

What is Financial Abuse?

Financial abuse is the number one reason someone may not be able to leave or may force them to return to an abusive situation. Research has shown up to 99% of all domestic violence cases involve financial abuse which occurs when one partner limits access to financial assets in order to control the other partner. Without access to financial resources a survivor's option for separating may seem insurmountable. COVID 19 and an uncertain economy has dramatically affected financial abuse. Survivors wanting to break free financially face unemployment, under employment, food insecurity, housing instability and more. What does financial abuse look like? It's all about power and control. Examples include:

- Preventing the survivor from getting a job.
- Making their partner ask for money or give them an allowance.
- Not involve or allow their partner to have access to household bank accounts or finances.
- Run up debt in their partner's name or on joint accounts to damage the partner's credit. Abusers have forced their partners to take out credit cards or sign a lease in their own name. The abusers then max out the card or fail to pay rent leading to bad credit and/or evictions.
- Taking their partner's money or benefits. Some abusers may refuse to work themselves, but handle all of the finances for the household.
- Force their partner to agree to power of attorney which allows them to legally sign documents without the partner's consent. Not commonly thought of as domestic abuse, this type of financial abuse can happen when an older child is caring for an aging parent.
- Hiding assets.
- Withhold funds so they can't get basic needs like food or medicine. One survivor tells of her abuser not letting her buy personal hygiene products because he didn't think they were necessary.
- Evading child support payments or drawing out the divorce process. (Source: WINGS Program Inc. Chicago, Illinois)

Mission Appeal for Warangal Diocese -India

Greetings of love, joy, peace and prayers in the name of Jesus from Fr.Joji, Mission Coordinator for the Diocese of Warangal, Holy Rosary Church, 206 E Harriet Street, Darlington, WI 53530.

Fr. Papi Rddy Yeruva will be preaching Mission appeal on July 10 & 11, 2021

Brief History: The Diocese of Warangal was erected on December 22, 1952 in the newly formed backward state of Telangana in India. It has an area of 1,14,840 sq.km with a population of 9 million people while Catholics are 68000(1% only). We have 65 parishes and 200 mission centers with 125 Priests, of whom 98 are Diocesan priests, with 650 Nuns and 18 religious Brothers working with their respective Charism in different fields of apostolate. This area is backward in development with repeated less rain-fall. About 80% of the people live in countryside depending on agriculture by rains only. About 45% of the people live under poverty line.

Literacy: The Literacy in this area is about 55%. We are opening the two new Mission Centers with a Primary School each for easy accessibility for evangelization and promotion of literacy.

Socio-economic Situation: This area is backward with less rainfall. About 80% of the people live in Villages depending on agriculture by rains only. About 45% of people live under poverty line. This year the delayed monsoon causes a lot of anxiety & worry.

Our Needs and Priorities for this Year:

1. Direct Evangelization among the Banjaras, who are semi-mobile people. The Diocese has identified 50 hamlets/settlements (Communities) of Banjaras and 25 Mixed communities.
2. Faith formation of Youth & Adults we do conduct seminars and trainings to make them to know catholic faith.
3. We promote the care of the Aged/Elderly and the Widows. Unfortunately there are many who are not taken care of and they find it hard. we provide all the basic needs.
4. Education for the Tribal (Banjaras) and other poor children. We give great priority to educate these tribal and other poor/needy children. the most marginalizes who otherwise would be forced to become Child laborers. special attention to the drop-out children to bring back to school. We educate 10,560 students.

We run several mission stations aimed at catering to the needs of the poor and the underprivileged helping them with the basic necessities of life. We run orphanages for the poor boys and girls, run educational institutions, dispensaries, and other charitable works.

We undertake many social work programs directly aimed at helping the poor and needy and empowering women. In traditional Catholic areas we concentrate on re-evangelization and the training of the laity to become active apostles. We look forward to coming to your parish and share about our missions.



HAITI SISTER PARISH

Do You Take for Granted Clean Water?
Does your faucet look like this?



Early into our sister parish relationship, there was a realization that our Haitian sisters and brothers, young and old, were lacking the gift of water that is clean and free from parasites and bacteria.

Our Medical Team recognized that the children of St Catherine's showed signs of malnutrition. Tests confirmed that the water was contaminated, and they were suffering from intestinal worms. In 2013 we partnered with the non-profit organization, Gift of Water, that provides a water purification system using two 5-gallon buckets with filters and chlorine tablets to produce clean and safe drinking water. Funds were raised to provide 100 families with filter systems, chlorine tablets, and technician's salaries. Along with the initial 100 systems, GOW sent a representative to Bouzy to explain how the program works. They also met with community leaders to develop a Water Committee and select a water technician responsible for regular visits to families with filtration systems, educating on proper use and providing the supplies necessary to keep the filters functioning correctly. Soon after the program was initiated, donations came in from parishioners, allowing the medical team to introduce a deworming program. The medical team distributed deworming medicine to families to rid them of parasites. Eliminating the parasites would allow their bodies to absorb the nutrition from their food, and the clean water will then prevent the worms from returning!

In 2018, the program grew to 500 families, expanding to a second technician. Shortly after this, the community went through various changes and several difficulties, including a devastating hurricane and the collapse of their church. Unfortunately, the water program began to suffer. Families lost support from the technicians. Again, we arranged with Fr. Claude and the Water Committee to add a supervisor to help the techs get the program back on track. Since the program was regressing, our fear was the families were suffering from parasitic-related health issues.

The water program reflects how difficult it is to live in a community that regularly deals with poverty's challenges and the life-threatening issues which accompany it. We take clean water for granted. Earlier this year, we started discussions with Fr. Claude to find new and innovative ways to restore the program.

The decision was made to replace 2 of the Technicians. Madilyn, the remaining technician, was sent to advance her training and enhance skills and gain confidence to help train new technicians.

We begin again as we work together to restore the program, and the recent steps forward are promising. Earthquakes happen, hurricanes come, churches collapse, priests get reassigned and sadly, political upheaval and civil unrest continue, yet our relationship of love and perseverance for our Haitian Brothers and Sisters lives on just like God's Love.


