


It appears that the governor is thinking that as more folks get vaccinated that in the spring we might be able to sit closer together, about 3 feet instead of 6 feet apart. Until that happens we have already arranged the seating in the church for full capacity with a distance of 6 feet between families. His most recent decision to raise the percentage of folks inside a building does not affect us. We currently have seating for about 250 in the worship space itself. We have also put in extra seating in the chapel and now we have arranged seats for 8 families in fellowship hall. The sound will be sent into there (and maybe the movies of what is happening) and folks we be able to come forward for communion. Working our way through this virus has been a challenge for you. And particularly difficult for us. Again, I want to thank you for your continued support during this virus. This experience is new for all of us. Yet you have remained faithful in viewing our Masses online. You have come to our outdoor Masses and penance services. You have been willing to come inside for many celebrations including funerals and baptisms. We have even figured out a way to do First Communions and Confirmations in late summer. Your financial support has allowed us to be flexible and adaptable to an ever-changing situation. As we begin to move back to celebrating with one another in our church building I pray that our church community, you, have grown stronger in faith. See you soon! Fr. Mike

Fasting and Feasting during Lent

As part of your family's Lenten journey, you might like to incorporate some of the following activities into daily life. These activities include not only "fasting" but also "feasting" during Lent; not just giving something up, but doing something positive and creating new habits which benefit not only our personal health, but also the health of our planet as well. Make it a spiritual adventure.

1. **Fast** from energy by eating several meals that don't require cooking and eat by candlelight or campfire. **Feast** on foods lower on the food chain like whole grains, fruits, and vegetables instead of meat.

2. **Fast** from fossil fuels by not driving the car for a day/weekend or longer. **Feast** on the outdoors by taking a walk in the neighborhood or park and thanking God for the beauty you discover. Write or draw what you experienced.

3. **Fast** from giving consumer products as gifts and give donations to a charity in the person's name. **Feast** on shopping at local Farmer's Markets and small shops and try a new item each time.

4. **Fast** from TV and technology for a weekend or one day each week. **Feast** by reading a book, perhaps Scripture. During the extra time, write notes to friends and family. Share what you've read.

5. **Fast** from "junk" food and "fast" food for one day a week or more. **Feast** on several plant-based meals during the week, not just Friday. Try preparing the meal together from scratch.




Stephen Ministry

Maybe it is the long haul for this virus but I find I am getting more upset with folks who claim what we are doing and how we are doing things is based upon medicine and science. Should we or should we not wear a mask? Is this or is this not an airborne illness? (In late October the CDC said "We think this is an airborne illness.") We had 9 months to figure out how to distribute a vaccine. We still change the how each week. We still change the who and where each week. Neither medicine nor science would suggest using a lottery to pass out this vaccine. Science and medicine have no idea how to have small town businesses continue to operate when it is mandated they shut down for months with no idea when they might reopen. Science and medicine have no idea how to help restaurants survive. A year ago the governor used the "science" of two college seniors who majored in statistics (according to the U of M web site.) to tell us that 76,000 to 78,000 Minnesotans were going to die of this virus. Two days later he told Minnesotans that we had a right to see democracy at work so he was going to work with the legislature. Both were either wrong or lies. Neither is true. Don't get me wrong. Both medicine and science are trying to do their best but this is a new thing. Neither know the right answer. They are doing the best as things change from week to week. But I believe it is time to stop making things up and to admit they do not have answers. They are simply trying to do their best. If there had been an effort to try to educate us about what this virus looked like, how it spreads, and how we might limit that, I believe we would be further along the path to recovery. Mandating and dictating how we must act is treating us like 5 year-olds. Most adults in Minnesota are highly educated. We are not little children and it would be nice to be treated as if we could actually understand this if it was explained. I would be more willing to give them leeway if they just admitted they don't have answers. They are just discovering and adapting as things evolve. We don't need to have answers for something that is new and changing. We just need these leaders to be honest with us. Done with the rant. Fr. Mike
