

## Healing Prayer Ministry

"When we try to talk about our role in Healing Prayer we get caught up on which preposition to use: "with" or "for". Do we pray with or for others? Turns out we do both. We pray for the concern or gratitude to be embraced by God. But God already knows all that - even before any of us did. It's the "with" that God is probably guiding us toward.

In our understanding of Healing Prayer, we know we have a tiny and crucial role of "with" our brothers and sisters, which is the same role that any faithful person has when they fulfill a prayer request. We know that as Healing Prayer Ministers we are not unique. We just have been more visible in the prayer corner than the thousands of prayer requests being shared outside the church in the parish. Please keep them coming - both with us and for us, as we do the same for and with you." PLASTIC is popular, practical, and prolific. It is also invasive, insidious, and imperishable.

Those objects of plastic that escape recycling (made of non-recyclable plastic; fly away in the wind; float down a river into the ocean) go on living for as long as 100 to 1000 years, eventually becoming microplastics. These have been

found in the Alps (shedding of microfiber clothing); in all oceans; Lake Superior; in fish we eat; and more. By taking steps such as listed below we can take to heart the request of Pope Francis to care for our common home and help decrease the accumulation of plastic waste and contamination.

When shopping, purchase items packaged in glass or paper or the least plastic wrap. If your favorite product comes only in plastic, write to that manufacturer and tell them of your concern.

Always bring your own reusable bag and avoid using plastic bags. If you have plastic bags, check with Cub Foods bag recycling service. Support companies producing plant-based plastics (bioplastic) such as Full Circle Bioplastics in CA; Renmatix in PA; Mango Materials in CA. Become informed about which plastics are recyclable. Don't buy products packaged in non-recyclable plastic. Try to avoid plastic altogether.

### A Deeper Encounter with Christ

As an RCIA team, our task is to afford a "deeper encounter with Christ" during the Lenten season especially, and actually throughout the journey. Each week we meet and we have a simple prayer, we share (if

we choose) one God-moment of the past week. The season of Lent for the RCIA candidate is officially called the Period of Purification and Enlightenment!

What amazing words for this 6 week period of Lent in our Church calendar! How do we purify ourselves? How do I find "enlightenment"? We encounter Christ primarily in our gathered community. We use the Catholic church's 3 disciplines of Lent to "purify" and become better. We Pray, we Fast, we Give Alms. How do we Pray? Maybe we add a "good morning" to God; perhaps we sit for 5 minutes longer in quiet. Prayer might be praying Scripture, or singing a song.

How do we Fast? Can we fast from bad language--just try to delete it from our voice? Can we fast from saying unnecessary catty remarks about another person, no matter how annoying that person is? Can we fast from a food or treat that we really do enjoy? There are loads of ways to fast--fast "from" a bad habit, fast "from" an unkind comment, fast "from" watching TV or programming that isn't healthy for us...and so on.

How do we give Alms? Well, almsgiving traditionally is giving donations of resources (money or food) to those in need. Alms-giving can be making a monetary donation to an organization that we feel does good in the world. In a wider sense, can alms-giving be giving your time in an organization of service?

When COVID started in mid-March last year at first I thought this was going to be a couple of weeks. OK. A couple of months. OK, the summer. OK the rest of the year. Well, darn it, this thing is lasting a lot longer than I want. I wonder if my thinking and waiting is what the early Christians experienced. They thought Jesus was coming back tomorrow. Well, OK. Next week. As time dragged on for them they had to change their thinking. I am hopeful we don't have to wait 2000 years for a solution to this virus, but it might teach us the need to be mindful of each and every day. Those early Christians did not get to decide when Jesus was returning. We don't get to decide when this virus is over or contained. But we can and need to choose each day to live as people of hope. People who believe God is watching over us. God is helping us see what our faith is and how deep it might be. After nearly a year of this virus, have you looked deeper into your faith? Fr. Mike

### Why does civil unrest and political strife continue in Haiti?



Early in February Fr. Claude informed us that it was not safe for him to travel at this time to Port au Prince because of the political protests and danger from bandits. Reports of travel dangers have periodically surfaced the past 18 months. We follow them closely. They are usually centered in Port au Prince, and to a lesser degree in other major cities. Fr Claude is generally comfortable traveling in the Bouzy countryside. Sadly, Haiti has never had a government that we could claim is of the people and for the people. Here is a digest from recent news reports on the causes of current unrest in Haiti:

The political upheaval and protests in Haiti have worsened as opposition leaders claim that President Moise's five-year term has ended, and they demanded that he step down on February 7th. But on that day the government announced that, 23 people

including a supreme Court Judge were arrested for plotting to overthrow his government. The reason for the disagreement is because the constitution allows the president to serve a 5-year term, his opponents argue that he has already reached that limit. When Moise won a chaotic election in 2016 he received more than 50% of the votes but only 26% of the people were able to vote. Because of low turnout and a contested election, the government appointed a provisional president for a year so Moise was not sworn in until Feb. 2017.

Moise and other officials have been accused of embezzlement, fraud and political corruption related to government contracts. Critics recently accused him of ruling the country by decree ever since he dissolved the parliament in January 2020 after failing to hold legislative elections in 2019. He has created an intelligence agency that answers only to the president and limited the powers of the courts.

The New York times recently reported that Haiti has not had much respite from political corruption and chaos in the last 35 years since democracy was restored. Mr. Moise is widely blamed for making the Haitian's lives even worse through rampant plunder and mismanagement. Months of violent protests against Mr. Moise have repeatedly brought life in Port-au-Prince, and other cities and towns to a halt. Fuel shortages are common, public transportation has been halted and businesses have closed. The rampant violence from gangs has forced schools to close for fear for student's and teacher's safety.

Recently the US state department agreed with Mr. Moise's argument that he has another year to go adding that "the Haitian people deserve the opportunity to elect their leaders and restore Haiti's democracy".

It is unlikely the protests will end until new elections are held (scheduled for fall of 2021). Please join with our Haitian brothers and sisters to pray for peace and justice, and their safety.
