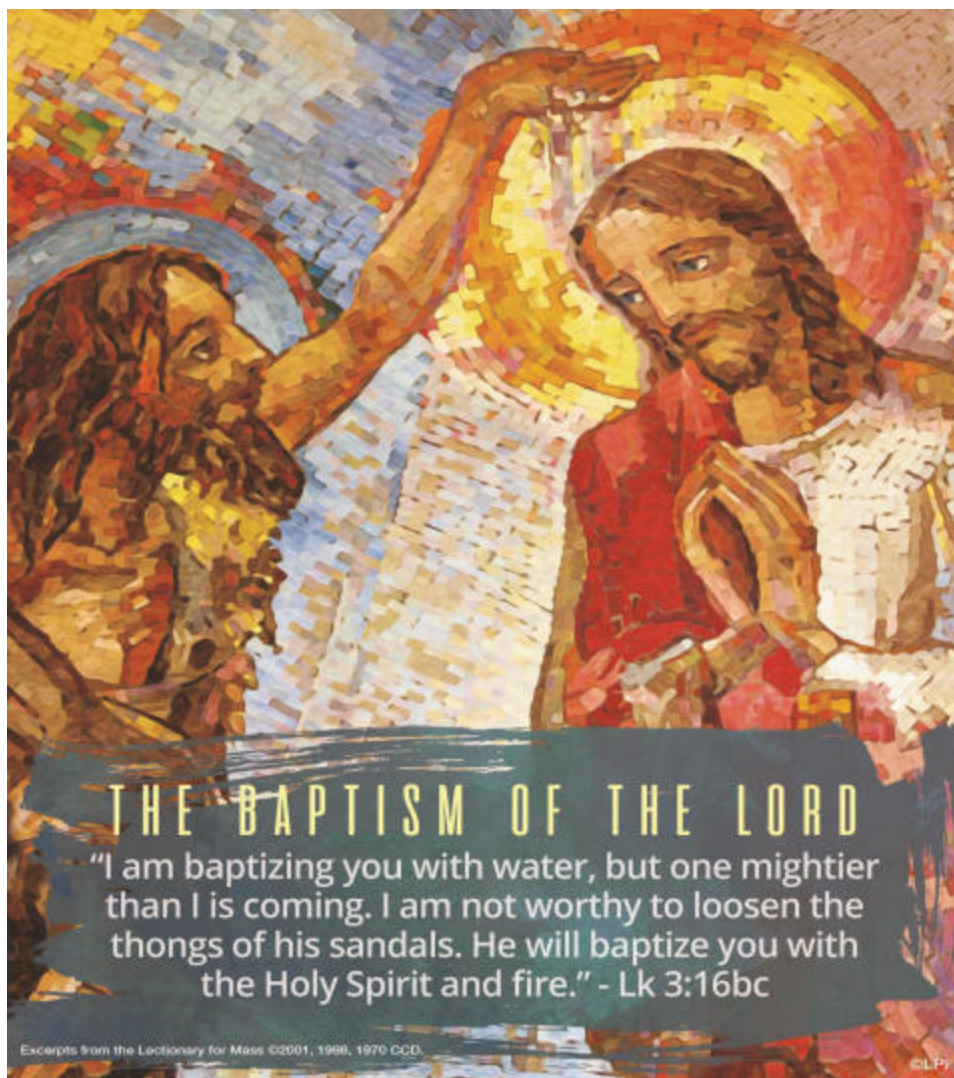

"John answered them all, 'I baptize you with water, but he who is mightier than I is coming...he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit...." Luke 3:16

The Catholic Catechism states that "Jesus' immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God's will." In other words, as baptized Catholics there is only one gift that we need to give to Jesus—the gift of ourselves. Surrender yourself to God, place your trust in Him and allow the Holy Spirit to work through you for the greater glory of God.

On January 4th and January 5th we celebrated the feast days of the first two American citizens to be named saints by the Church: St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and St. John Neumann. These saints are both remembered for helping to establish the Catholic school system in America.



America's Catholic schools are unique in the world. They are not a state school system, as Catholic schools have been in many countries (including both Mexico and Canada). Nor were they founded because the available public education choices were academically poor: America has a tradition of relatively strong community and state schools that predates our diocesan Catholic system.

The Catholic school system in America was founded in a setting where good schools already existed because of one clear understanding: that school conveys culture. Culture makes the person, but Catholic culture alone conveys the means God has established on earth for salvation. No other culture does that. It should be instructive for us, the faithful, to reflect that the first two American citizens to be canonized both lived lives of heroic virtue in service to this insight. In short, Catholic schools have been established in the USA to get our children to heaven. That remains our mission today. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton and St. John Neumann, *ora pro nobis!*

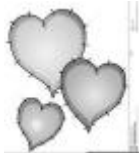

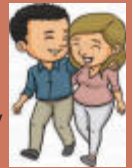
