

FR. MIKE

With the advent of this virus last spring we have been doing ministry in new ways. As we have a discussion with the Parish Council trustees and staff we are asking what ministry will look like in the future and how we might address that in our activity. Although we are getting nice groups of folks at our Masses on weekends it is a far cry from what we had before this virus. We ask how many will be coming back once we all get vaccinated? Several adults have told me how much they enjoy watching Mass when it is convenient, with coffee in hand and pausing the video when something interferes. When we get back to a bigger crowd we are still not going to allow folks to bring their coffee into the church with the wooden floors. Many of our children have been on Zoom for nearly a full year. It is tough on them. They need community and seeing other kids as well as their teacher. I believe we all need that. The computer and the recordings of Mass are nice but they don't suffice when we need connection with people. As the Body of Christ we don't have a finger here, a toe there, an organ in another corner. Our body is all together. We are certainly missing that as a faith community, a faith body. I bring this up because as we continue to move ahead the question for us as a staff is how do we do ministry? How do we pay for new things and new people? We have been able to get by so far, but if we change anything what will we do? That is why your participation in Commitment to Parish Life is so critical. So I ask you to talk about your giving pattern within your family. Pray about your giving back to God in gratitude for what He has first given to you. Then make a thoughtful decision about your contributions to St. Joseph the Worker. You have done great so far and I am grateful for you. But as we go into a new style of ministry, will we have enough to provide that new ministry? Fr. Mike





### Fasting and Feasting during Lent

As part of your family's Lenten journey, you might like to incorporate some of the following activities into daily life. These activities include not only "fasting" but also "feasting" during Lent; not just giving something up, but doing something positive and creating new habits which benefit not only our personal health, but also the health of our planet as well. Make it a spiritual adventure.

1. **Fast** from energy by eating several meals that don't require cooking and eat by candlelight or campfire. **Feast** on foods lower on the food chain like whole grains, fruits, and vegetables instead of meat.

2. **Fast** from fossil fuels by not driving the car for a day/weekend or longer. **Feast** on the outdoors by taking a walk in the neighborhood or park and thanking God for the beauty you discover. Write or draw what you experienced.

3. **Fast** from giving consumer products as gifts and give donations to a charity in the person's name. **Feast** on shopping at local Farmer's Markets and small shops and try a new item each time.

4. **Fast** from TV and technology for a weekend or one day each week. **Feast** by reading a book, perhaps Scripture. During the extra time, write notes to friends and family. Share what you've read.

5. **Fast** from "junk" food and "fast" food for one day a week or more. **Feast** on several plant-based meals during the week, not just Friday. Try preparing the meal together from scratch.

At the very beginning of the bible we see that Adam and Eve think differently. And so ever since then we have realized men and women think, feel and act differently from one another. Boys and girls do things differently. Children see the world differently from parents. And grandparents see the world different from the parents of the grandchildren. The difference are good things as they challenge us to see the world from someone else's perspective. The pattern of religious education we have used for decades really only began in the late 1900's. Before that everyone sat through the 30-45 minute homily/sermon the priest gave. Thank goodness those days are gone. As the decades went along we added books, movies, videos, and now we are into computers and Zoom. We have changed as our resources have changed. The virus is good from the standpoint of making us look at what we have done and seeing the opportunity to see things in new ways. We want to be masters of our technology, not slaves to it. We often joke (at least us older folks) that if we have a problem with our computer just ask a 5-year-old. They can do it and even fix it. They are growing up with this technology so it is normal for them. Not much for the older folks. I believe we either figure out how to use technology or it is going to use us. We are not worshipping the computer. We worship God. Computers need to help us see things differently, but also to help us worship God. Think of that for a bit. Fr. Mike

## Why does civil unrest and political strife continue in Haiti?



Early in February Fr. Claude informed us that it was not safe for him to travel at this time to Port au Prince because of the political protests and danger from bandits. Reports of travel dangers have periodically surfaced the past 18 months. We follow them closely. They are usually centered in Port au Prince, and to a lesser degree in other major cities. Fr. Claude is generally comfortable traveling in the Bouzy countryside. Sadly, Haiti has never had a government that we could claim is of the people and for the people. Here is a digest from recent news reports on the causes of current unrest in Haiti:

The political upheaval and protests in Haiti have worsened as opposition leaders claim that President Moise's five-year term has ended, and they demanded that he step down on February 7th. But on that day the government announced that, 23 people including a supreme Court Judge were arrested for plotting to overthrow his government. The reason for the disagreement

is because the constitution allows the president to serve a 5-year term, his opponents argue that he has already reached that limit. When Moise won a chaotic election in 2016 he received more than 50% of the votes but only 26% of the people were able to vote. Because of low turnout and a contested election, the government appointed a provisional president for a year so Moise was not sworn in until Feb. 2017.

Moise and other officials have been accused of embezzlement, fraud and political corruption related to government contracts. Critics recently accused him of ruling the country by decree ever since he dissolved the parliament in January 2020 after failing to hold legislative elections in 2019. He has created an intelligence agency that answers only to the president and limited the powers of the courts.

The New York times recently reported that Haiti has not had much respite from political corruption and chaos in the last 35 years since democracy was restored. Mr. Moise is widely blamed for making the Haitian's lives even worse through rampant plunder and mismanagement. Months of violent protests against Mr. Moise have repeatedly brought life in Port-au-Prince, and other cities and towns to a halt. Fuel shortages are common, public transportation has been halted and businesses have closed. The rampant violence from gangs has forced schools to close for fear for student's and teacher's safety. Recently the US state department agreed with Mr. Moise's argument that he has another year to go adding that "the Haitian people deserve the opportunity to elect their leaders and restore Haiti's democracy".

It is unlikely the protests will end until new elections are held (scheduled for fall of 2021). Please join with our Haitian brothers and sisters to pray for peace and justice, and their safety.
