I'm 29. OK, maybe 39. But not a day older than 40. At least that is how it seems to me most of the time. Then a sibling dies and the reality of life breaks in upon my fantasy world. I'm not planning on going anywhere tomorrow or any time in the immediate future, but I realize that I am going to retire at some point. While at my brother's funeral last week one of my young relatives (a 58 year old man) asked me when I was going to retire and what I planned to do in retirement. It was a sobering thought. It is easy to imagine that I will live until I want to die, or forever. Whichever comes first. But death to anyone, especially a family member, makes me realize that death is as certain as life. One follows the other. So while I relish this life and this faith community there is something beyond that I know too little about. But the reality is I need to think about that in very concrete terms. I pray that my brother's death would help me focus more clearly upon living this life as if it were practice for eternal life with my God, my family and those whom I love.



When it Rains it Pours!

Go figure - in the midst of a drought we suffer significant water damage in our church building. With the heavy rains a couple weeks ago, water poured (not an exaggeration) into the lower level of our building on the north side, closest to the music room. Over the years, a concrete slab holding a huge air conditioning compressor has sunk, causing excessive water to run towards the building and down along the walls. Our pump and electrical room had water pouring into it and through various components. The air conditioning unit which serves the main church will need to be removed, the concrete slab will need to be removed as well, and significant backfill will need to be conducted. At this stage of its life (20 years old) the air conditioning unit will most likely need to be replaced during this process. The project design is being done now and then we will get bids. The air conditioning unit will cost \$58,000 itself!

When it rains it pours! On top of this, the sound system in our main church is failing. Over the last several months we have been receiving comments that it is difficult to hear in certain parts of the sanctuary space. Our 20-year-old system is no longer adequate. In fact, last week we lost one of the amplifiers completely. We have replaced the amplifiers out of necessity (\$12,500) and will look to replace the speakers over the coming weeks/months. This is our church, our spiritual home. We will soon turn to you to help us in raising funds necessary to complete these projects. While we do dedicate money for major improvements, we are not prepared for the impact these two significant issues together. Stay tuned.



Haiti's Difficult Challenges Continue

The assassination of President Jovenel Morise on July 7th is another blow to a country that is already suffering. Fr. Claude sent his thoughts, "It is a hard blow for the country and for the Haitian nation which never ceases to cry, and which does not cease to see how this beautiful country looks in a crossroads where only repeated performances are delivered. I invite you to pray for this country because nothing is impossible for those who believe in the Bible."

The assassination is not a surprise for many Haitians, as heavily armed Gangs have become increasingly powerful, taking advantage of the instability and growing poverty to seize control of several parts of Port-au Prince. For the Haitians to have a chance at a future, those responsible must be brought to justice, and the newly formed temporary government must work toward safe and fair elections.

The Catholic Church "has lost a little bit of its prominence and also lost a bit of our prophetic voice" in recent years. But now, Father Saint-Félix (priest from Port au Prince) said, it is about the only functioning institution in the country. Its social service, medical and educational efforts are the only civic entities that struggling Haitians can depend on.

Haiti is also unprepared for a major Covid-19 outbreak. The government, distracted by its own self-preservation in recent months, has done little to respond to the threat, and there is no vaccination plan to fend off the virus. Medical experts believe Covid-19 will contribute to the misery. Officially 467 have died in Haiti because of Covid-19, and more than 19,000 cases have been confirmed, but with little testing, those numbers likely represent a significant undercount.

In Haiti, there is a Creole proverb: "dèyè mòn, gen mòn." It means mountains beyond mountains. It is used to portray the endless difficulties in the lives of the Haitian people. There always seem to be several difficult layers to making progress towards prosperity.

One of the lessons we have learned from our brothers and sisters in Haiti is their faith is strong, and they place their hope in Jesus. During our visits, we see people who struggle every day to meet their daily needs, but they are resilient and have survived many difficult challenges with the help of their faith. They praise the Lord with great passion and give thanks for simple blessings of life, relationships, and support for each other. Please keep them in your prayers.
