FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Offering God our Best: Homily follow-up
God, through his Church, has given us clear guidance on how we are to worship. General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), for example...

"It is a praiseworthy practice to cover the chalice with a veil, which may be either the color of the day or white" n. 118.

"Thurification or incensation is an expression of reverence and of prayer, as is signified in Sacred Scripture" n. 276.

Redemptionis Sacramentum, Instruction on Most Holy Eucharist says, "The Communion-plate for the Communion of the faithful should be retained, so as to avoid the danger of the sacred host or some fragment of it falling" n. 93.

"Only out of true necessity is there to be recourse to the assistance of extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion...Such recourse is not intended for the sake of a fuller participation of the laity but rather, by its very nature, is supplementary and provisional" n. 151.

It's okay if Holy Communion takes a bit longer. This is the best time to pray. Preparing for our reception and then praying with Jesus in our body and souls.

What does God desire in regard to Music at Mass?

We are asked to 'Sing the Mass' not just singing added to the Mass. This means that we sing the text of the Mass and not just hymns. The texts of the Mass includes:

The Dialogue parts, such as "The Lord be with you." "And with your Spirit."

The Ordinary Parts, which are the parts that are the same every week, such as the Gloria, Sanctus, Agnus Dei.

And, the Propers to each Mass. These are the parts that DO change every week. Such as the Prayers and the Antiphons. For example, the opening antiphon is part of the text of the Mass. And the Church desires that we sing that. So, we have a good balance now. We sing the antiphon, but we supplement that with a couple of verses of a hymn.

What does the Church say about Latin.

The Second Vatican Council says, "The use of the Latin language is to be preserved in the Latin rites" Sacrosanctum Concilium, 36.

A later instruction on music says, "In Masses which are celebrated with the people, a suitable place may be allotted to their mother tongue. This is to apply in the first place to the readings and "the common prayer,"...Nevertheless, steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them" Musicam Sacram, 54.

I mentioned that at the beginning of the pandemic, there was some changes made to the music at the Queen of Peace, Sunday morning Mass. So, what we are doing now has been the case for long before I arrived.

But part of the problem, is that we didn't do a good job of explaining it over the past year. What we have done even before I arrived is what the Church wants, but my understanding is that it wasn't explained very well.

So, hopefully we have a better understanding now.

I think we have a pretty good balance when it comes to our Masses. We have one Mass that is no music, no Latin. That's at 8am Sunday. We have one Mass that is only hymns, no Latin. 5pm Saturday. And we have one that we try to do what the Church asks of us, 10am Sunday. We try to make it as beautiful and solemn as possible. It has some Latin in it. We sing the antiphons supplemented by hymns. There is no plan to make it all Latin. Overall therefore, I believe this is all pretty balanced.
