

# Saint of the Week

Born in Holland, St. Peter Canisius (May 8, 1521 – December 21, 1597) was a preacher, teacher, and writer throughout his whole life. At the age of 19, he received a master's degree from the university at Cologne. Soon afterwards, St. Peter met Peter Faber, the first disciple of Ignatius of Loyola, who influenced him so much that he eventually joined the Society of Jesus.

St. Peter Canisius founded colleges and seminaries, served as a missionary, cared for the sick or imprisoned, and wrote close to eight volumes of letters — many about St. Cyril of Alexandria and St. Leo the Great.

A man blessed with many talents, St. Peter Canisius is a wonderful example of a man who developed his talents to further God's work here on earth.

# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

No Saturday Evening Mass December 25<sup>th</sup>! There is a hierarchy of feasts in the Catholic Church. Solemnities such as Christmas and Easter trump everything else. So normally on a Satur-

day evening there are anticipatory Masses for Sunday. That is why you can go to Mass Saturday evening and have it count for Sunday. However, because Saturday, December 25<sup>th</sup> is Christmas, any Mass that day or evening is still a Christmas Mass. If there would be a Mass that Saturday evening, it would have to be a Christmas Mass. <u>Therefore, we will not have a Saturday evening Mass on Christmas day. That</u> <u>means, all the folks who usually go to Saturday evening Mass</u> <u>need to go on Sunday to fulfill their Sunday obligation.</u> 8am Mass at Holy Family and 10am Mass at Queen of Peace should be packed! Which will be great to see!

Incense will be used at the 4pm Christmas Eve and the 10am Christmas Day Mass.

As Sacramental people and a Sacramental Church (meaning the visible express the invisible, or we perceive meaning through our senses) the smells and the bells are important. That is why we have incense at our normal 10am Mass on Sunday. For some people incense is problematic, so the 9pm Christmas Eve Mass and the 8am Christmas Day Mass at Holy Family will NOT have incense. So plan accordingly.

Be extra courteous and welcoming. We are looking for greeters. Christmas Masses always brings visitors and non-regular Mass goers to the Church. As much as we all have to worry about our own families, getting the kids to cooperate, wanting to find our usual pew, let's be extra vigilant in looking out for others and how we can welcome and serve them. St. Paul tells us, "Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others" (Phil 2:4). That said, we are looking for people interested in handing out programs and greeting people as they arrive. Please let Father Nick know if you and spouse or your family is interested in this role of hospitality.
