SCHOOL NEWS



We have 'been blessed with a strong and even unique tradition of Catholic education. We can take our schools for granted, but it may help to ask why we, uniquely, have so many Catholic schools in our country. In the late 1800s, the bishops of

the United States, meeting at the Third Plenary Council of Baltimore, decided that every child should have the opportunity to attend a Catholic school and made this a top priority for the Church. This required an enormous commitment from parishes, families, and the religious sisters and brothers who staffed the schools, which leads us to ask why the Church went to such trouble.

'Education forms us in a fundamental way, shaping how we think and how we live. The United States bishops recognized the fundamental problem facing Catholic children growing up in a culture that opposed their faith. Cardinal James Gibbons expressed the concern well: "the religious and secular education of our children cannot be divorced without inflicting a fatal wound upon the soul.""
