It is very hard to say goodbye. We even say that we hate long goodbyes. Yet, when somebody leaves suddenly we feel such a shock or that the rug was pulled out from underneath us. Any which way leave-taking happens, the process puts us all in a very awkward and difficult situation. When honest, we have to admit that we just don't know what to say and are hard-pressed to find the right words.

Nevertheless, when we are forced to enter into this process of letting go, there is an opportunity to find great meaning and awareness in the wonderful connection that has existed without even a passing thought in everyday life. I often see this within family dynamics when one member finds out that he or she is diagnosed with severe cancer. When openly and honestly faced, the reality of taking leave becomes a process of beholding the beauty of an eternal love that's been shared for years without ever any formal or cursory acknowledgment.

The dying person sometimes even says, "it feels like I'm at my own wake." There is a beholding of the eternal within the earthly. How does it go? You don't know what you got until it's gone! Saying goodbye helps us to realize what we already have been given and to understand how this gift exists beyond absence.

Saying goodbye helps us to die before we die so that when we die we don't die. We come into knowing that God is with us, that God will be always with us by the good practice and process of saying goodbye.



The worldwide COVID-19 pandemic has had beneficial effects with regard to some types of pollution, such as noticeably less air pollution, due to fewer cars and buses on the

road. However, it has also dramatically increased other forms of pollution. One area of increasing concern are the face masks that are being used and discarded and are finding their way into our lakes, streams and rivers, posing a hazard to humans and wildlife.

Masks are everywhere. In 2019, surgical mask sales worldwide were about \$800 million. When the tally is completed, sales of masks in the year 2020 are expected to exceed \$166 billion or 200 times the normal amount! A larger number is predicted for 2021, even with increasing vaccinations. It is essential that we deal with this ocean of face coverings in an environmentally responsible manner.

Here are some tips for responsible mask usage:

- Use multi-layered, washable cloth masks, if possible. Many types are available on-line, or you can make them yourself. Old cloth items can be recycled at Hennepin Transfer Station.
- Cloth masks can be sanitized by baking them in the oven at 160 degrees or your lowest oven setting, for 15 minutes. (Be careful of open flames!)
- Cut elastic bands or plastic strings/cords off masks before disposing of them, so that wildlife do not become entangled in them if they do end up loose.
- Dispose of plastic-based masks (e.g. the blue disposable ones) properly – most should go into the trash or medical waste receptacle, if available. Some could contain virus particles and should be treated accordingly.
- Do not expose other people to your used masks unnecessarily.
- Never flush masks down toilets, in septic tanks or dispose of them thoughtlessly on streets or in water sources (streams, lakes or rivers).

The pandemic will soon be behind us, so let's not leave long-lasting, unsightly reminders in the form of mask litter in our beautiful Minnesota outdoors!

EASTER GIFTS IN HAITI AND UPCOMING SECOND COLLECTION

Water and light. So crucial to life, so taken for granted where they are plentiful, so precious in Haiti. Water and light are among the gifts our sisters and brothers in Haiti celebrate this Easter, thanks to God and to you.

Life in Haiti rolls from one crucial shortage to another, so much so that Fr Claude becomes reluctant to ask us for help, and we become reluctant to receive one more request in these difficult times. Yet we both realize that difficult asking and difficult receiving are God's gifts to us, and we continue to give & receive.

So one winter night I got an email from Fr Claude explaining that they were in the dark in the rectory. Their old, smelly, noisy generator had finally died. The generator that extended their day from 6 pm to 9 pm, when they could afford fuel. As we deliberated how we could afford to help, a generous parishioner sent a check for exactly the cost of a new generator.

This month, Fr Claude revealed that he got someone to dig a new well! It will be a new water source for the community and a way to bring running water to the rectory. But it needs a pump. As we pondered how to support this life-giving request, while we struggle to build a church with them, a generous parishioner said, no problem, I don't need my stimulus check, and water is life; so my windfall is theirs. Another generous parishioner heard this story and did the same thing. Water is on its way.

Time after time, this story repeats at St Joseph the Worker and St Catherine's in Bouzy. Thank you, God. He is Risen and is among us! Thank you, thank you all for your extraordinary generosity to our brothers and sisters in Haiti these past 12 years. We are great gifts to each other. Our following (twice a year) second collection for Haiti will be this weekend or any day you can give. Please keep our sisters and brothers in Bouzy in your prayers. Bon Fet Pak/ Happy Easter!
